President's Corner

The Best Way to Predict the Future



For the 18th time together, Debbie and I watched Frank Capra's It's A Wonderful Life. Do you remember the special gift Angel Second Class Clarence was able to provide George Bailey? George thought the world would have been better if he hadn't lived at all. The angel-in-training provided George with a view of what the world would look like if George hadn't been born.



First up was the dawn patrol, they launch in the dark and check conditions for the rest of the balloonists. At 6:45 the National Anthem was sung by a choir and




2 balloons were sent up with American flags attached, what a sight. Then shortly after balloons started inflating everywhere and launching, talk about mind

Results of the 2017 WBAC Survey



First of all, the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) would like to thank the 1,629 members (and one non-member) who responded to the latest survey. That was a 22 percent response rate, considered by the survey team to be very good. The team consisted of current and retired survey professional members of WBAC. The LRPC also thanks them for volunteering many hours to this effort.

This latest survey asked questions in four broad categories; demographics, club activities, communications and opinions. This month, we are reporting results from demographics and club activities.

We are an active club, with a total of 72 percent of members attending at least one WBAC event in the past two years. The vast majority of these were local unit activities. As for rallies, almost half of the members indicated they attended local rallies, while participation in Region and International Rallies was 18 and 17 percent respectively.

When asked what types of rally seminars and activities interest you, the most popular answer by a wide margin was Airstream maintenance and technical matters, at 83 percent. The following graphic depicts the answers to this question.




One question addressed the desired length of the International Rally. The average response was just over seven days. It should be noted that the Salem International in June is slated for eight days.

As a club, caravan participation was somewhat lower, with 7.5 percent of members joining a local unit caravan, less than one percent region caravans and six percent national caravans. The top four reasons for not going on a national caravan were lack of interest, not available for the length of time required, too expensive and work commitments.

One question asked if you planned to join a caravan in the next five years. 76 percent stated either yes or maybe. When asked what maximum length of caravan they would consider, the answer was two-fold. Retired members answered 20 days; those still working answered about 14 days.

The demographics of our club didn't come as much of a surprise, with one exception. That exception in a minute. 70 percent of us are retired. Another 22 percent work full time, with another 8.5 percent working part time. When asked what ages travel with you in the Airstream, the answers were pretty much what we expected (see graphic below). However, the answer to the question about how many nights you stayed in your trailer last year was surprising to the team. 72 nights is a much larger number than we expected. Maybe this number was skewed upward by full timers or folks who winter in warm climes in their Airstreams.

Long Range Planning Committee / **Looking Back Enables Us to Look Forward**

The Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) was established as an International Standing Committee in June 2015 during the Farmington International Rally. Its Charter is to develop a long-range vision for the Club; facilitate attaining that vision through strategic planning; and develop strategies for long-term growth in added values for Club membership.

The committee is chaired by the International 3rd Vice President elected in an even-numbered year, and is composed of two Region officers, two Club members and ex-officio participants. Members of this committee are dedicated to long-range improvements that will increase the value of membership for Airstream owners; enhance the ability of the Club to attract and retain new members; and improve club operations and governance.

At this point some of you may be thinking, "Why do we need a Strategic Plan in a camping and caravan club?"

A Strategic Plan provides a platform to look into, and plan for, the future of the Club with focus and direction. Since the inception of the LRPC, many minds have provided input into the attached Strategic Planning Document (SPD) with the goal that it will be used to improve the Club.

This document was crafted under the principles of the committee Charter and contains fluid, dynamic goals, objec-

tives and strategies that provide opportunities for continual Club improvement. It is supported by a comprehensive task roll-up and a wealth of reference materials, and guided by the member-focused Vision and Mission statements developed during Joe Perryman's presidency.

The focus of the LRPC has shifted from Conceptualizing and Development of the SPD to encouraging Adoption of, and Engagement in, the following goals:

- Value to our Members
- Service to Members at Local Club Level
- Rally / Caravan experiences that support membership goals, member participation, and create a strong organization consistent with WBCCI objectives
- Focus on Regional Support of local Clubs
- Sustain an environment that is welcoming to volunteers and that encourages overall member support for volunteers' efforts
- Streamline International Operations to Provide Effective and Inspirational Leadership

Accountability for selecting and reaching the goals rests with the International Board of Trustees (IBT) and the Executive Committee (EC). During the Sarasota Mid-Winter IBT members of this committee:

Met with the incoming International President and Vice Presi-

- dents to review their respective Goals. This meeting has proven to be an invaluable opportunity for the LRPC to recommend inclusion of key Goals/Tasks which may not have been a part of the EC goals, as well as to continue leadership commitment to a cohesive, collaborative and member-focused team;
- Led round-table discussions with Region Officers and Standing Committee Chairs to help encourage adoption of relevant and timely Goals/Tasks contained in the SPD. Both groups were encouraged to base their selections on areas that their Region(s) or Committee(s) could focus on in an effort to meet the needs of the Club membership.

Throughout 2018 and beyond, the LRPC will continue to audit the Strategic Plan for opportunities to enhance the Goals/Tasks based on current membership and marketplace direction, and will update the document annually each May.

Success for the LRPC is not measured by checking things off a list; rather, it is reflected through advocacy and adoption of the opportunities identified in the Strategic Plan; through the continuity of leadership goals and, ultimately, in the growth and satisfaction of the soul of the Club – our Membership.



Introduction

The Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) Strategic Planning Document (SPD) articulates the WBCCI plan for the future, and acknowledges and addresses the challenges and opportunities we face. The SPD provides goals, objectives and tasks

to build a roadmap that expresses where we want to be in the future. The Plan includes goals designed to strengthen the organization, the leaders, and the member base to improve and move the WBCCI forward while providing a quality, one of a kind, experience for members of all ages and ensuring the WBCCI's future.

Responsibilities

The LRPC is responsible for maintaining and updating this document.

Background

Many International Presidents recognized the need for a cohesive strategy in moving the WBCCI forward. Numerous excellent initiatives, such as the 2020 Committee, were prompted by the International Board of Trustees (IBT) and Executive Committee (EC) as early as the Mid-Winter IBT in Gonzales, LA, in 2008. These studies and reports were the basis for proposed and subsequently approved, revised Vision and Mission Statements in the WBCCI Constitution. Then in 2015, a committee commissioned by Joe Perryman generated a Long Range Planning Committee Report, dated July 5, 2015, which led to IBT approval of formation of the LRPC. This committee will report to the IBT and derive any authority to act (and spend) from the IBT.

Our Vision

As we look at the club through 2026, we see Airstream owners focused on effective communications, continual improvement, responsive leadership and universal appeal as the Airstream Club of choice. We value our ICONIC Airstream RVs, positive forward thinking, personal involvement and volunteering, equality and respect among members, responsible stewardship of club resources, a club that is affordable, and a club that respects traditions and past accomplishments. Our club provides and promotes our unique offerings in a way that makes club membership an absolute "must have" for all Airstream owners.

Summary Goals

This document identifies a set of goals, objectives and tasks that are pertinent to the development of a Strategic Plan as defined in the LRPC Vision document. While the listed goals are not in priority order, all of them require some level of planning, research and developing positions for the operation of the club, leadership elements, member support, communications, and rally/caravan execution. To achieve these goals the LRPC anticipates the possibility of changes to the WBCCI Constitution, Bylaws and Policy, and looks forward to working with the IBT in that effort. The goals are:

- 1. Provide Value to Our Members
- Streamline International Operations to Provide Effective and Inspirational Leadership
- Increase Focus on Regional Support of Local Clubs/ Units
- Improve Service to Members at Local Club/Unit Level
- Provide Rally/Caravan Experiences that Support Membership Goals, Member Participation, and Create a Strong Organization Consistent with WBCCI
- Sustain an Environment that Is Welcoming to Volunteers and that Encourages Overall Member Support for Volunteers' Efforts

Adoption and Engagement

Accountability for selecting and reaching the goals rests with the International Board of Trustees (IBT) and the Executive Committee (EC). The LRPC will meet with the incoming President and Vice Presidents at the Mid-Winter Meeting prior to their installation to review their respective Goals. This provides an opportunity for the LRPC to recommend inclusion of key goals/tasks not contained in the EC goals as well as to identify possible additions of goals/tasks not reflected in the SPD.

The LRPC will also create adaptive communication platforms to present the SPD to Region Officers, Standing Committee Chairs, and members on an on-going basis at Mid-Winter IBT and the International Rally. Success can only be achieved through adoption of the SPD at all levels, led by a cohesive and collaborative EC.

The LRPC will continue to audit the SPD for opportunities to enhance the Goals/Tasks based on current membership and marketplace direction, and will update the SPD annually each May.

Long Range Planning Strategic Planning Goals, Objectives and Tasks **Goal 1. Provide Value to Our Members**

Objective: Make membership attractive and valuable to Airstream owners. Provide a great value for the membership dollar by recruiting and retaining members willing to support club activities. Provide enthusiastic support of the club's traditions and ideals through effective use of resources.

Task 1. Analyze the profile for a member though examination of club best practices, past successes, other clubs' successes, club existing and visionary demographics.

Task 2. Revise the WBCCI Vision based on the member analysis to include new member profile.

Task 3. Actively pursue new members through advertising, open events and a renewed publicity effort.

Task 4. Work with other related Airstream groups to pool resources, ideas and fun activities.


Task 5. Promote and advertise rallies, caravans and other events to make the club the premier choice for Airstream owners and members.

Task 1. Determine the ideal club organizational structure to best serve future composition of the membership. Review and improve office processes, equipment, software systems, accounting, and publications. Select easy changes with maximum benefits for early implementation.

Task 2. Assess and support implementation of recommendations provided by the International Rally Site Selection Committee and the associated process and procedure improvements that support our members.

Task 3. Provide Blue Book/Club brochure or on-line training to educate members on available communications methods.

Task 4. Assess the impact of revising the Blue Book, Ideas Book, Caravan Guide and other documentation to include a more modern look and feel. Implement recommendations.

Goal 3. Increase Focus on Regional Support of Local Clubs/Units

Objective: Foster the idea of the Region Officers as a basic element of the Unit Support Network. Recommend changes, provide ideas and develop a communications network based on Regions supporting Units. Identify and develop future officer candidates to fit the club's needs.

- Task 1. Improve the Region-to-Unit communications process to allow a Unit to Region question/response or idea/ comment blog that is searchable.
- Task 2. Assess and determine a viable solution to the problem of obtaining Region Officer Candidates.
- Task 3: Determine the effectiveness of Region rallies and provide support for improved/modernized Region level business processes.

Goal 4: Improve Service to Members at Local Club/Unit

Objective: Improve Unit Operations effectiveness. Where possible simplify the process of operating the club. Streamline and modernize processes to include updated communications tools, and external social media exposure.

Task 1. Examine current Unit level operations and streamline processes, as appropriate, to minimize time spent managing club "business" and increasing time available for fun.

Task 2. Assess the existing Unit level documentation that supports Unit Officers and update as needed. Provide where needed, on-line leadership training, operation guides, and include a process for reviews, updates and frequently asked questions.

Task 3. Develop effective communication channels at all levels: International, Region and local.

Goal 5: Rallies and Caravans - Provide Rally and Caravan **Experiences that Support Membership Goals, Member** Participation, and Create a Strong Organization Consistent with WBCCI Objectives

Objective: Improve Club rally/caravan experiences to cover the entire WBCCI member domain with emphasis on simplified Unit level planning requirements and communication. Provide guidance and educational programs to help the units succeed in matching their membership requirements to fun and exciting travel and fellowship. Improve the International Rally experience and seek ways to improve communications and marketing of other rallies and caravans as appropriate (Region, National, Special Event, Special Interests).

Task 1: Assess the current International Rally (stem to stern) for areas of improvement. Provide detailed recommendations in areas of finance, attendance, program, duration, location and other areas as identified in the IR Assessment.

Task 2: Review surveys and member suggestions to determine, if possible, what WBCCI members and future members want from a rally/caravan program. Develop an initial set of action items to improve, where needed, training, processes, procedures, education and documentation required to implement appropriate changes.

Task 3: Assess the value added of creating rally/caravan data repositories/archives to assist the rally planning activities and of developing a succession plan for rally managers and caravan leaders. Implement as deemed appropriate.

Task 4: Update pertinent support documents for use by the rally/caravan planners.

Task 5: Improve Special Event Rally and Caravan planning and coordination. Provide special event rallies and caravans that the membership will enjoy and support.

Task 6. Maximize the use of digital media to advertise and communicate upcoming and new special event rallies and caravans.

Goal 6: Sustain an Environment that Is Welcoming to Volunteers and that Encourages Overall Member Support for Volunteers' Efforts

Objective: Our club depends on volunteers to operate. We must develop a club culture that perpetuates and nurtures involvement by volunteers and where needed, improve existing programs and create excitement around the importance of becoming involved with making the WBCCI concepts work.

Task 1. Assess existing club volunteer requirements with concentrations at each level of management. Provide suggestions for improvements where they are needed.

Task 2. Provide a process to educate club membership about the value added by volunteers and the benefits of volunteering (at all levels). Work on the "enjoyment" factor.

Task 3. Ensure volunteer requirements are updated as the club support requirements change. Invoke needed evaluations and transitions though transparent processes that assure members that leadership is attending to our "value added" philosophy and their well being.

Task 4. Establish a responsive feedback process and/or reward system for working committees that makes volunteering a "benefit" and acknowledges their contributions.

Kidde Recalls Fire Extinguishers with Plastic Handles Due to Failure to Discharge and Nozzle Detachment: One Death Reported (see this link to **Consumer Product Safety Commission notice)**

Recall number: 18-022 Recall date: November 2, 2017

Name and Description of product:

Kidde fire extinguishers with plastic handles. This recall involves two styles of Kidde fire extinguishers: plastic handle fire extinguishers and push-button Pindicator fire extinguishers.

Hazard: The fire extinguishers can become clogged or require excessive force to discharge and can fail to activate during a fire emergency. In addition, the nozzle can detach with enough force to pose an impact hazard.

Remedy: Replace. Consumers should immediately contact Kidde to request a free replacement fire extinguisher and for instructions on returning the recalled unit, as it may not work properly in a fire emergency.

Plastic handle fire extinguishers:

The recall involves 134 models of Kidde fire extinguishers manufactured between January 1, 1973 and August 15, 2017, including models that were previously recalled in March 2009 and February 2015. The extinguishers were sold in red, white

and silver, and are either ABC- or BC-rated. The model number is printed on the fire extinguisher label.

For units produced in 2007 and beyond, the date of manufacture is a 10-digit date code printed on the side of the cylinder, near the bottom. Digits five through nine represent the day and year of manufacture in DDDYY format. Date codes for recalled models manufactured from January 2, 2012 through August 15, 2017 are 00212 through 22717. For units produced before 2007, a date code is not printed on the fire extinguisher.

International Rallies - The First 10 Years

The approaching 60th anniversary of the first WBCCI International Rally and the upcoming 61st WBCCI International Rally in Salem, Oregon, make it an appropriate time to review the history of some early WBCCI International Rallies, specifically 1958 to 1967, the first 10 years. Here are some highlights, year by year:

1958 – 1st International Rally – Bull Shoals, AR, July 3-6, 1958 – 300 Airstreams: In early 1958, Airstream decided to host a rally to celebrate Wal-

ly Sin on of well centhe

ly Byam's birthday. Since Wally was born on July 4th, the dates of July 3-6th, 1958 were selected and a central location at the Bull Shoals Dam was found. The rally

was patterned after the International Rallies Wally Byam attended in Europe in the mid-1950s, with invitations sent to special guests and trailer clubs across Europe as well as to all Airstream owners in the U.S. and Canada. The village of "Byamville" was created with a colorful Market Street lined with small stands and booths operated by local merchants who sold food, groceries, handcrafted items, souvenirs, and trailer supplies. There were no buildings or tents, no electricity or water. Programs were held on a large open stage. The star entertainment was Pat Boone's father-in-law, Red Foley. After its successful completion, WBCC leadership decided to make the rally an annual event.



Wally's Birthday Party -1958 1959–2nd International Rally–Wisconsin Dells, WI, July 1-6, 1959–515 Airstreams: The Rally Fee was \$1.50 per night per trailer and this was the first International Rally to use a partial "Wagon Wheel" parking formation.



The rally theme was "Welcome to Alaska, our 49th State", because July 4, 1959 would be the day the U.S. flag with 49 stars became official. Each Unit was asked to prepare a 5-minute skit on the rally theme. Special boat trips to the Wisconsin Dells in WWII era amphibious "Ducks" were enjoyed by many. Other tours, including fishing, boating, riding, and golfing were provided in addition to "in camp" activities. A "Teen Queen" (beauty) contest for the daughters and granddaughters of club members was offered for the first time. This contest would remain a fixture of International Rallies into the early 2000s. Wally and Stella flew in for his July 4th birthday party, received the first ever "Key to the City" from the mayor of Wisconsin Dells, and then flew to Cape Town, South Africa to begin the 1959-60 African Caravan.

1960 – 3rd International Rally – Colorado Springs, CO, July 1-6, 1960 – 868 Airstreams: This International Rally was hosted by the Colorado Unit and was called the "Traveling WBCC

Ranch". It was the first International Rally to ask club members to spend only \$2 bills to demonstrate to the area the financial impact of hosting the Rally. Activities included a Wally Byam's Birthday Dinner Party on July 4th, followed by the showing of African Caravan movies. Wally's birthday cake was constructed from cupcakes for the first time - 3000 in total! Wally gave Government Savings Bonds to the top three Teen Queen contestants. This was the last International Rally that Wally Byam personally attended as he was already feeling the effects of the illness that would take his life in 1962.

A WBCC registration book was positioned at the top of Pike's Peak to be signed by members. One member even pulled his Airstream to the top!

1961 – 4th International Rally – Hershey, PA, July 1-5, 1961 – 960 Airstreams: The rally theme was "More Fun in '61". The Hershey Chocolate Factory provided tours for club members on June 30th, and all Hershey Estates activities, including the amusement park, were open to club members. July 4th was "Early American" Costume Day as well

as the day for Wally Byam's Birthday Party Barbecue, but Wally was unable to attend due to his illness. Movies of the 1960 European Caravan were shown one night. The International Rally was getting bigger, as evidenced by the first appearance of a trailer locator board and an on-site U.S. Post Office, as well as the ability to attract top-tier entertainment. On the final night, Duke Ellington and his band performed, courtesy of Airstream.

1962 – 5th International Rally – Auburn, WA, June 30-July 5, 1962 – 1717 **Airstreams:** The 100-acre rally site was open to club members from June 15 to July 10 which allowed the opportunity to attend the "Century 21 Exposition" 1962 World's Fair in Seattle, just a 40-minute drive away. Chartered busses took club members to the Fair each day during the official rally. The rally theme was "International Fair", with each day having an individual theme: 6/30 – Mexican, 7/1 - Canadian, 7/2 - European, 7/3 -Oriental, 7/4 – American, and 7/5 – All Nations. The Rally Fee was only \$10 and parking, for the first time at an International Rally, was in a complete (though oval) Wagon Wheel formation, with the event tents located in the center. Sixty different committees were needed to organize and run the rally. Wally's July 4th birthday cake was now up to 6000 cupcakes, each with an individual candle!



1963 – 6th International Rally – Bemidji, MN, June 29-July 5, 1963 – 1882 Airstreams: Bemidji, in the "Land of Paul Bunyan", provided a rally site at the Beltrami County Fairgrounds. The rally theme was "Vacationland". Rally activities continued to offer the types of events that had been provided every year since the 2nd International Rally,

including a 4th of July Parade, unit skits, meals, hobby shows, and Teen Queen, square dancing, horseshoe, and golf contests. The top name entertainment was comedienne Phyllis Diller. The July 4th Fish Fry, possibly the largest ever, was followed by Wally Byam's birthday cake made of 6500 cupcakes.

1964 - 7th International Rally -Princeton, NJ, June 22-July 6, 1964 - 1969 Airstreams: The Rally site, in a large field in the Princeton suburb of Skillman, NJ, opened early on June 15 to allow club members to take advantage of the proximity to the 1964 New York World's Fair and the New Jersey Tercentenary and Fair. The rally theme was "300 Years of Progress". Planned rally activities began on June 22, but the official Opening Ceremony was not until June 29. June 30 was officially declared Wally Byam Caravan Club Day at the World's Fair and 80 busses were chartered to transport 3500 rally goers to the Fair. Airstream provided a "hospitality center" in New York City's Astor Hotel from June 22-30 to serve as a temporary meeting place for club members touring Manhattan. Wally's birthday cake on July 4th consisted of 10,000 cupcakes. A daily rally newspaper was organized

for the first time. It was called the "Blue Beret" and in 1965 it would evolve into the monthly club magazine of the same

1965 - 8th International Rally -Laramie, WY, June 29-July 5, 1965 - 2592 Airstreams: A rally site of approximately 150-acres was located next to the University of Wyoming, which opened the doors of some of its buildings for use by the club. The rally theme was simply "Western". Lynda Bird Johnson, daughter of the current U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson, attended the rally at the end of a 5-week tour of the U.S. west in an Airstream trailer. Arrangements were made so that WBCCI members could attend the Shrine Circus in Laramie for free by merely displaying their ID badges and blue berets. There was a special tribute to Wally Byam on July 4th by Airstream Company President Art Costello, but no birthday party or cupcakes.

1966 - 9th International Rally - Cadillac, MI, June 29-July 5, 1966 – 2828 **Airstreams:** The 150-acre site used for the rally required the erection of a building large enough to seat 10,000 persons. The nearly 10,000 attendees doubled Cadillac's population for the duration of

the rally! The rally theme was "Funderland" to highlight the promise of fun in all of Michigan's wonderlands, including lakes Cadillac and Mitchell, just a short distance from the rally site. This was the last International Rally to utilize a complete (though oval) Wagon Wheel parking formation and the Rally Fee was now \$15 including early parking starting on June 22. Representatives of the British and French Caravan Clubs attended the rally making it a truly international affair. Evening entertainment included the Teen Queen contest, various caravan films, square dancing, and ballroom dancing.

1967 - 10th International Rally -Santa Rosa, CA, June 29-July 5, 1967 2156 Airstreams: Airstreams were parked in a big "X" formation on the run-

ways of the former McClellan Air Force Base, which had been constructed in 1942 to mimic the deck of the aircraft carrier "Hornet". To date, this was the only International Rally held in California. A San Francisco style cable car was used to transport attendees around the rally site. Most activities were in a 40,000 square foot tent that sat 7,000 and was claimed to be the largest tent in the world. The 1st Caravan America Tour sponsored by the Wally Byam Foundation, a 4-week tour of the U.S.A by a group of 25 English families in Airstream trailers, ended at the rally. A group of 20 French families began the 2nd Caravan America tour of the U.S.A. at the rally.

Above you have five of the 389 articles written over the years for the *Blue Beret*, five dealing with de-winterizing (category #9). 
Salem capitol building at night

Salem is Oregon's state capital. As 2018 is an even-numbered year, state legislators won't be in session during the Rally but any month of June is a great time to visit the Capitol. Learn about Oregon history, the Capitol building, and the legislative process during a tour with a knowledgeable guide, then climb up to visit "the gold man" at the top - a twenty-two foot bronze figure named the Oregon Pioneer - and view the whole city below and the mountains beyond from his vantage point.

The Capitol grounds are verdant and colorful - hundreds of varieties of trees, shrubs and flowers will be blooming in June. The mall is one of Oregon's newest State Parks and includes the Oregon World War II memorial - a 33 foot tall, 15-ton obelisk.

Beavers and Ducks!

The University of Oregon Ducks play at Autzen Stadium in hippie-friendly Eugene. U of O wears green. The Ducks fought at the Rose Bowl in 1995 and 2015 and at the 2011 National Championship game. Flash the Oregon symbol by making an O of your thumbs and forefingers, and call the Beavers "hayseeds". If you really want to stir up trouble, say "I think Taggart had every right to ditch the Ducks for Florida State right before bowl season."

Peaceable Oregonians are generally thrilled by the national accomplishments of either team. The much anticipated Civil War game takes place on the last day of the season. (The miserable "Toilet Bowl" game - final score: 0 to 0 - was played in 1983.)

The Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta got its start in 1972 when 13 balloons launched from a local shopping center. It has grown into the world's premier ballooning

In 2017, over 900,000

spectators attended Balloon Fiesta, the most photographed event in the world. Over 700 balloon pilots representing 19 countries came to experience the famous Albuquerque Box, cool morning temperatures and the geography of the Rio Grande Valley cause lower winds to blow south and higher winds to blow north. By adjusting altitude, skillful pilots can make several passes and return to the launch field to land. During the Mass Ascension, hundreds of balloons, including 108 special shapes, filled the clear, early morning skies.

On Saturday afternoon, people will gather to watch preparations for the America's Challenge, a distance race for gas balloons. Gas balloons can stay aloft for two to three days. The winning team in 2017 set a new flight record that flew 2,278 miles to land in Monroe, MO, more than 59 hours 35 minutes later.

The best way to experience Balloon Fiesta is, without a doubt, by attending the Albuquerque Balloon Fiesta National Rally. For 2018, we have again secured 150 premium dry camping sites. Attendees can be on the launch field in minutes after getting out of bed and can walk up right next to the balloons as they launch. Winter is the time we dream, enjoy cooler if not cold weather, and plan our camping trips. Be sure to include Airstream Rallies on your 2018 calendar! The Region 3 Rally April 25–29 will be in beautiful Myrtle Beach, SC at Ocean Lakes Family Campground. The International Airstream Rally *Living the Dream* will be in Salem, Oregon from June 23-30. Be sure to check the Blue Beret for applications and more information about these rallies.

Winter is also time to be considering camping hacks - shortcuts to increase productivity efficiency or ease - in and out of our Airstreams. Some hacks are free or very inexpensive. For example, use only square or rectangular containers in your pantry for the most efficient use of space. Small amounts of seasonings can be placed in Tic Tac boxes while larger square boxes easily hold cereal, flour and sugar. Another easy and effective hack: Pool noodles are wonderful for covering awning arms to alert walkers to avoid walking into them when your awning is open. The more colorful the better! Hanging shoe organizers organize more than just shoes - in the bath it can hold varieties of shampoo, conditioners, shower gels, razors etc. that are required by each member of your family. Hung on the inside of a closet door, a shoe organizer can hold rain ponchos, sun lotion, collapsible umbrellas, gloves, hats and scarves.

When asked about useful hacks for fellow Airstreamers, here is what members of Region 3 recommended:

Sheila Skipper (Big Bend Florida): While leveling your Airstream, place a can of vegetables on the floor in the middle of the Airstream. If it rolls to the front or the rear - adjust!

John Carriker III (Carolinas Unit of North Carolina): If you have a shower door that swings out, try hanging a shower curtain inside the door to keep the door dry, so after your shower, no drips from the door!

Eileen Frerking (Region 3 First Lady): Don't use antibacterial soap in camper - it will counteract with the waste water system.

Jan Werner (Florida Treasure Coast): Command hooks are great for hanging up dishtowels, keys, etc. The clip type is good for notes, potholders and rally schedules.

Happy New Year from your extended family here in Jackson Center, OH! I hope everyone was able to enjoy the holidays with family and friends.

Airstream takes the week between Christmas and New Year's off each year as it allows our associates time to relax and enjoy the holiday season with loved ones. During this shutdown week, it also affords us the opportunity to take physical inventory of parts in the plant and make any changes we deem necessary to the factory. In terms of retail sales, the market is still very much on a roll with our dealers selling a record number of Airstreams for the month of December. In fact, what is normally a slow month due to cooler temps and holiday distractions, ended up being in the top 15 of any months in the history of our company! It appears Santa is giving out Airstreams as presents more and more each year!

The big new for the factory in December is that we shipped our first wave of Atlas motor homes to our dealers. Production rates are ramping up nicely for this new product and we are excited to get into this new RV segment. Without shipping a single Atlas, we have taken many retail orders for customers who want to be first in line for this exciting new product. In addition to the Atlas, we are setting up a new production line for the new Nest travel trailer that we will be officially launching on April 12, 2018. As you can imagine, there is a lot of excitement at the factory these days!

In November and December, we had over 100 salespeople come to the factory for sales training. This is on top of nearly 40 service technicians who attended a four day training session as well. The new Five Rivet Dealer Standards program requires factory trained service techs and sales people which is driving attendance to record levels for both. This is a good thing and will hopefully provide each of you with better service at our dealers in the months to follow. Training is a very important initiative here at Airstream and I believe the key to improving the customer experience.

The month of January will be a busy one for Airstream as the RV show season kicks off across the country. In fact, Airstream will have factory personnel at 21 shows across the country in January alone and about that many again in February. I am personally attending the Denver and Tampa shows this January where I hope to see some of you! The dealers are very bullish about the upcoming show season and many are taking more units than ever before in anticipation of record interest in all RV's. Recently, we also added a vinyl floor router that cuts all openings in the vinyl floor on a machine rather than by hand. This improves tolerances, tidiness and efficiencies in our factory. Greetings! I hope you enjoyed the holiday season as much as I have. The only thing that could have made the week better was some warmer weather. It is bitter cold as I write this article in January in Ohio!

I have had a question or two lately concerning power converters that we install in the trailers. In our 2018 model year line up, we replaced the single stage converter we have used for many years and started installing a three stage converter in all models. I will explain the three stages of charging. I will also explain the battery disconnect switch and the change that we made to this as well.

I appreciate all the feedback I have received. Keep it coming for future articles!

Single Stage Converter vs Three Stage Converter

There has been a lot of discussion over the last few years about why Airstream uses a single stage converter system in its products. With all the newer technology available today, why have we not switched to something better? This was always a tough question to answer. Some of our owners who have owned their Airstream for many years have enjoyed the reliability of the single stage converter and had not really experienced any issues. Why change? Most of this feedback from you, our owners, has come from men's and women's feedback sessions during Alumapalooza or the International Rally. Many of you have taken part in these sessions and hope you will continue. Great feedback! So the change was made. Here are the differences.



Single Stage Converter

The Parallax 7300 series power center model 7355A had a single stage convertor with an output of 55 amps. The battery charging portion will charge the batteries at 13.6 to 13.8 volts.



Three Stage Converter

The WFCO WF-8900 series power center has a three stage converter with an output of 55 amps. The three stages are listed below.

Absorption Mode: This mode is the normal operation mode, this supplies 13.6 volts to the 12 volt appliances as well as a slow charge to the batteries.

Bulk Mode: In this mode if the batteries are low, the charger will switch to 14.4 volts for a maximum of four hours and then return to Absorption Mode.

Float Mode: In this mode the converter will trickle charge the batteries at 13.2 volts. When the converter senses a demand (by turning on lights) the converter will automatically return to Absorption Mode.

Note: I know the first question I am going to be asked. Can I replace my existing single stage converter with the three stage model? First, the three stage converter is 9 inches deep versus the single stage converter only being 7 inches deep. In many installations, there is not an extra 2 inches of space available for the change-out. You may be up against a wheel well, wall, or some other obstruction. Second, the new three stage converter that we purchase comes modified to have the battery disconnect solenoid installed in it. All single stage applications will have the battery disconnect solenoid installed in the front end of the trailer separate from the converter. You could order the WFCO three stage converter without the disconnect solenoid modification and then you could replace it.

Battery Disconnect Switch



In 2018 models, Airstream changed the wiring from the disconnect switch above to be able to charge the batteries from either the use or the store position. This was a big change as all previous years the disconnect panel had to be in the use position to be able to have the converter charge the batteries. The store position completely disconnected the converter from the batteries. By using the new three stage converter with the built in solenoid, it provides better control of battery charging by engaging as soon as the shore power connection is hooked up.



Introducing a new caravan along the Old River Road, 1,400 miles from Duluth MN to New Orleans LA, from the weekend after Labor Day to Columbus Day. From the colorful northern fall foliage to the Deep South, this is a spectacular journey with the mighty Mississippi at your side and music exploration on your mind. The caravan starts in Duluth MN, where the iconic singer-songwriter, musician, author, artist and recipient of the 2016 Nobel Prize in Literature, Bob Dylan was born. We tour all Bob Dylan sites of significance in Duluth as well as in Hibbing MN, where he grew up. His 1965 album "Highway 61 Revisited" inspired this caravan, as this once major American highway still connects us to southern places known for their musical heritage. Next are the Twin Cities, where the multi-talented recording artist Prince, who passed away in 2016, resided. We tour his extraordinary private estate and production complex just outside of Minneapolis. A Prairie Home Companion of Garrison Keillor fame, but now with Chris Thile, is also on our agenda in St. Paul. Going south on 61, Memphis TN is a music explorer's delight: Elvis Presley's Graceland, Beale Street with Jerry Lee Lewis Honky Tonk Café, Sun Records where Roy Orbison and Johnny Cash cut their first record, Stax Studios with Otis Redding and the birth of Soul Music. We see it all, and much more. Crossing the state line to Mississippi, 61 turns into the Blues Highway. This stretch is an education of the Mississippi Delta Blues and the rich history of this unique art form. We visit the BB King Museum and Blues Museum featuring legends as well as Morgan Freeman's Ground Zero Blues Club. We even visit a Grammy Museum dedicated to the Blues in the middle of nowhere. Heading south, Louisiana has its own music traditions. Our final destination is New Orleans LA, the birthplace of Jazz: Dixieland, Louis Armstrong. French Quarter, Fats Domino, etc. The Big Easy is this caravan's Grand Finale. If you got the rhythm, this caravan is for you! This caravan is primarily for lovers of modern American music. Although we include a few non-musical bonus options, like a Greyhound Bus Museum or a Red Wing Shoe Museum, or a John Deere or Mark Twain, or a Coca-Cola Museum where the first Coke was bottled. Expect waterfront campgrounds, if possible. Really, two wirehaired dachshunds are organizing this caravan. This means "Highway 61 Revisited" is pet-friendly. 
