I move that Article IV Sec. 11, C & D be changed by deleting the "12" in Sec. C and insert "6", "twelve" in Sec. D and inset "6". Delete "and/or for the current year and the subsequent year if payment made on or after July 1 of the current year." In both Sec. C & D. and insert in both Sec. C & D, after "June 30": "Payment by lapsed members after July 1 will include both the current years dues and the dues for the following year."

Article IV, Sec. C:

C. Membership of regular members in the international club, and in any unit or chartered body thereof, shall be terminated on December 31 if dues are not paid electronically to WBCCI Headquarters or to and receipted by the unit treasurer on or before December 31. Any membership so terminated may be reinstated anytime within the succeeding 12 6 months by payment of unit and international dues for the current year anytime between January 1 and June 30. and/or for the current year and the subsequent year if payment made on or after July 1 of the current year. (6/27/14) Payment by lapsed members after July 1 will include both the current years dues and the dues for the following year.

Article IV, Sec. C will then read:

C. Membership of regular members in the international club, and in any unit or chartered body thereof, shall be terminated on December 31 if dues are not paid electronically to WBCCI Head-quarters or to and receipted by the unit treasurer on or before December 31. Any membership so terminated may be reinstated anytime within the succeeding 6 months by payment of unit and international dues for the current year anytime between January 1 and June 30. Payment by lapsed members after July 1 will include both the current years dues and the dues for the following year.

Article IV, Sec. D:

D. Membership of a member at large in the international club shall be terminated on December 31 if international dues and the established surcharge are not received at International Headquarters on or before December 31. The membership of a member at large so terminated may be reinstated any time within the succeeding twelve 6 months by the payment of international dues and the established surcharge for the current year any time between January 1 and June 30 and/or for the current year and the subsequent year if payment is made on or after July 1 of the current year. Payment by lapsed members, after July 1, will include both the current year's dues and the dues for the following year.

Article IV, Sec. D will then read:

D. Membership of a member at large in the international club shall be terminated on December 31 if international dues and the established surcharge are not received at International Headquarters on or before December 31. The membership of a member at large so terminated may be rein-

stated any time within the succeeding 6 months by the payment of international dues and the established surcharge for the current year any time between January 1 and June 30. Payment by lapsed members, after July 1, will include both the current year's dues and the dues for the following year.

Rationale: This change is being made to clarify that a member who allows his or her membership to lapse and then renews after July 1 of the year after their lapse owes International dues for the current year and, if they wish to continue their membership in WBCCI, the next year. This does not apply to new members who join after July 1. Their International dues payment pays for the balance of the current year and the next year.

Financial Impact: A years dues paid to WBCCI for those members who renew their lapsed membership after July 1 of the current year.

International President Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one-way travel expenses to Board of Trustee meetings, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1, for approval of the Executive Committee on or before July 5. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters. (7/5/11)
- b. International First Vice-President Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one- way travel expenses to Board of Trustee meetings, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1, for approval of the Executive-Committee on or before July 5. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters. (7/5/11)
- e. International Second Vice-President Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one-way travel expenses to Board of Trustee meetings, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1; for approval of the Executive Committee on or before July 5. Claims will be

- d. International Third Vice President Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one-way travel expenses to Board of Trustee-meetings other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1, for approval of the Executive Committee on or before July 5. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters. (7/5/11)
- e. International Recording Secretary Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one-way travel expenses to and from Board of Trustees meeting, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1, for approval at the Executive Committee Meeting on or before July 5. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters. (7/5/11
- f. International Treasurer Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one way travel expenses to and from Board of Trustees meeting, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1, for approval at the Executive Committee Meeting on or before July 5. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters. (7/5/11)
- g. Immediate Past President Reimbursement includes the budgeted amount plus one-way travel expenses to and from Board of Trustees meeting, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1, for approval at the Executive Committee Meeting on or before July 5. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters. (7/5/11)
- h. Region President The total allowable travel reimbursement for each Region will be calculated using a base amount plus an amount per unit. Travel expenses to and from the Mid-Winter IBT meeting will be basis of a submitted budget to the Treasurer prior to July 1 for approval. Reimbursement cannot exceed the approved budgeted amount and claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters within 90 days of travel but no later than June 1 of each year. (7/5/11)
- i. Region Vice Presidents Cross funding within a Region is authorized with full approval of the Region Officers concerned. (7/5/11)
- j. Standing and Special Committee Chairmen Travel expenses shall be paid when specifically approved as a budget item that has been submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1 for approval at the Executive Committee meeting on or before July 5 at the first IBT meeting of the fiscal year. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters.

A new Sec. 3 Part a will be inserted that reads as follows:

a. Reimbursement for the following International Officers: International President, International First Vice President, International Second Vice President, International third Vice President, International Recording Secretary, International Treasurer, and Immediate Past President includes the budgeted amount plus one-way travel expenses to and from Board of Trustees meetings, other than those above, based on a budget submitted to the Treasurer for approval at the first Executive Committee meeting of the fiscal year. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters.

The re-lettered sections b, c, and d will read as follows:

- h b. Region President The total allowable travel reimbursement for each Region will be calculated using a base amount plus an amount per unit. Travel expenses to and from the Mid-Winter IBT meeting will be based on a budget submitted by the Treasurer at the first IBT meeting of the fiscal year. Reimbursement cannot exceed the approved budgeted amount and claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters within 90 days of travel but no later than November 1 of each year.
- i c. Region Vice Presidents Cross funding within a Region is authorized with full approval of the Region Officers concerned. (7/5/11)
- j d. Standing and Special Committee Chairmen Travel expenses shall be paid when specifically approved as a budget item that has been submitted to the Treasurer prior to July 1 for approval at the Executive

Committee meeting at the first IBT meeting of the fiscal year. Claims will be submitted directly to Headquarters.

Proviso: If approved this motion will take effect January 1, 2017 and will require an 18 month budget for the 2015-16 fiscal year to allow for the transition to a calendar fiscal year.

Rationale: With the passage of a constitutional amendment to allow for a floating date for the international Rally and because the current fiscal year is tied to a specific date for the International rally it is necessary to establish a specific fiscal year for the club. By moving the fiscal year to a calendar year basis we accomplish the following:

- 1. Establish a fiscal year not tied to a date uncertiain.
- 2. Eliminate the need for 2 IBT meetings at the international rally with a cost and time saving as the budget would be approved at the Mid-Winter IBT meeting in January. The constitution currently calls for 3 meetings of the IBTArticle IX, Sec 5, but does not specify the date, which could be the January mid-winter meeting. The International President has the option of cancellling the third meeting which addresses the constitutional call for 3 meetings. A future change in the constitution could totally eliminate the need for a third meeting.
- 3. Allow the newly elected Internatioal President and EC an opportunity to plan their budget year with a known income stream as the budget would be determined after the next years dues have been collected
- 4. Establish the membership year as the fiscal year with dues collection for the next year commencing after July 1.

Financial Impact: There is a financial savings with the elimination of a second IBT meeting at the International Rally. If the Budget meeting were moved to coincide with the MidWinter IBT meeting there would also be no need for a separate budget meeting as all of the Budget committee would be in attendance at the IBT meeting. There will be an expence of a second tax filing in 2016 for the last six months of 2016 to allow the new fiscal year to start on January 1, 2017.

I move that Article III. Sec 5 be deleted and a new Sec. 5 be substituted. In addition Article III Policy K be rewritten to reflect the new Article III Sec. 5.

Delete the following Article III, Sec. 5:

Sec. 5 The members of the International Rally Site Committee shall be the President, the 1st Vice President; the 2nd Vice President and the 3rd Vice President. (6/22/92)

New Article III, Sec. 5:

Article III Sec. 5 International Rally Site Committee: On a rotating basis one of four Areas comprised of specific Regions of WBCCI (Area 1: Regions 1, 2, 4; Area 2: Regions 3, 5, 6; Area 3: Regions 7, 8, 9 and Area 4 Regions 10, 11, 12) would propose to find a site and facilities for the International Rally (IR) and business meeting. No Area shall have a repeat of the IR site until the other Areas have completed a cycle of hosting, or have withdrawn their bid by agreement of the Executive Committees of all Regions within the Area.

The International Rally Committee will set minimum site requirements to include, but not limited to, number of unit parking spaces, minimum service levels, meeting facilities and activities of interest to members and guests within a reasonable distances. Once found, the International Rally Site committee with the assistance of the WBCCI legal staff will negotiate the necessary contract for use at least two years before the date of the Rally.

The Policy or description of the committee's responsibilities would remain essentially unchanged.

Delete the following Article III, Policy K:

Policy K

International Rally Site Committee To seek sites for International Rallies and to investigate the suitability of all-such sites so found; to formulate the basic requirements for an International Rally and to make those requirements known to the Chambers of Commerce and other like bodies; to select a site for each Inter-

national Rally at least one year in advance and officially announce its location one or more years in advance. (2/18/84)

The Chairman of the International Rally Site Committee and/or persons investigating a site for a future International Rally should complete a report to be filed as a permanent record at the International Office. This report should contain as many pertinent facts as possible so as to aid and assist in future investigation. (6/18/82)

Insert the following Article III, Policy K:

Policy K

International Rally Site Committee The role of the site committee would be at a minimum the following:

- 1. To formulate the basic requirements for the International Rally site in conjunction with the International Rally Committee.
- 2. To make site requirements known to the Regions and Units scheduled to be the host Area as well as the Tourism Departments and Chambers of Commerce in the Area under consideration to solicit their help and support in finding a suitable site.
- 3. To seek sites for an International Rally within their Area and investigate the suitability of all sites proposed.
- 4. Select a site for the International Rally, ideally, at least three years in advance and officially announce its location two or more years in advance.

The Chair of the International Rally Site Committee will complete a report to be filed at the International Office detailing the sites considered by the committee in their Area. This report should evaluate each site against the basic requirements established by the Site Committee working with the International Rally Committee. This report should contain all pertinent information to aid and assist in future investigation for rally sites in the Area and facilitate the setup of the site chosen for the International Rally.

Rationale: Members regularly request that the International Rally (IR) be held in locations that are easily accessible to them. Since we have members and Units spread across the United States, Canada and are beginning to see Units and members located overseas, we need to insure that the IR is held in locations that are close to our members regardless of where they live. By dividing the countries into four geographic Areas and rotating the IR between the Areas, we attempt to bring the IR close to the members on a determinate basis. In addition, this change will encourage involvement and cooperation between the IR planning

and the area of the event. Of equal importance is freeing the International officers from the responsibility of finding a location of the IR and devote more of their time to the needs of the membership.

Proviso: This process will be implemented with the search for the 2018 IR site.

Financial Impact: The possible financial affect would be for any required legal services in contract negotiations to ensure the club has the best possible contract protecting its interests.

I move that **Article III**, **Sec. 2**, and **3** of the WBCCI Bylaws be deleted and replaced with new Sec. 2, and 3 below.

Delete the following:

Sec. 2 Bylaws All members of standing committees shall be approved by the Executive Committee. No program will be undertaken by such committee unless approved by the Executive Committee and funding for such program included in the annual budget. (7/5/93)

Add a new Sec. 2:

Article III, Sec. 2: The chairs of all standing committees, except the International Rally, International Rally Site and Lifetime Membership Fund, shall be appointed for a term of three years by the Executive Committee and approved by the IBT. The chair appointments will be on a three year cycle beginning in 2015. Year one: (2015) Blue Beret; Budget; Caravan; Community Service; Constitution and ByLaws; and Electronic Communications. Year two: (2016) Ethics and Grievance; Family and Youth; Historical; International Relations; Legislative; and Marketing. Year three: (2017) Membership; National/Special Events; Public Relations; Rally Promotions; RV Parks and Technical. A standing committee will undertake no program unless approved by the Executive Committee and funding for such program included in the annual budget. The President shall fill, by appointment, any vacancy in the chair position occurring by reason of death or resignation for the remaining term of the chair. Delete the following:

Sec. 3 Bylaws All standing committees shall consist of a chairman and as many members as the President shall deem necessary. The Chairman of each Committee shall be appointed by the President. The President shall fill by appointment, any vacancy occurring by reason of death or resignation. (6/22/92)

Add a new Sec. 3

Article III, Sec. 3: All Standing Committees shall have a minimum of three members selected from the membership by the committee chair. Names and contact information of the committee chairs shall be published in the WBCCI directory to encourage members to contact the chairs directly and volunteer for any committee based upon their interest, experience and expertise. The chair may also invite members to serve on their committee and in the event of a vacancy occurring by reason of death or resignation the chair shall advertise the opening in the committee and select a replacement member.

Rationale: The internal inconsistency of Article III, Sec. 2 of the Bylaws is corrected by these changes as well as providing a means for the membership to offer their knowledge and expertise

to the growth of the club. **Article III, Sec. 3**. The establishment of a minimum committee size allows for discussion and decision making by committees, which will benefit the membership. It also provides for an institutional memory for the committee.

Financial Impact: There is no financial impact from this change.

Electronic Communications Committee Report January 2015 Mid-Winter IBT, Robstown, Texas

The ECC has been very busy since the last IBT meeting in Gillette. The biggest change has been working with Lori Plummer, our new Corporate Manager. We have been working with Lori with the goal of improving the office workflow and services for our members. Lori has been wonderful to work with and we already have plans in common with the Corporate Office for changes in the future. The ECC has added two new members. Jim Cooper, former VAC President, has extensive knowledge of Filemaker from his work with the VAC membership database. Jim quickly jumped in and took the lead on the Digital Directory project. Debbie Wood brings years of policy and procedures experience from her years in the healthcare industry and is learning Filemaker for the Amateur Radio Club. Debbie has been doing the monthly wbcci.org website updates.

The ECC's two recent projects are the membership survey and membership Digital Directory (DD). Both of these projects have been time-consuming but were well worth the effort.

Membership Survey:

Under direction of the Executive Committee, the ECC completed a Survey of Member Opinions through both email and print versions. The response was extraordinary with over 1500 members responding, 1450 online and 86 in print. We hope the results will help the leaders of the club understand and respond to the members' wants and needs for the future. The results will be published in the February issue of News & Views and the Blue Beret. Thank you to Hazel Knopp for compiling the print survey results for us.

Digital Directory (DD):

Jim Cooper has managed the entire DD development. Here is his report:

The Digital Directory is complete and ready to distribute. The effort to create a DD requires only clicking a "Make DD, New Data" button, the process has been totally automated. Both the DD and its Distribution List are saved as PDF and XLS files respectively. The data in the DD is drawn from the current WBCCI_DB membership database. This means we can update the DD several times a year as members join.

Distribution involves sending an email to members that includes a link to click if they want to download a DD. This serves as a request process, and they must request a DD before it is downloaded. Note that the link is unique for each membership. Additionally, it allows only five downloads over a period of ninety days.

Assuring security of members' information is a three-step process. First, members were asked if they wished to opt-out of the DD; second, distribution is controlled by the process already mentioned; and third, any posting of the DD or its parts on the Internet will be detected by the ECC and action will be taken to have the posted DD removed.

Only Regular and Life memberships whose dues are current and who have not opted-out are listed in the DD. Of these, only those with an email address receive an invite to download a DD. The Digital Directory Project started as a tightly managed project with a time line. It is currently on schedule. Volunteer members of the WBCCI and ECC have executed the project. It has incurred no cost to the club and has no distribution cost.

Ongoing ECC projects include:

- Assist Unit and Region webmasters in improving websites and adding content.
- Encourage Units and Regions to create Facebook Pages as a means to advertise events, in addition to providing interaction among members.
- Continue to update content and upgrade software on both wbcci.net and wbcci.org
- Publish 'News & Views,' a monthly digital newsletter sent to all members with an email address of file at the Corporate Office.
- Present several technology seminars for the International Rally.
- Continue to work with the Corporate Office to transfer data processing from paper to online format.
- Integrate the new membership database into the website.
- Upgrade wbcci.org and overhaul the layout and theme. A new development website is currently in progress.

We are looking forward to continuing our work with Lori Plummer and the office staff to improve processes and procedures and streamline services for our members.

Special Thanks to Jim Cooper, Carolyn Beardshear, and Tim Kendziorski for their hard work on the Digital Directory.

RE: 2015 Winter IBT Legislative Report

As irritating as the just completed political campaigning was, there is good news too. Congress spent so much time on the road, they found little time to legislate, and that can be a good thing.

They did find time to pass H. R. 5204, called the Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Modernization Act of 2014. The bill was signed into law and allows the Secretary of the Interior to charge fees for entries and many services in Federal lands. The Golden Age Passport is not affected by this law. (Note; Golden Age Passport requirements are 62 years of age, Citizen of the USA, and \$10.00.) If this Golden Age Passport information is in error, the new information will be posted in the Blue Beret and on the WBCCI web page.

Purchasing diesel fuel in Arizona was recently in the news. The tax for a gallon of diesel is \$.18 per gallon for a recreational vehicle. The tax for a business vehicle using diesel fuel is \$.26 per gallon. Over the road trucks of course pay the higher fee. If you use your RV only for recreation you pay the lower fee. If you are transporting a musical group for instance to a concert where you will receive pay, you are to pay the higher fee. The fuel pumps in Arizona are marked accordingly, and note there are fuel tax evasion units that monitor fuel stations.

The oil boom in North Dakota has increased the state's population and this has affected the park system as more people are visiting recreational areas on weekends. All state parks are reporting 20 to 25 % increases in visitors in addition to regular visitors.

All 50 states parks are having money problems, whether for maintenance or new programs. The approaches are varied from state to state. They include new user fees, contracting services, dedicated funding sources, such as lotteries, and voluntary and philanthropy funding from private sources. The pros and cons are as many as the different ideas. Some state park problems also include keeping up with demographics and preferences. One such example would be providing WiFi. State park visitations have been increasing, and local economies have been favorably affected. Solutions will be found by all, but pay attention to your state's approach.

Lifetime Membership Fund Report

The breakdown of the fund is on the attached form. This year the fund had a decrease of 63 members which in turn reduced the withdrawal from last year by 13%. With the number of members in the fund reducing by significant amounts due to attrition, the life of the fund is increased. With an annual reduction in the withdrawal rate of 12% the fund with no income from new members or any interest added in will remain solvent for the next 15 years. If 1% interest is added to the equation, an additional 5 years of solvency is added to the fund.

In July of 2014 a motion was presented to the board to temporarily stop allowing members from becoming lifetime members. After much discussion the motion was referred to this committee to report on at the winter IBT meeting. The following are the findings of this committee. Based on the current tables, members who become lifetime members will be fully funded from the fund for the rest of their lives. This is based on the statistical data for life expectancy provided by the United States and Canadian governments. The committee also finds that the tables can be confusing and will be presenting to the board at the June IBT Meeting a new appendix #1 to the bylaws that will simplify the process of becoming a lifetime member.

The entire committee would like to thank Lori Plummer and all the staff in Jackson Center for all the help she has provided this committee.

This committee has 2 motions on the agenda.



Subject: Report of club activities July 1 through November, 2014

The WBCCI Amateur Radio club continues to enjoy membership growth and increased member activity during the report period. Club membership now stands at 335, an increase of 14 members since our previous report dated May 2014. Financially, the club's treasury balance stands at \$9800 and increase of \$1500 from the May 2014 report. The membership increase may be due, in part, to the discontinuance of the CB Radio club as well as renewed emphasis on amateur radio as an essential communications resource serving the general public during natural disasters or as an improved communications tool for RV travelers. As an example of the increased emphasis, please note the recent Region 12 rally held in Pahrump, NV in October, 2014. Amateur radio operators in Region 12 conducted amateur radio training, gave exams, and produced 9 new licensed operators. Additionally, amateur radio was used to aid other members arriving and/or leaving the rally and provided a daily, radio round table for general discussion among members. This mirrors a similar activity held at the Region 1 rally in New Berlin, CT in 2013, which also produced 9 new licensed operators. All of these new licensees are now members of the WBCCI Amateur Radio Club.

The club has also provided assistance to the Caravan committee by reviewing outdated language in the Caravan handbook. Suggested revisions were provided to the Caravan committee chair for inclusion in the revised handbook which is planned for distribution at the 2015 International Rally in Farmington, NM.

The club supports an auxiliary service called the RV Service Nets (or network). These nets meet 364 days a year and provide all RV minded amateurs a known location where essential messages may be sent or information obtained about the club.

We continue to be challenged by the need to recruit new leaders and officers for the club. At the present time, we have successfully filled all officer positions.

It should be noted that the Director of the U.S. Federal Emergency Management Agency recently identified amateur radio as an essential resource of volunteer trained communicators who willing use their own time and equipment to serve the public. On a personal level, my Airstream trailer and my amateur radio equipment are included in the assets of my local county emergency management agency. We consider our access to the radio frequencies granted through our FCC licenses to be one of the reasons we willingly serve the public in times of disaster when the normal communications channels may be inadequate or compromised.

Finally, our club is aware that its Intraclub status is being reviewed as a potential cost saving measure for the annual International Rally and Convention. As I explained above, the club and its members represent a worthwhile asset to the entire organization and the privileges extended to the club because of its Intraclub status are commensurate with its ability to supply essential communications services should the need arise.
