During the past year we did very well on getting new members and I hope that continues. According to headquarters it was over 465 700 new members. Thank you everyone for being part of the efforts to get them interested in WBCCI.

This is one of the reasons why we over spent the Blue Beret & Directory postage Miscellaneous budget. This is pay pal and new member charges. The new member packets cost about \$21.50 each which includes a current Blue Beret magazine & directory. However we would encourage any member who would like to get the Blue Beret electronically to inform headquarters.

Also line item #360 Interest incomes show a negative number. This will be adjusted when Lori meets with the CPA. Last year's closing entries throw us into a negative number which carried over to this year.

Some of the money in the Marketing Committee's budget will be moved to advertising as recommended by our CPA last year for tax purposes. The money will still be there for them to use but will show in the other account.

We hope that the time and expense of changing to the new computer programming is about over. Lori has worked diligently to get this accomplished and we hope things will now move more smoothly. We are now using QuickBooks at the corporate office and at the International Rally finance office. The ability to work on-line will help the communications between the rally and headquarters. This will eliminate calling headquarters to get answers to questions as they arise.

The on-line registrations and direct deposits are being used more each day. This helps the employees in the office to work more efficiently. They have a lot to do to keep the records for WBCCI and all the expenses for our club and we do appreciate it.

We will soon have a big expense at headquarters because the roof needs major repairs. (New Roof) Lori is getting bids from several contractors in the area. We hope it won't break the bank.

We want to thank Lori, Deb & Julie for their guidance with helping coordinate all the applications for membership and the International Rally.

I would also like to thank my committee for their help in preparing the budgets.

WBCCI members who have been involved in Unit, Region, or National Caravan activities during the year will be recognized at the event. All International and Region officers and WBCCI members are invited to attend the dinner (contact the Standing Caravan Committee Chairman for specifics). I would encourage at least one officer from each Region to attend. This dinner is open for all WBCCI members to attend in support of the caravan program. Reservations for attendees must be made with the Standing Caravan Committee Chairman no later than June11, 2016.

National Caravan Leader and Committee Meeting Scheduled: A one-day discussion session for National Caravan Leaders and Caravan Committee members has been scheduled at Lewisburg, WV. The meeting will be held on June20, 2016. The meeting allows the open exchange of ideas and the opportunity to ask questions and receive answers from some of the most experienced Caravan Leaders in WBCCI. Subj: Mid-year Report

- First, this committee is forwarding to the IBT three (3) motions to ensure that the International Rally in 2017 is fully compatible with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Club and Corporation, the first being a constitutional proposal to the Delegates for the 2016 Delegates Meeting. The remaining two are Bylaw recommended changes that permit full compliance due to possible changes of the traditional dates that has been reaffirmed by the Delegates in 2014.
- 2. Secondly, with more experience gained in the formation of overseas units outside of the presently defined lines of the 12 WBCCI Regions, an update to the requirements for these units in the form of the fourth motion is also forwarded. It is important to note that every opportunity for these units is different due to factors outside of direct WBCCI control and will require careful analysis and possibly legal decisions will have to be considered. WBCCI is again in the forefront of the RV world with the support of the Airstream Company in the extension of our organization outside of Canada and the United States.
- 3. Third, I must apologize for my computer down time during November of this year. I answered what I considered to be a valid request, which very often had been the case before from Club members, but ended with a compromised computer. If since there has been no response from me since, I am very sorry, but now do not open my computer unless I know the sender. It would be most helpful if units forwarding updated CBLs would comply with the procedures on page 1 of Appendix 6 and forward their CBLs to headquarters and not me or members of my committee.
- 4. After we are assured that the 2017 International Rally and Delegates Meeting are fully in compliance with the updates to the Constitution and Bylaws, my committee can return again to the unit CBL program before the completion of my term.

Electronic Communication Committee (ECC) Report for Winter IBT 2016 December 1st, 2015

The ECC continues to work on project after project, with no end in sight. A member of the ECC is in daily contact with Lori or the office staff. We continue to work on improving the workflow and efficiency at the Central Office. The ECC's goal is to provide the membership the services and support they deserve and are requesting.

#### Recent accomplishments:

- Continued publication of the Digital Membership Directory. Over 20% of the membership downloads the Directory within a few days of receiving the email. The ECC feels the current delivery system is much too cumbersome and would like to work with the EC and IBT to improve the service, while retaining security of the Digital Directory.
- Continued publication of the electronic newsletter "News & Views" which is emailed to all WBCC1 members with email addresses on file.
- Upgraded the backend software and plugins of the club's main website: wbcci.org
- Continued maintenance of wbcci.net (Unit and Region websites) and provided support to unit webmasters.
- Created new Facebook group for upcoming International Rally in Lewisburg WV, which currently has 197 members.
- Provided updates and co-administration of the WBCCI Facebook page, which currently has 1516 members. (Lori Plummer has also been given admin access to this page: we should consider creating a generic Facebook account, Lori is currently using her personal Facebook account.)
- Members continue to embrace online registration, over 105 members have registered for the 2016 Lewisville rally online.
- 676 Members renewed their 2016 membership online.
- Over 500 new members have joined the club online, since July 1st 2015.

Richard Girard, our IBT liaison, has asked our committee to work on a few projects, which include:

- Research and recommend a Calendaring system. The current method of sending in unit
  event information only once a year is resulting in inaccurate information in the Blue Beret
  because the information has to be entered manually from hand-written forms, resulting in
  significant input errors. This will give the units control over changes in their calendars
  and hopefully result in many fewer TBDs in the Blue Beret and on the website.
- Investigate the CMS system used for wbcci.org and determine if we should look at other solutions. CMS (Content Management System) the framework behind the website.

#### Continuing projects:

Increase the efficiency and productivity of the office staff by smarter use of technology and eliminating redundancy and reliance on paper.

- Implement better reporting of data for use at the International Rallies, leading to simplification of parking and registration processes.
- Create automatic renewal notices sent to all members, directly from the membership database.
- Develop a method for members to search online for available membership numbers.
- Create a generic email addressing schema for International, Region and Unit Officers.
- Make continued improvements to the membership database. Jim Cooper (Denco Unit)
  has a list of tasks from Lori and works with her directly.
- Move the website to a new hosting provider. This is due to continuing issues with the inability to email members of other providers. We should have this task done before the Winter IBT meeting.

Working with Lori Plummer and all the office staff has been a joy and a pleasure. The office staff cares about the membership and is striving to provide the best service possible. With a team like this the WBCCI is sure to grow and prosper.

The ECC would like to make the EC and IBT aware of the continued cost savings the ECC provides to the club. Jim Cooper's time alone has saved the club thousands of dollars on Filemaker development. While the ECC is happy to support the membership and the office staff, we would like to suggest the office have paid support available when emergencies arrive. We also encourage the EC and IBT to continue to fund professional database development, so we can implement new services for our members.

Note: The ECC is currently looking for members who have expertise in Filemaker, WordPress, Joomla, and Excel and are willing to dedicate several hours a week to improve how our club makes use of technology. Committee Report I – Historical Committee IBT Meeting, January 2016

Thank you for the opportunity to become the sixth person to serve as Chairman of the WBCCI Historical Committee since this committee was first created in 1972<sup>1</sup>. I hope to bring a new energy and continuity to this position after becoming the third new Chairman in the past 5 years. I am in the process of developing a long term plan that includes more frequent communication of Airstream and WBCCI history coupled with better organization and preservation of materials in the WBCCI Archives. The long term goal is to digitize materials in the WBCCI Archives and make them available to all WBCCI members.

Regarding communication, beginning with the November 2015 edition of the Blue Beret, I have started a monthly recurring column titled "Historically Speaking" to highlight interesting bits of Airstream and WBCCI History. I also intend to submit frequent historical articles to the WBCCI News & Views email newsletter as well as the Vintage Airstream Club email newsletter. I also am working on a plan to refresh the WBCCI Bulletin Board and Display Cases in the Airstream Service Building to better inform Airstream owners of the many benefits of WBCCI membership, highlighting not just our caravan history, but also our units, rallies, intraclubs, courtesy parking, Airstream Park discounts, and other benefits.

In October 2015, I spent over two weeks in Jackson Center reviewing the WBCCI Historical Archives to get an understanding of their contents, organization, and condition as well as to research historical topics for future Historically Speaking articles. During this visit, I met with Karen Kist of the Airstream Marketing Department and received a personal tour of the Airstream Company Archives. Their use of archival quality materials and procedures for the preservation of documents, 16mm films, and other materials and their full index of all the materials in their archives is impressive. Karen shared with me much information regarding the materials and processes they employ in their archives. We may be able to implement many of these items in the WBCCI Archives. I will continue to nurture this relationship so that we might be able to share historical materials between our two archives in the future.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> A WBCCI History Committee was first proposed at the February 18, 1972 WBCCI Executive Committee Meeting. It was approved as a Special Committee at the July 5, 1972 IBT meeting and was finally instituted as a Standing Committee at the June 22, 1974 IBT Meeting.

After review of the WBCCI archives, it is clear that one of the most immediate needs is better organization. What I found was a great many cases of photos, newspaper and magazine article clippings, caravan rosters, and other materials in binders that were labeled for completely unrelated subjects. Some photos are mislabeled as to what is actually shown in them. These issues make it very hard to locate historical materials of interest when doing research. Reorganization of these materials into a consistent and logical order along with the creation of a detailed index of these materials must be the first priority.

The review of the WBCCI archives also showed that many materials are deteriorating. These materials should be transferred to proper acid free archival quality sleeves for their long term preservation. Archival quality cotton gloves must be implemented when handling these materials. I intend to research proper archival preservation sleeves, binders, boxes, and gloves with the intention of submitting a budget request for these materials in 2016.

Digitization of paper materials in the WBCCI Archives can only realistically be initiated after the materials are properly organized, indexed, and preserved. I do not expect we will be ready to begin this process in 2016. When appropriate, I will work with the ECC to determine where and how the digitized materials will be stored, and I will staff a team of club members to assist with the digitization activities.

Digitization of the 16mm films in the WBCCI archives may be a different matter. During my visit in October, I reviewed and cataloged these materials and found a variety of films, that based upon the labeling on film cases and reels, ranged from WBCCI Rally promotion films, to professional films of International Rallies and caravans, to home movies of historic caravans. Luckily, these films generally had little to no vinegar smell that would indicate an advanced state of deterioration, but I still think we may want to consider converting some of them to a digital format in the near future. I intend to research our film digitization options. Perhaps once digitized, copies could be made available for sale in the WBCCI Store to help pay for the cost of conversion. This topic will take more research before an action plan can be made.

2016 Winter IBT report

I used to get weekly newsletters from the RVA, (Recreational Vehicle Association) about legislative information that was significant to Airstream travel. They have changed their format to only include business information in their newsletters, and a different source was needed for me to get legislative information. Steve Piotrowski, trailer # 2900, who is a former congressional assistant, put me onto another source for legislative information. But first I need to mention that if the information is vital and timely, I can send it direct to Carolyn Beardshear, trailer # 7982, who can post it on the Airstream web site. This was the emergency case recently when the rain fall deluge in South Carolina, and the forest fires in the west closed some national campgrounds. I sent the information to Carolyn who posted it on the Airstream web site so our members could check to be sure the campgrounds they were planning to use was still available. This avenue for information is still available to me.

The most significant legislation to pass congress is the FAST Act. This is the long term funding for road repairs. The funding will increase roughly 11 % over the next five years, but more important, state projects can now go forward to fix highways and bridges.

The "Takata" safety belt recall was also in the news in 2015. If you question whether your car is on the recall list, use the web site, <a href="www.safecar.gov">www.safecar.gov</a>. You do need your car's VIN number to check if it out.

There are three new DOT terminologies I want to mention. The first is "Road Diets." The term refers to new ways for low cost lane reallocations. This does include round-abouts, but may also include ways to change lanes at intersections. State dots will be included in the designs of these new "Road Diets." The second term is TIGER. This stands for Transportation Investment Generating Economy Recovery. The words describe the process. Money from the federal government is used to help areas invest in transportation projects to help economic recovery. As an example \$5 billion dollars was allotted to South Carolina to rebuild roads and bridges because of the heavy rain earlier this year. The final program is called BATIC, build America transportation investment center. This program allows combined investments by the federal government, state and local governments, and even some private investment. Design work will include the best information available from all sources, governmental or private.

Finally, the federal DOT is investigating ways to include the arts and music to your traveling miles. The program does not yet have a way to get there, but it is working on it. Rather than passing through or around areas of cultural interest, the DOT would like to take vehicles through areas like New Orleans, or Memphis. This is a new program so be patient.

# Marketing Committee Report IBT - Rayne, Louisiana

Subject: Report of Marketing Committee

Marketing has zeroed in on Airstream websites for our banner ads to give the most return for the monies invested. Those sites include: AirForums, Airstream Classifieds, and Vintage Airstreams. I have signed the WBCCI up for ads to be displayed to potential WBCCI members, current airstream owners and Airstream owner wannabes. I was able to keep the same rates. That rate will be honored in the coming fiscal year if the board approves the proposed budget for Marketing in 2016-17. Web stats show that our banner ads were displayed more than 18 million times resulting in 12,800+ clicks to the WBCCI website.

While I've been Marketing Chairman, I have been diligent to get the most return for the money invested and am happy to report that by keeping on top of the dollars and the banner ads, we were able to get a credit of just over \$4170.60. Andy Robinowitz, owner of the Airstream websites is a very honest man and following his own audit he presented me with the credit. I had that credit applied to our current billings from Social Knowledge so that we would not need the total \$12K+ dollars that the board approved for Marketing this fiscal year. The following is a breakdown of those normal ad rates.

AirstreamTrailers.com - \$100/month
AirstreamClassifieds.com - 650k Impressions, 43k Airstream shoppers each month,
\$292/month
AIRForums.com - 1.1 million Impressions, 121k Airstream enthusiasts each month,
\$500/month

Marketing agreed on a \$700/month 22% discounted rate. That means the average monthly cost is now as follows:

AirstreamTrailers.com - \$78/month AirstreamClassifieds.com - \$229/month AIRForums.com - \$392/month

Marketing highly recommends that when the budget committee meets that they consider continuation of the monies needed to maintain the ads along with the online Blue Beret for the year 2016-17 not actual dollars spent as the credit will show.

The Blue Beret online continues to have the Best in Class for Best Cover and Most Engaging for like magazines...see the attached report. Most interesting is the fact of where readers are seeing the BlueBeret online from...83% of them are from embedded links, most probably from units websites, the WBCCI website and others. Advertisers in the Blue Beret are growing..thanks to a great job of sales and professional graphic design from Deb and the other ladies at headquarters. With the links established at each marketing partners ad the advertisers are being exposed to an average of 39,000 visitors per month to the BlueBeretonline.

The Blue Beret Online continues to work as a very valuable sales tool for giving additional exposure to our advertisers in addition to the printed publication. Advertising revenue has increased with additional exposure and a great sales effort at headquarters. Plus, all advertisers in the magazine have a link established to put the reader at their doorstep. The most recent analytics show that the November, 2015 Blue Beret online has been opened 39,306 times with an average read time of 4:55 seconds. The average read is 150 per 1000 impressions. An impression is each time the Blue Beret was displayed to a user. See the attached graphic which rates the Blue Beret Best in Class (November issue) and the Most Engaging (April issue).





#### INTERNATIONAL OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT

To: President Jim Schwerdfeger, Members of the IBT and members of WBCCI

The International Outreach committee, under the direction of International President Jim Schwerdfeger, began its work on July 5, 2015. The goal of this committee was to see if there was any interest in the formation of an overseas WBCCI unit or units.

Initially, contact was made with every overseas dealer of Airstreams. From those contacts, two responses were received. Several communications were exchanged but the basic message from both dealers was that until some benefit could be offered to overseas members, the dealers did not feel comfortable publicizing the club. Both realized the history of the club was important to some Airstream owners, but did not feel that this was enough to assist us in trying to attract members.

Emails have been sent to all present and past members of record of the Australia Unit as well as the Australian dealer. Responses have been received from a very limited number of the members but one of their main items of contention - as for all overseas members - is that there are no benefits for them as members. It was pointed out that they can have rallies and caravans on their own without having to pay WBCCI dues. In the USA and Canada there are discounts that are available yet these same discounts are not available to members in other parts of the world. I would suggest that the lines of communication be kept open in Australia as our WBCCI office receives inquiries periodically from Australian Airstream owners who are interested in membership in the organization.

Contact was made with European Airstream owners whose names were given to me by WBCCI members and by the WBCCI office in Jackson Center. From these contacts it was determined that there was a group of owners who were very interested in forming a WBCCI unit in Europe. One member of this group, Ian Jamieson, has been my main contact and has worked with Lori Plummer in the WBCCI office to fulfill all necessary requirements for a European Unit.

The constitution and bylaws of the WBCCI Europe Unit have been approved by the CBL committee and the unit has been granted a provisional charter by the Executive Board. Lori has facilitated the appropriate measures to allow overseas members to sign up on line while the ECC has helped the unit to set up their website as well as adding the unit to WBCCI.org.

I would like to thank President Jim Schwerdfeger for promoting the idea of an International Outreach Committee, the several members who offered their help on this committee and who supplied me with some of the contacts in overseas countries and Justin Humphreys

who allowed me to use his name as a form of reference when contacting overseas dealers. Thanks also go to Carolyn Beardshear and the ECC for helping to get the WBCCI Europe Unit on line and on WBCCI.org.

But most of all I want to thank two outstanding people. Stateside, I cannot thank Lori Plummer enough. Without her, this process would have taken so much longer to accomplish and would have been so much more frustrating.

In Europe, I want to thank the driving force behind this whole process - Ian Jamieson. Ian and his wife Ariane are full timers from the UK who are now spending time in the south of France. Ian has always had his paperwork ready, his thoughts organized and his lines of communication open. His enthusiasm is unlimited and he and his group are ready to become the WBCCI Europe Unit!

There is one action item: The WBCCI Europe Unit requests the approval of an official charter at this IBT meeting.

This concludes the work of the International Outreach Committee whose sole objective was to see if there was any interest in the formation of an overseas unit or units.

Thank you, President Schwerdfeger, for allowing me to serve.
