# Rose Bowl Parade Special Event Rally

This month, we have a spotlight on a special Airstream rally complete with pictures! Thanks to Joe and Gayle for sharing this super fun rally write up and pictures!

This was Gayle & my second trip to this magnificent Special Event Rally. This rally started on 12-28-2019 and ended on January 1<sup>st</sup>. I personally always enjoy traveling in the west. We have made many trips west from San Antonio.

Caution: This is a "dry camping" rally. Consideration and information is provided with this in mind so don't stay away because of it

We arrived a day early staying at the Fairplex KOA RV park in Pomona, California. The next morning we drove to the bullpen where we waited to be parked. The parking for this rally is on one of the parking lot for the Pasadena Community College. This location is a short walk to the parade site.

As always, it's a pleasure to be around other Airstreamers—greeting known friends and making new friends.



There are many events to attend during the rally. Last year we toured the floats. Just to see all the volunteers patiently decorating the floats. This is a "must see".



This year we attended the Equestfest which is a showcase for exceptional equestrian units with exquisite horses and talented riders performing drills and dances, trick riding and roping. Gayle and I especially enjoyed watching the Budweiser Clydesdales perform. The horses backed up to the show barn fence and then with the direction of the handler, both manually and orally calling each horse by name of which they responded by ear and physical movement; the horses moved from a 180 degree position to a left 90 position back to a 180 and then to a right 90 position. This was a requirement when Budweiser deliveries were made by wagon; this movement allowed road clearance so normal business could occur without road blockage.



Another event is the Bandfest which we again attended. From its beginning as a pre-recorded television show, to the exciting live event of today, Bandfest is showcase for outstanding marching bands and a celebration of music. This year's performances were live telecast. These marching bands come from all over the World. Besides California bands, we saw bands from

Baldwinsville, NY; Mayaguez, Puerto Rico; Hornbaek, Denmark; Antiguo Cuscatlan, El Salvador; Kingsport, Tennessee; Owasso, Oklahoma and

Eugene, Oregon. And this was only 1 of 3 performances. Now, when was the last time you saw a marching band with 27 tuba's? A marching band with several hundred members? The show is amazing and we highly recommend the bandfest.



This was the 131<sup>st</sup> Rose Parade. The Grand Marshals were Rita Moreno, Gina Torres, and Laurie Hernandez. The parade route is officially closed/opened on the 31<sup>st</sup> at noon; individuals/groups can come in and set up their space for watching the parade. It is



a "show" and goes through the New Year's Eve celebration—cots, tents, mattresses, fire pits, ice chests, chairs, ladders and anything one would need for securing a site and having fun. Our great Region 12 organizers purchase seats for our group in a grandstand; however, I am told the Airstreamers used to participate in the obtaining and reserving of their spaces throughout the night. The Mineola Nature Preserve on the Sabine River encompasses 2,911 acres located in Wood County, and is home to East Texas species of critters that can fly, walk, crawl, and slither, and home to more than 193 species of birds, numerous wildlife, buffalo, longhorn cattle, and a pristine wetlands environment.

The Waldo Way is a Grade A Raw Milk Dairy Farm. Our beautiful Guernsey Gold cows are raised on grass all year round and they are our partners in this business. The store features Guernsey rich, velvety golden milk, yogurt, butter and Kefir.

Mineola Historical Museum is staffed by enthusiastic historians, this free museum is located just one block from Mineola's main street.

Lake Country Playhouse is one of the longest running movie theaters in Texas, having been in operation since 1920. Despite its old-school looks and retro neon sign, this cinema plays first-run movies as well as community theater productions.

There is a small farmers market at the train depot in downtown Mineola every Saturday starting in May and continuing for as long as the weather holds out.
