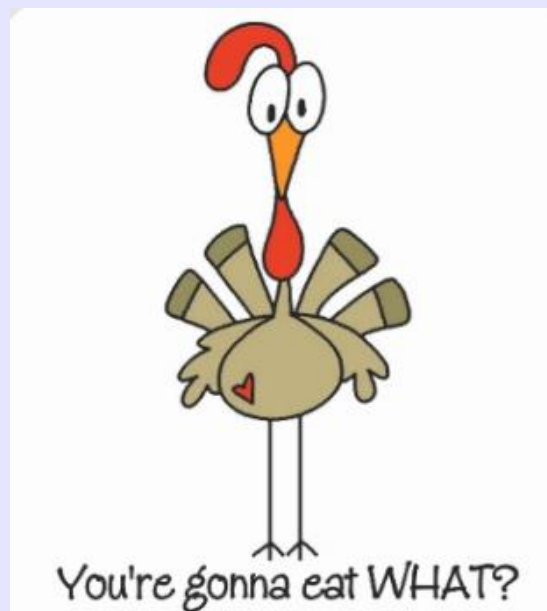
### Blood shot eyes casserole recipe

#### Ingredients

- 1 pound bag frozen, shredded hash browns
- 1 can cream of potato Soup
- 8 ounces sour cream
- 1.5 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 10 eggs
- 10 slices Canadian bacon
- salt & pepper
- Ketchup

#### Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
2. In a large bowl, mix hash browns, soup, sour cream, cheese, salt & pepper
3. Transfer to a 9 x 12 casserole dish
4. Use a spoon to make divots to place the Canadian bacon into.
5. Place bacon in the divots to form a bowl
6. Bake 25 minutes
7. Remove from oven and crack a egg in each Bacon divots/bowl you made.
8. Bake 30 minutes until egg whites are completely set.
9. Transfer some ketchup to a pastry bag with small tip to create the red of the eyes around the yolk.
10. Serve

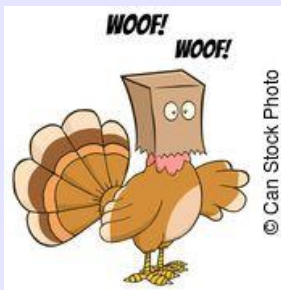
