TRIP TO THE KINZUA DAM AND SKYWALK—ALLEGHENY NATIONAL FOREST

We spent four days/three nights the last week of June camping at KOA-Kinzua East by Bradford PA. This site was picked because of its central location by the Kinzua Dam on the Allegheny River and proximity to Kinzua Bridge State Park. We found the area to offer interesting recreational activities as well as site seeing. Hiking the 1½ mile Rimrock Trail by the Kinzua-Wolf Run Marina was enjoyable both for the shaded trail, spectacular view of the Allegheny Reservoir, precipitous rock formations and diverse population of birds. Kayaking on the reservoir is





available at numerous coves: there are more

than 8 sites to put in boats. We kayaked on Sugar Run Bay right off of PA 312 north of PA 59. It's a wonderful bay with pretty vistas. While we were there we saw a nesting pair of Osprey that amazed us with their flight over the end of the bay. Close to the KOA where we stayed is the Timberdoodle Flats interpretive Trail. There are two trails through diverse habitat for many song birds. We spotted various warblers and other birds on the walks we made at the trail. The most spectacular site we visited was the Kinzua State Park. At the park was a train bridge that stood over 300 feet above the Kinzua Creek which was destroyed by a tornado in 2003. On the southern portion of the bridge 6 support towers remained intact. This section was converted into a "Skywalk" which visitors can now walk to the end and see the stream below and the towers broken by the tornado. At the end of the skywalk the floor is partially glassed in for an incredible view below the bridge which can be walked on if you dare. There is an interpretive center and various hiking trails down to the stream. This park would be a great place to view fall colors. We spent 2 ½ days exploring and realize that this area

President (filled by Julie Jansen in 2021)

- Presides at all meetings of the Local Club and Executive Board
- Enforces the Constitution and Bylaws
- Appoints all special committees and the Parliamentarian
- Has such powers and duties as normally pertain to the principal executive office

1st Vice President (filled by Cody Klingler in 2021)

- Attends all business meetings of the Local Club and the Executive Board.
- Shall assist the President.
- Assumes the duties of the President in the President's absence.
- Sets up the rallies for the next year when he/she will be President.

2nd Vice President (currently vacant in 2021)

- Attends all business meetings of the Local Club and the Executive Board
- Assists the President and the First Vice President
- Assumes the duties of the First Vice President in the absence of said officer
- Assumes the duties of the President in case of the absence of the President and the First Vice President
- Perform duties as assigned by the Executive Board.

3rd Vice President (currently vacant in 2021)

- Attends all business meetings of the Local Club and the Executive Board.
- Assists the President and the First Vice President and the Second Vice President.
- Assumes the duties of the Second Vice President in the absence of said officer.
- Assumes the duties of the First Vice President in the absence of the First Vice President and the Second Vice President.
- Assumes the duties of the President in case of the absence of the President and the First Vice President and the Second Vice President.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the Executive Board.
- Sees that supplies are transferred to the next Hosts and assure visitors and guests are chaperoned at Local Club activities.

<u>Secretary (filled by Vinny Rossitto in 2021)</u>

- Issues notices of all meetings of the Club and the Executive Board as prescribed in Article VI, Sections 1 and Article VIII, Section 2 of the Constitution and ARTICLE XIV, Section 1 of the Bylaws.
- Prepares an agenda of pending business for use by the presiding officer at each meeting.
- Coordinates with the Treasurer to maintain an accurate roster of paid-up members of the Local Club.
- Records and preserves the minutes of all official meetings of the Local Club and the Executive Board, and mail copies to the members of the Executive Board not more than fifteen (15) days following each meeting.
- Records the attendance of the officers and directors at each meeting and advise the presiding officer if a quorum is present.

Treasurer (filled by Craig Jansen in 2021)

- Maintains the financial records of the Local Club and receives all monies, as prescribed in international Bylaws, Article XVI Financial Management Sec. 12 – 13 and Policy, Financial Data Guidelines, and promptly deposits them in the bank previously chosen by the Executive Board.
- Notifies members of expiration of dues, issue receipts for dues paid through the Local Club and maintain an up-to-date roster of
 paid up members. Changes to this roster shall be shared with the Secretary, the Newsletter Editor, and the Membership Chairman.
 In addition, the Membership Chairman shall be notified of all members who have not paid their dues by October 15th in order that
 the membership chairman might assist the Treasurer in contacting those members to collect their dues prior to November 1st.
- Submits a full written report of finances to the Executive Board at each meeting. Each year a committee selected by the incoming President will audit the books and accounts. Before retirement, all books, monies and property of the Unit shall be delivered promptly to the incoming Treasurer.

Directors (currently two vacancies in 2021)

- Attends all meetings of the Local Club and Executive Board.
- Accepts special assignments as directed by the President. Additional duties may be to chair or be members of committees.

Well, after the almost 15 hours of Zoom video meetings and webinars I attended, spread out over four days, I'm here to bear witness to the fact that the "zoom zoom" is here to stay. Those Zoom meetings were conducted in lieu of the two (2) Region Officer Forums and the two (2) IBT meetings that were supposed to happen in Loveland, CO at this time. Hats off to the staff at HQ, our IT Committee and the Executive Committee for all of their efforts to make these meetings and the installation of the new IBT officers a success. It was a great accomplishment and all the meetings were well attended!

As I know many of your newsletter editors are preparing new editions, here is a quick update of the most important items from those meetings: Please share with your editors or incorporate into your President's Message as you see fit. Here we go....

#1-Qualification of Members For 5428 Against 169 Abstain 0

#2-Delegates Meeting For 5399 Against 198 Abstain 0

All three (3) of the Constitutional Amendments passed. There were a total of 5,597 votes cast from 94 of the 106 local clubs #3-Changing wording from Unit(s) to Local Club(s) For 5408 Against 124 Abstain 65

The 2020-2021 Slate of Officers and Members of the Nominating Committee were approved as submitted. At the IBT meeting, Incoming President Andy Selking named Immed. Past President Mona Heath as Chair of the Nominating Committee.

The Budget Committee presented a balanced budget that included a Dues Increase of \$10 per year. Both the Budget and the Dues Increase Motion were approved. The increase in dues was openly discussed at the Region Officers Forum prior to the IBT meeting and at the IBT meeting itself. There was a powerpoint presentation and several versions of a budget were presented for review at our Forum. This is the first dues increase to the membership in 10 years and will ensure that the Club is able to meet budgetary demands going forward. There will be information in the upcoming Blue Beret to support the decision. I was concerned at first. After review of the documentation provided, listening to the proposals and asking questions, I voted YES to the increase in dues. I believe it is in the best interests of the Club and its membership. I spoke again, several times, during the meetings of the importance of increasing member benefits. Other Officers, including members of the Executive Committee, are now echoing that and I believe we're on track to see tangible improvements coming in the months and years ahead. I will keep pushing.

Online Registration for the 2021 International Rally to be held in Lebanon, TN will open on August 5, 2020. Watch for more information in the upcoming Blue Beret. I will have the date on my calendar and will send out reminders to you all as we get closer to that date.

Both of the IBT meetings and the Region Officers Forums were streamed LIVE on the Club's YouTube Channel and can be found here. Proposed budgets and the powerpoint are also available there in the meeting of Thursday, June 25th. https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCM0W7edcbNd07Hehq2qyQmw

The Installation of Officers was also streamed LIVE, recorded and available through the same link.

One of the most interesting parts of the meetings was listening to Justin Humphries, VP of Sales for Airstream, Inc., provided a lengthy update. You can listen to it in the Executive Meeting of Wednesday, June 24th. After the initial downturn, sales are exploding! Industry wide, the towables are rebounding much faster than the big Class A coaches. This bodes well for Airstream and our Airstream Club! Our HQ reported a surge in new members as well after falling during the early period of COVID. It has been a difficult year but the future looks bright!

Just as in our Region, other Regions of the Club are reporting mixed results in schedules of upcoming rallies. While many events have cancelled, there are still many events on the calendars but caution was still the common theme. Check the schedule of events often for updates and keep an eye on the State guidelines as well. What may be on the schedule for upcoming months may be subject to constant update.

It was with great pleasure that I introduced the names of both RJ Marquette and Gary Russo as our Region's new VPs. I expressed my gratitude to them for volunteering. I also expressed my thanks to all our Region Officers and Chairs who have supported me and our great Region 2 this past year.
