

Tech tip:

This month's tip is a tire reminder. Watch age & condition of your wheels to avoid any headaches on the road. There is an ongoing debate on AIR Forum on tires regarding brands, maintenance, monitoring systems, etc. While I have no intention of wading into that pool, I wanted to remind everyone to be vigilant in tire maintenance. Simple rules: Check your tires before you head out. Tire pressure, condition, age, lug nut torque are all key factors in avoiding problems. Tire pressure monitoring systems (TPMS) have become standard equipment on new vehicles and trailers and they can sometimes help spot a problem before it gets ugly. Last year, I installed Goodyear Endurance tires prior to heading up to International in Salem just to play it safe. I use a Pressure Pro TPMS system to monitor the pressure in the tires. Even with those safeguards, I hit a road gator that sheared off one of the sensors, but it did not cause any damage to our rig. A blowout can tear up lines or valves or panels and result in some serious (\$\$\$\$) damage.
