Our on-line transaction payment system will be using PayPal which will allow club members to use their own personal PayPal accounts or a credit card for payment. It's taken a lot of hard work on Ed's part and this improvement puts us in a great position to more easily collect money for club activities. As a first step, we will soon begin to offer our club flags for sale on-line. Ed will be providing details on that and the new payment system in the near future.

you get a campsite, there will be a registration form available mid-February on Airforums, just search for **Canopener 2021**. This is a national joint rally sponsored by Airforums, the Southeastern Camping Unit and Arkansas Razorback Club of the WBAC. No membership of any group is required and there is no Rally fee.

For those arriving early, we will have Canopening activities from Dec. 30 – Jan 1. TECH STUFF

Levelmate Pro

This month I am going to review the **Level Mate Pro**, available here:

I know some of you have this so send me an email if you do not agree with anything. When we camp anywhere but the paved, parking lot campgrounds, the trailer is never level. Most of us started with the Lego style blocks that stack, requiring multiple trips from the truck to the trailer wheels to install more blocks, drive on them, check the level, etc. Reliable, works fine, but you better carry enough blocks and it may take some minutes to left-right level. Some have moved to the Anderson-style level that you just drive on and can raise your trailer up to 4 inches on one side, but you still must get out of the truck, check the level and try again.

OK, enter technology. The Levelmate Pro is a battery operated device that mounts on a left-right or fore-aft wall in your trailer and communicates via Bluetooth with your phone.

Note that this is now generation 2 with an on-off switch and a settable interval for automatic shutdown. Apparently Gen 1 ate batteries quickly. Still best to turn it off when not needed.

You install the device on a wall, level out your trailer the old-fashioned way, pair your device with your phone, bring up the App and tell the App that your trailer is now level. With that calibration it will now tell you with red-green and O.1 inch increments, how far you are from level, left-right and fore-aft. It also has a feature that marks hitch position so you can quickly return the trailer to the level you were before unhitching.

So here is how I used it with Anderson-style levelers. Get to your campsite, turn on the device and bring up the App. Set the levelers at the tires, get in the truck and just back up onto the levelers until the App tells you if you are left-right level. Just about one minute

for the whole exercise of leveling the trailer! Way cool!

I did not find fore-aft leveling very useful as after you have disconnected, you are at the tongue jack and since I have a level mounted there, I just look at the bubble level when I am raising or lowering the tongue. Nevertheless, this is a useful and handy device.

One footnote because I cannot seem to master all of the capabilities of my phone. I found that my phone would not Bluetooth (BT) connect with this device or my Victron dongles when I was in a region with no cell service. BT is not supposed to use cell or Wi-Fi service. I found some settings hidden in a menu for connecting to devices that needed to be enabled, despite the fact that BT worked fine when I did have cell service. Enabled those setting and my BT connected.
