I have stayed in contact with our county officials this past month. They feel comfortable we will have the festival in October. So, we are planning another great year for October 16-18 2020...." Please join members of the Southeastern Camping, Carolinas Airstream, South Carolina Coastal, Piedmont NC, Florida, and other Airstream Clubs from Region 3 and beyond for the Carolina BalloonFest Rally in Statesville, NC October 16-18, 2020. We will have parking convenient to the entrance to the festival grounds.

Anyone who desires to attend should e-mail Al Waschka #1322 (awaschka@bellsouth.net) for the link and password for our exclusive **WBAC BalloonFest Rally RV Parking Application**. We will have exclusive access to sign up for parking until the end of May. After that it will be first come-first served. The schedule is available at: http://www.carolinaballoonfest.com/.

This will be a no-frills rally with no rally fee. We attempt to plan our happy hours and meals around the festival events which requires some flexibility as the event timing is dictated by weather conditions. Note:

- 1. Reservations are not refundable, but the festival has committed to support transfer of a reservation to another person as needed.
- 2. This is boondock-style camping. Arrive full of water, batteries charged, and holding tanks empty! Generators are allowed and pets are OK in the camping area. There will be food trucks on site. Exit and re-entry are possible, but not convenient.

We will have access to sign up before the general public. In order to guarantee a space with the club, our applications and deposits will have to be received by the end of May

Sequel to Cellular

I wrote a recent article on cellular and boosters. In preparing that article, I found a website <u>www.rvmobileinternet.com</u> that is a good resource for guides, testing, and general info about being connected on the road. Although there is good free content, a membership fee allows you access to all of their content and there is a ton of useful stuff. In addition they have cooperating vendors with discounts that could allow you to recoup your first year's fee.

After considerable research, I decided to buy A Poynting MIMO antenna, a Pepwave MkII mobile router, and thick wall aluminum tube for my A-frame mount. Why, do you ask? First, I wanted an arrangement that allows me to have internet via Wi-Fi or cellular. For example, even at James Island this year their Wi-Fi was on the fritz (technical term) and my cellular connection allowed us to seamlessly stay connected. The antenna I purchased is the latest in high-gain, omnidirectional with a frequency band that covers everything, including future 5G. The mobile router is powered by 12vdc from my battery box, contains 2 SIM slots for 2 different cellular providers, and will also connect to 2.4 or 5.0 GHz Wi-Fi. I prefer a pole mount that I take down when we travel and erect when parked....no holes in my roof.

Some suggest that an Airstream shields the signal coming from the router outside to the computer inside, not so. I get a very strong signal and was streaming a Britbox show over cellular with no problem. This arrangement gives me flexibility for future upgrades, always at a cost, at the price of a bit more complexity than plug and play. But, it is not hard to learn how to connect your network to the cellular or campground Wi-Fi.

My testing has shown that perhaps the most complicated element is obtaining a cellular provider. Cell service for data is not inexpensive and I found that streaming 1 hour of video used over 2G of data. The website above has a good, current listing of cellular provider options for road warriors, but you can do it much cheaper if all you need is email or other low data needs. It seems that the wireless companies have discovered that unlimited data plans are a revenue treasure trove. In the end, you must decide where you will be camping, how much data you need, and how much you are willing to pay if you want cellular internet. I am currently using a medium priced Cricket data plan (AT&T network) and a low cost, low data US Mobile plan (T-Mobile network) for backup. Everything is working as I had hoped. I have simplified the decision process for brevity so if you head down this path do not hesitate to contact me at <u>LSBRODSKY@earthlink.net</u>.


