

Background:

Roughly one year ago, our new Club website (airstreamclub.org) went live with dedicated areas focused on Current Members, New Members and an interactive Club-wide Event map showing all Club rallies, caravan and special events. In addition to a more modern design, the new website was designed to be easily accessible by desktop computers as well as tablets and smartphones. The launch of our new website was the first of a three-phase project rollout:

- Phase 1: Launch new Club website (done!).
- Phase 2: Replace the aging membership database used by our corporate office to track all attributes of members, Club leadership roles, membership preferences, Big Red Number tracking, Caravans, etc. This phase is going live in mid May 2020; this summer.
- Phase 3: Implement a member-only "Self Service Portal" that allows member-only access to benefits, member profile updates, etc.

Member Self-Service Portal:

Beginning in mid-July, all members will be able to access a personalized "Self Service Portal" on the airstreamclub.org website.

- Access to update your profile (photo, address, email and other contact information).
- Access to member-only benefits such as the Harvest Host discount, Blue Beret magazine, detailed Courtesy Parking information, Membership list, etc.
- Simplified annual membership renewal.

More information on the Self-Service Portal will be emailed to all active members in mid-July plus in future issues of the Blue Beret.

TECH STUFF

Seat Cushions

Are your seat cushions a pain in the rear? We have found that although there is a plush feel to the cushions when you first sit on them, if you sit for a long time, as in reading or watching TV, then the cushions really do not provide adequate support. Yes, they are a pain in the rear.


Recently there was a thread on Airforums that I decided to mimic, replacing the bottom cushion foam with something firmer.

This is what the supplier, www.foambymail.com says about Lux High Quality foam: As a durable foam, Lux HQ foam is a supportive and cushioning solution made with a higher density than other types. Toward the firmer end of the foam spectrum, Lux HQ foam is known for providing excellent quality with a high degree of support for applications with moderate, everyday use. Actively used seating cushions, benches, and high-grade bedding are produced with Lux HQ, as are recreational products like gardening, kneeling and camping pads for customers wanting superior quality and firmness. This type of foam is ideal for any application where a firm cushion is required. For my 25' trailer, seats only, I needed a full sheet of foam and about 12' of Dacron fiberfill batting to cover the foam. The batting provides a smoother finish, is cooler to sit on, and helps slipping the cover over the cushion.

Take the old foam out and use it as a template to mark the new foam. The first pic is the sheet of foam, the second pic is a marked up piece. You cut the foam with a cheap electric carving knife, with the foam supported on a table or bench. Then you cut the batting with a scissors to cover the top, front edge, and bottom in one piece. Use 3M 77 spray adhesive to attach the batting to the foam. The third pic shows the batting on the foam. After a few minutes the adhesive is dry and you stuff the foam/batting back into the cover. Presto!

Total time for this project is about 3.5 hours, total cost about \$250 including a cheap electric carving knife. Now we are ready for some lengthy periods of sitting!

After 13 years full timing in their Airstream, **Jim and Debbie #4822** are building a house!

They decided to finally build their dream home after living thirteen years in their 188sf Airstream tiny home (a 2005 25' International). They signed a contract in January with Deltec Homes of Asheville. While their planned home was in production, COVID-19 created bedlam with commerce in our state. The Deltec production line stopped for a few weeks while management and work teams gauged the needed protections for their workers. Fortunately for Jim and Debbie, the precast basement walls producer and Deltec both were able to make the scheduled deliveries.

From breaking ground late March, Jim and Debbie have quickly gained a dried-in house with HVAC and plumbing rough-ins complete and electrical within a couple of days of completion. Backfill and carport foundations were completed last week. The house is ready for siding, roofing, and insulation and nearly ready for sheetrock in less than ten weeks from start.

Jim and Debbie say the building process has been greatly eased by these two things: a considerate and experienced local general contractor (GC) and spring season activity plans cancelled. They had a pretty good lead on the GC and felt fortunate he was available for their tight build schedule. The cancellation of planned travels due to COVID lockdown also meant they had uninterrupted time to deliberate upon, and be present for, the ten thousand and one decisions about the house.

All of you who've remodeled or built your home know well how memorable the experience is, regardless of whether it went seamlessly or haywire at times. This one is perhaps especially memorable for Jim and Debbie because it was nearly the only thing they had on their plates at the time. It's not over yet, not by a long shot, but building a home during the COVID-19 lockdown was a welcome, if intense, diversion for them. Sometimes things just work out well, eh?

THE ROAD AHEAD: A LETTER FROM AIRSTREAM'S CEO

Jun 11, 2020

As I've watched the events of the last two weeks unfold, I've wrestled with how to respond. I resisted the urge to simply react, to post about our horror and outrage at the killing of George Floyd, choosing rather to take the time to figure out what concrete actions we can take to catalyze real change.

The killing of George Floyd, Ahmaud Arbery, Breonna Taylor, and many other Black people has rightfully brought an intense focus to the issues of social injustice and racial inequity, and also much-needed clarity about how Airstream can be part of the solution. Though Airstream is a small company, we're a big brand, and I feel both the undeniable responsibility to continue to use our voice for good, and optimistic that we can actually make a difference.

Airstream was founded to inspire people to connect with each other and enjoy the outdoors. We know that, all too often, the prejudices and inequities that pervade society as a whole also keep people of color from feeling at ease in these natural spaces. So what can we do?

- First, we can support those organizations whose aim is to combat inequities in our criminal justice system. To that end, we are making a multi-year financial commitment to the non-profit Equal Justice Initiative, whose work is at the front lines of challenging racial and economic injustice, and to protecting basic human rights for the most vulnerable people in American society.
- Second, we are listening to people of color in the outdoor and camping space through feedback sessions. This is the next step in our important work to learn how Airstream can positively impact change and better understand how we can create a more welcoming and inclusive environment in the outdoors.
- And finally, in addition to conducting justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion training for our employees, we are listening to and learning from all Airstream associates who may have experienced discrimination so that we can better understand how those forces manifest themselves in our local community and our ability to counter them.

As calls for real, systemic reform grow louder around the nation and the world, we are hopeful that this is the time for meaningful, positive, and lasting change so that all people can enjoy a life free from injustice and inequality. We know we have work to do.

Be well, be safe, and be compassionate.
