# GREAT TIMES AT AIRSTREAM INC.

Without the International Rally this summer all International Airstream Club meetings were on Zoom/You Tube this past week. The executive board meeting had a surprise participant in Justin Humphreys, VP of Marketing of Airstream, Inc.

Justin had an optimistic outlook about Airstream in these uncertain times. He noted that the RV industry is doing very well across the board with people wanting to camp in self-contained RVs vs vacation in motels. Here are a few bullet points that I took away from his presentation.

- Prior to COVID, Airstream was building 85 trailers monthly in their brand-new production facility.
- March/April, with only on-line sales and a closed production factory, Airstreams were still selling at a rate double that of corporate projected expectations during the COVID restrictions.
- May broke their all-time sales records.
- June was being estimated to break May's record by 50%.
- Inventory throughout the USA has become very scarce so production has been stepped up with hopes to address the backlog.
- 50% of new Airstreams purchasers were first time RV owners. This is the largest ever percentage in this category.
- Touring van production is being moved to a much larger facility, that of the old trailer assembly building.
- Mercedes chassis supply line problems have been resolved.

Lori Plummer, WBCCI's Corporate Manager, suspected that the increase in sales may be responsible for a much larger number of requests in Club membership during May and June. Great news for our club! ~


