#### KAREN'S HAM AND SWISS MINI'S ~ Karen Freed

1 1/2 to 2 lbs Thin sliced ham 3/4 to 1lb sliced Swiss cheese 36 small Potato Rolls found at Walmart bakery

- 2 Tbsp Worcester Sauce
- 2 Tbsp Dijon Mustard
- 2 Tbsp poppy seeds
- 2 sticks of butter

4 Tbsp Brown sugar

Cut rolls and layer the ham and swiss cheese inside rolls, close sandwich and place in pan side by side in un-greased pan. Put in as many as you can.

Put the rest of the ingredients in a sauce pan and heat on low

When butter has melted pour sauce over all the rolls. It doesn't take a lot for each roll. Estimate would be 1Tbsp per roll.

Cover with tin foil and bake 15min 350° Uncover rolls and bake 9 min longer

Seems to me you can't get all the rolls in one pan, but maybe you can squeeze them in:) I actually used two pans. Serve warm......enjoy, and let me know how they turned out and if everyone liked them :)
