JULY 30 RALLY PLANNED , WHETHER OR NOT

At this time, the IRISH FEST RALLY, scheduled for Thursday, July 30th to Sunday, August 2nd in Waterloo, IA is still a go. Information obtained from Hosts Norman and Linda Beu indicated that the Irish Fest Committee will decide by July 1st whether the celebration will proceed, or not. If the 6-foot social distancing or other restrictions are still in effect, indications are that the celebration will be cancelled. There are already problems with the entertainment, since a number of the acts come from Ireland and travel restrictions have taken a toll in that regard. Two years ago Norm was able to get discounted tickets and plans to do so again this year, assuming the festival occurs. When contacting Norm, you must let him know if you plan to attend the celebration in downtown Waterloo. Norm will obtain the required tickets and you will need to reimburse him, either in person when arriving at the rally or by mail if you do not attend. He is good enough to obtain and pay for the tickets, in advance out of his own pocket, and **MUST** be reimbursed, whether you attend, or not.

Norm and Club President John Heckman have discussed the rally and decided that, should the Irish Fest be cancelled, we will still have a July 30 - August 2 Iowa Club Rally at the Antique Acres rally site north of Cedar Falls, IA. So, at this time, there are plans to gather for a rally of one type, or the other, on July 30th. Hope to see you at Antique Acres. It has been a long time!
