

For example, what modifications have you made or had done to your Airstream? Something simple like installing an extra shelf, replacing furniture with something that works better for you, etc.



APPETIZERS AND SNACKS

Beef Jerky

1-1/2 lbs. top round steak 1-1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. garlic salt 1/4 tsp. pepper

MICROWAVE:

Select lean steak and trim all excess fat from steak. Partially freeze steak for easy slicing. Cut steak lengthwise with grain into 3/8-inch slices for chewy slices or cut across grain for more tender slices.

Combine garlic salt, salt and pepper; sprinkle over sliced meat. Arrange 4 to 6 slices at a time on microwave roasting rack in 12×8 -inch baking dish. Microwave, (full power) covered with paper towel 2-1/2 to 3 minutes or until slices are browned and slightly dried, blotting moisture off surface with paper towel occasionally. Turn slices over. Microwave (full power) covered with paper towel 1 to 1-1/2 minutes or until meat has a dry appearance and bends without breaking. Allow to dry on paper towel until crisp-dry. Store in a cool, dry place.

CONVENTIONAL RANGE:

Place the strips on a wire rack in an oven at 225°F or higher. Leave the oven door partially open so that the moisture can escape and thus dry the product. When the product has been dried (approximately 65 percent moisture loss after 8 to 10 hours), remove from the oven and store in a cool, dry place.

Over 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " of rain so far...

Life has been interesting lately to say the least. We were hoping to go to Bear Head Lake State Park over Memorial Day weekend, but that's not happening now. We are hoping to go camping at William O'Brien State Park in June. Even made a reservation! At long as the State Parks open up to camping in June, we'll make it. Kay has been busy getting Little Girl (Airstream) ready for her first outing - cleaning, stocking, sanitizing the water system, etc. I installed the latches for the rear bumper cover, so the bumper repair is 100% complete now. The dent repair is still waiting for warmer weather. I want a nice warm sunny day, so the aluminum is warm.

On the plus side, the house and yard have gotten more attention this spring that the last several years put together. We broke down and cleaned the pond, and finally found all the places in the stream and waterfall where it was losing water. We planted the back third of the yard with bee friendly seed. Lots of clover and other low to the ground flowering plants as well as some grass seed. Will go with the sections of the back and side yard that already have a fair amount of clover. We replaced the siding on the second-floor gables. We had a new white scalloped picket fence installed in the front yard and up one side. In hindsight, we should have paid someone to replace the siding and done the fence installation ourselves... We have replacement siding for the first floor on order and hope to get it in a few weeks. We are replacing the old cedar siding on the front of the house. The sides and back were vinyl sided many years ago. We are trying to make the house as maintenance free as possible now a days, so the front will also be vinyl sided.

Since we don't have many Club things to talk about, I thought I'd start a series of articles about Little Girl and her refurbishment. She's a 1972 31ft Sovereign.

She was in pretty rough shape when we bought her in Alabama and brought her home.



The door is taped shut and she was sporting a house-hold door knob (which put a nice dent in the side of her when the door was opened).

None of the electrical worked, so jury-rigged running and taillights were needed. Gorilla tape holds really well!

Also hard to get off...

We discovered carb cleaner works well to remove the residue.



We built a temporary shelter for her and put her up on blocks in our back yard. She was up on the blocks for 4 years.

We did find some interesting things while working on her. One was a snakeskin in the water heater, which is why we think we did not find any mice. Another one was a large paper wasp nest inside the door skins next to the doorknob. When we took the cover off the old roof A/C, we found several wasp nests on one side of the a/c and mub dauber nests on the other side. I guess that had a mutual understanding of staying on their own side... Fortunately, all of the nests were no longer active.

In the next installment, we will start putting her back together.
