Amending the Constitution

The International Board of Trustees Virtual Meeting was held on June 24, 2020. Several changes to the WBCCI By-Laws were adopted. Article IV, Membership and Membership Privileges and Policies 4.9.1

As a result, we have been requested to amend our constitution.

I plan to amend our constitution, Article III section 8, and hold a full membership vote at our October business meeting. As per our Constitution, I will send the amended constitution out about twenty days prior to the meeting. I ask our regular members who plan not to attend the October meeting to vote by email. I will accept email voting (at an email address to be announced) from the time I send the amended constitution out till the end of day of Thursday prior to the meeting. Those in attendance at the meeting (who did not vote via email) will be permitted to vote at the meeting. Hopefully with 2/3 of the vote, we will successfully amend our constitution and satisfy the IBT'S requirements.

We will also be voting in the incoming 2021 officers in this manner. Please remember one vote per membership number.


See blue text below for upcoming constitution change

Article III, Section 8

In those cases of co-ownership of a hard-sided recreational vehicle manufactured by Airstream, Inc., the rights and privileges of membership shall be deemed to include the spouses or partners of such co-owners but collectively such co-owners, spouse or partner shall each possess one vote except such co-owners, spouse or partner who each pay International and Unit/Club dues to this Unit/Club shall each have one vote. A co-owner is defined as one of two WBCCI members who own a single Airstream recreational vehicle.
