### August 2020 President's Report

Airstream's 2021 travel trailer line is now built with Transcore Composite Flooring, a proprietary composite formed from waterproof, inert recycled glass and polypropylene. Developed by Ridge Corporation, Transcore is a state-of-the-art composite engineered for firmness under foot, strength, and screw retention. Ridge's manufacturing process is second to none and produces a premium product making it a perfect fit for the Airstream travel trailer line.

#### **Why Composite?**

The manufacturing process utilizes heat bonding instead of adhesives, which results in all the layers fusing together as one complete piece. The new Composite material has more waterproof qualities compared to a wood floor typically found in most RVs today. This means it's less susceptible to leaks, inhibits mold, mildew, insect infestation, and water damage in the unlikely event of a leak.

Compared to a wood floor that is made up of multiple sections, the one-piece composite design means that it is less likely to squeak or make noise over time.

Joe promised to help us learn the ins and outs of pulling and camping. We made arrangements to purchase her Airstream. Had to buy a new truck. The one we had was not powerful enough to pull a 30 footer through the mountains.

We are now the proud owner of an Airstream, with no camping experience, planning a shake down trip in a couple of weeks with the Joe and Mary. Mother nature changed our plans. At that time we lived on the water in Wilmington and a hurricane had its sights on us. With little preparation we left for an inland park near Myrtle Beach. The forecast had the storm coming ashore just north of Wilmington. That night we got the bad news that Myrtle Beach was now front row center for the storm. What a shake down trip!

Joe and Mary accompanied us on our first rally The Swiss Festival in Sugarcreek OH. What a great time. After that they accompanied us on our first caravan, Lewis and Clark. In the last 9 years we have enjoyed 12 national caravans and one Piedmont club caravan and looking forward to many more. Gone to Texas in 2021 and Sho-Me the Ozarks in 2022.

We are frequently asked what is our favorite caravan. It's not possible to pick a favorite. They are all great. The most adventurous probably would be North to Alaska and Viking Trail. They are both don't miss caravans. Because of the structure of the Airstream caravans, ran by volunteer members without compensation, the value can't be beat. We have traveled the same routes with caravans run by commercial operations and other travel clubs. Our club caravans offer more activities included in the kitty fee at about 40 percent less cost.

To repeat Mike's suggestion. Get on a caravan list. It will be very rewarding. Guaranteed!
