Region 7 Tall Ships Rally Duluth, Minnesota July 24 – 30, 2013

Needless to say every campground near Duluth was jammed for the Tall Ships Festival, including the Buffalo Valley Campground which had agreed to accommodate the rally. Airstreams were packed in as best they could be, 2 or 3 to a campsite, but there was plenty of water and electricity and the spacious *Buffalo Junction* party room for rally activities.

Airstreamers went "first class", beginning the rally by watching the Parade of Tall Ships into Duluth Harbor from the harbor tour boat. It took two bus trips to ferry everyone from the campground to the harbor; those in the first busload

found a comfortable wall to sit on to await the second bus! (Between construction on I-35 and the crowd in town for the Tall Ships festival traffic was terrible!)

The harbor tour boat was **the** place to watch the parade. The shoreline was lined with people—an estimated quarter million visitors the first day of the festival.

The rally boasted a full schedule of activities, including all three days of the Festival—shuttle busses provided—a tour of Duluth and the Harrington Arts Center (a.k.a "the Accordion Museum"), fish fry at the Buffalo House, dinner at the Spirit Mountain Chalet, and scenic ski lift ride up Spirit Mountain. The rally fee also included a tour of the historic Glensheen Mansion and Split Rock lighthouse.. And as a bonus, the Tall Ships were departing Duluth for their next stop in Chicago the day we toured the mansion, so we had a great vantage point to watch them stand out to sea!

Crock Pot Breakfast Casserole (As served at Tall Ships Rally)

By Region 7 President Linda Agre

Prep time: 15 minutes (30 for me) Serves 6-8 (I think more like 12-15)

Spray Crock Pot

Ingredients

12 eggs

1 cup milk

2 pounds hash brown potatoes (If using frozen cook 8-9 hours instead of 7-8)

1 pound bacon (or sausage or ham) cooked, drained and cut into pieces

1/2 cup diced onions

3 cups shredded cheddar cheese

1/4 teaspoon dry mustard

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

1 tsp. salt & 1/2 teaspoon pepper

May add green peppers and anything else you wish

- 1. Beat eggs well
- 2. Beat in milk, garlic powder, mustard, salt & pepper. Set aside
- 3. Layer potatoes (I suggest to season each potato layer to taste--a small pinch of slat & pepper and sprinkle 1/3 of the onions
- 4. Next sprinkle 1/3 of the bacon, sausage
- 5. Last top with 1 cup of cheese
- 6. Repeat this layering 2 more times to have a total of 3 layers-- ending with cheese
- 7. Take your egg mixture and pour over layers.
- 8. For refrigerated hash browns, cook 6 7 hours on low. For frozen hash browns, cook for 7 8 hours on low or until eggs are set
