# Memories of TWENTY FIVE YEARS AGO By Bard Fuller

I find myself emptying out my late father's house in these quarantine days. He was a product of the Depression era and rarely threw anything out. Rummaging through his attic I came across the Old North



Church used on the Cape Cod Unit float at the Amherst Massachusetts International WBCCI Rally. What great memories and stories this attic has to tell. Among the piles of paperwork were pictures and a Grand Sweepstakes trophy given to the Cape Cod Unit for its overall first place in unit participation, float construction and theme demonstration.

John Fuller, a past Cape Cod Unit president and past Region 1 president, did much of the ground work

in the 1980's with the University Conference Services at UMASS to bring WBCCI to its first international rally in the New England states. Although it was not until the construction of the Mullings Conference Center on campus in the early 1990's was the rally realized due to the efforts of then Region President Rod Dole and International President Gene Stubbs.



In those years the international rallies were quite different. Attendance was over 2,000 rigs yet there was no air conditioning or electricity available for your



week plus encampment. We all daisy-chained water connections after tapping into local fire hydrants. There were fewer seminars and a great emphasis placed on the



Teen Queen contest (a beauty/talent show of the units' teens), bulletin/ unit locator board contest, skit contest and a grand parade on the Fourth

of July through the city streets around the campus.

John was the parade chairman for the Cape Cod Unit in 1995. He prebuilt a nearly 10-foot-high Old North Church and a 9-foot Airstream which he brought with him to the rally site. The detailed scale model



of the Old North Church was quite impressive. It



included all the brick work that was photo produced to be scale specific to match the real church in Boston's North End. There were two blinking lights in the belfry indicating "One if by Land, Two if by Airstream". Riding on the float were unit members

Russ Sterns and Dick Brocket dressed in their minuteman apparel with their steadfast muskets. The marching contingent was over 40 members of the

Cape Cod Unit following the float through the campus wearing matching period appropriate costumes. All this to celebrate Wally Byam's birthday followed by a picnic on the campus lawn for the entire 5,000 plus participants at the rally. All these great memories are resurfacing from my attic treasure finds.


