

Alexandria, Va. Saturday, Dec. 7, 2019

The meeting began at approximately 2:30 p.m. at the home of Ed and Beth Jones in Alexandria, VA, where members had gathered for the NORVA Christmas Party. Tom thanked Ed and Beth for a very well done party and recognized

done party and recognized distinguished guests Eric and Norma Colby, former and future Airstreamers, and Ulrich Llovd and Elaine former Airstreamers. New members Tom and Susie Haymarket, Hedges, VA. who are waiting for their 27foot Globetrotter to be built at Airstream, Jackson Center, Ohio, were also introduced.

- The following 21 eligible voting **NORVA** members present were: Kevin and Jane Quinn, Doug and Susan Anderson, Larry and Sun Riley, Jackson and Mary Ann McBroom, Pete Elizabeth West, Kathy and Edgar Simmons, Cathy and Lew Brodsky, Tom and Susie Hedges, Tom Carmichael, Ed and Beth Jones, and Gerry and Patsy Nagel.
- President Carmichael presented new badges to Gerry

Nagel, 1st Vice President; Jackson McBroom, 2d Vice President; Patsy Nagel, Recording Secretary; Kevin Quinn Treasurer; Gary Shepard (not present), Membership; and Lew Brodsky, Newsletter Editor. Tom stated that badges are needed for Beth Jones, Legislative Director; and Ed Jones, Parliamentarian and will follow-up.

Old Business

• There was a motion to dispense with reading the minutes of the last business meeting; they were published in September 2019 NORVA News. This motion was seconded and all voted in favor.

Officer Reports

• Kevin Quinn, Treasurer, presented a chart showing the cash flow and budget summary for 2019.

Gerry Nagel, 1st Vice President, discussed the upcoming rally schedule. A "Meet and Greet," geared for new members is planned for Feb. 29 at a restaurant to be determined (later in December, space was reserved at Golden Corral in Manassas, Va.). Tom noted that NORVA gained 15 new member

households in 2019 and that we want to get the new members active in the club. The Breakout and Maintenance rally will be April 24-26, 2020, at the Small Country Campground in Louisa, VA. Tom stated that plans are to rent a cabin for DJ Mastin, RV Maintenance Technician, who will be the speaker for the weekend. Pete West spoke about the Spring Rally that he is hosting May 7-10,

2020. Rally campsite is Candy Hill Campground, Winchester, VA. Planned events include the men viewing an antique fire truck restoration shop, a ladies shopping trip to Purcellville culminating with dinner at the West residence on Friday. A Winchester Walking Tour and visit to the Patsy Cline house, wine tasting, and evening excursion to a Drive-In theater is planned for Saturday. Because of limited space, it was proposed that the rally initially be promoted first to NORVA members, before attendance from other Virginia clubs is encouraged. Gerry Nagel updated that the Tidewater Club was originally hosting the July rally but their plans changed and now the July rally is TBD. Gerry also noted that the "Old Fiddlers Convention" in August will be the last one

with Betty and Junior Patton as hosts in Galax. Gary Shepard is looking at locations to park the Airstreams in Shepherdstown, W.Va., for the October "Silver in the City" rally. In November 2020, the Tidewater club will probably be hosting the Urbanna Oyster Festival Rally. Tom

concluded the rally discussion by stating we want to focus on "getting hooked up" with NORVA members and get them more involved.


- Jackson McBroom, 2d Vice President, discussed leading a "U.S. Presidents of Ohio" caravan. Other venues to be visited include the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and the Football Hall of Fame. The duration will be 14 to 16 days. Details will be finalized and a future newsletter article will be prepared to promote it. Proposed caravan title is "Presidents' Homes of Ohio Plus"
- Lew **Brodsky** the gave membership report for Gary Shepard. In 2018 we had 49 member

New Business

- Lew Brodsky surfaced an issue that a NORVA member who serves as Region 3 President, or as an International Officer, receives the honor of free life membership in NORVA, but there is no provision for extending the privilege to the surviving spouse of the honoree. He proposed amending the Executive Board Policies to correct this problem. He volunteered to draft an amendment and distribute it to the membership for a vote. (See sidebar at right).
- President Tom Carmichael stated that we needed to vote on

Executive Board Policies Amended

At the NORVA Business Meeting on Dec. 7, 2019, a motion passed to amend Paragraph 5 of the Club's Executive Board Policies. The proposed amendment was distributed to the membership for an e-mail vote in mid December. Twenty-two votes were cast and the amendment passed unanimously. The revised paragraph is as follows, with the added words shown in bold typeface:

5. Life Membership: All "Regular" members of the Northern Virginia Airstream Club ("NORVA") who serve as a Region 3 President or International Executive Board Officer shall be granted honorary "Life" membership in NORVA. This privilege conveys free annual membership in NORVA and all privileges (holding an office, voting) associated with being a regular member. In the event of the death of the honoree, a surviving spouse will continue to receive the privileges associated with honorary life membership in NORVA until his/her death or remarriage.



NORVA's original charter was issued in 1969. The Club celebrated its 50th Anniversary in 2019.

households; in 2019 we have 64 member households. He noted that for inclusion in the International Directory, November 15 was the deadline for dues payment to join or continue membership. Of the 64 members we look at a possible loss of 5 members not renewing as their dues have not been received.

Lew Brodsky gave the newsletter report. All 11 issues were published (two months were combined in the summer, as is the custom). Production costs are down by putting out the Newsletter via email. A hard copy is provided to new members the first month along with a copy to Airstream of Virginia. He anticipates

election of Jackson McBroom as 2d Vice President. who was appointed in the absence of a volunteer candidate. and has been acting in that capacity. A vote was taken. Jackson was unanimously voted in as 2d Vice President.

- Kathy Simmons had brought the original 1969 NORVA Charter and it was shown to the attendees.
- The meeting adjourned.

Happy New Year!

I owe a huge "thank you" to NORVA club members for being my loyal customers and sharing my name with others when you travel. Referrals are the core of my business and I am lucky to have so many of you supporting me.

I am excited to announce I am an authorized dealer for the Micro Air Easy Start product (https://www.microair.net/collections/easystart-soft-starters). I was invited by Micro Air to represent them at the Region 3 Alumalina Rally last October where R3 President John Leake and his team put on a great rally in the North Carolina mountains.

In this column, I want to share some thoughts about the season. As winter roars in, you should have some key things in mind, and I don't mean your travel itinerary for 2020! I'm talking about winter storage. It's never fun to close up our "home away from home," but preparedness is key. The first thing—the biggest thing really—is that every rig exposed to outside cold should be winterized. We have all heard the horror stories of busted plumbing. I can assure you: less-than-easy repairs result from the damage. So here are a few tips and tricks that can help you avoid a dents in your wallets and get you back on the road faster next spring.

Batteries

If you have a trailer, remove the batteries and keep them connected to a trickle charger, or make sure they remain



charged if you are going to leave them in the trailer. Dead batteries will freeze and bust the casing. That means you will have to replace them. This goes for AGM batteries too. I recommend checking your batteries every other week,. But be careful...if temperatures dip too low (below 20 degrees) you may need to check them weekly.

With motorhomes, make sure to charge the chassis battery and start up the generator to keep your batteries charged.

If leaving your trailer plugged in for the winter make sure to check water levels monthly if you have flooded deatteries.

If you

are fortunate enough to have your coach

stored at home, remember that it can become a second home if power is lost in the house. As long as your batteries are charged you can run your furnace to stay warm.

Snow

Something else to worry about, especially on older trailers, is snow load. Virginia snow usually doesn't get very deep, but if winter really shows up, and snow gathers on the roof more than 18 inches, try to brush it off. Do it safely with a snow broom or soft bristle brush.

Be careful if you decide to use a ladder! Let's not try climbing on a snow-covered roof, okay friends? It is VERY dangerous and you wouldn't want to crush the roof by stepping where you shouldn't!

Solar panels do not work when they are snow covered. Consider this if you're depending on solar to keep your batteries charged. After a snow storm, you can very carefully use a ladder and long-handled floor broom to pull snow off the panels. This will restore their electrical output.

Heat Pumps

For those lucky enough to be camping during the winter and using your heat pumps, there are several things to consider

The heat pump is only efficient when it's around 40 degrees or above outside. Below that, the system will not work properly and you will have to run the furnace.

Newer trailers and motorhomes (built 2012 or later) use a puck-style drain system on the heat pump. When the system condensates and/or shuts down, it will drain off the roof. Don't be alarmed with the run-off while using your heat pump.

I hope that some of these tips will help you feel better while you countdown the days until you de-winterize and get your rig back out on the road.

Thanks again for helping me make 2019 an amazing year, I am looking forward to an even better 2020. I can't say enough about NORVA's members. I am humbled by your support and trust in allowing me to take care of your rigs, big or small.
