Are you ready for two “dry camping” rallies in October/November?

NORVA will host two rallies this fall, both open to members of all four Virginia clubs, and both allowing participants to enjoy a weekend of camping without hookups in unique places.

Over Columbus Day weekend, from Thursday afternoon, Oct. 10, to Sunday morning, Oct. 13, “Silver in the Street” will be the first “urban” rally held in Virginia. It will be in the town of Farmville, located 55 miles southwest of Richmond. Then, 18 days later, NORVA is once again hosting a rally at the Annual Urbanna Oyster Festival where Airstreamers will camp in a grassy field located near the center of town. Both of these rallies require attendees to “dry camp,” although generators may be used to recharge batteries. If participating, be sure to arrive with a full fresh water tank and empty black/gray water tanks.



“Silver in the Street”

For several months NORVA has been coordinating with the town manager and merchants of Farmville, Va., to set up Virginia’s first “urban” rally. It will follow the lead of urban rallies conducted by Airstream clubs in other states. It will provide Virginia’s club members with a unique downtown weekend camping experience while giving Farmville’s merchants an excitingly different special event, certain to attract public attention and participation.

The rally will begin Thursday afternoon when the Airstreams will gather at a designated assembly area near downtown Farmville. After camping there overnight, the rigs will formally parade into town along Main Street on Friday morning and commence parking in Farmville’s municipal plaza. There is space downtown for up to 25 Airstreams and the rigs will camp there Friday and Saturday nights. The plaza is on N. Main Street, between 1st & 2nd Streets. The town is planning to provide a pancake breakfast and musical entertainment in the plaza. The Airstreamers pledge to patronize the bars, restaurants and shops during their stay and will conduct an “open house” in the plaza on Saturday, from

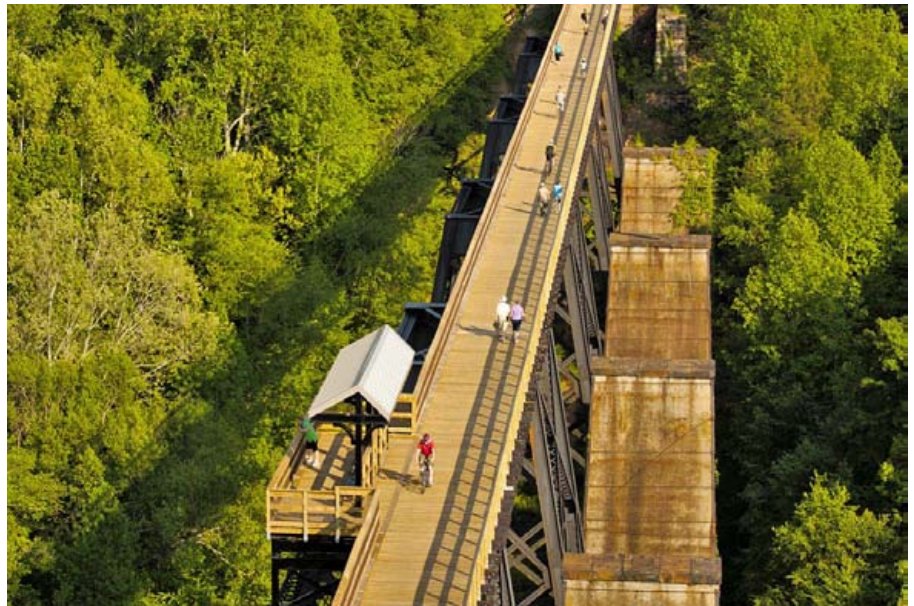

1 to 4 p.m. This will enable the merchants and the public to see the Airstreams, inside and out. All participating club members will purchase and wear special T-shirts created for the event (\$15 each). The rally fee to be collected for this special event is \$25 per rig, which will be given in its entirety as a donation to a Farmville charity. Additionally, each individual participant must agree to participate fully in the Saturday open house. This rally is limited to a maximum of 25 rigs. A nearby dump station will be available at the conclusion of the rally. If you want to be a part of "Silver in the Street," please complete the coupon on this page and send it to Tom Carmichael (at the address shown) with your check made payable to "NORVA." The first 25 members whose coupons and checks Tom receives will get a space at the rally. If your response is received later than that, you will be placed on a wait list.

Let's rally in Urbanna, Va. at the 62nd Annual Oyster Festival Oct. 31 to Nov. 2, 2019

NORVA will again host a rally at the Annual Oyster Festival in Urbanna, Va. It will be a joint rally open to all club members in Virginia. Come and join fellow Airstreamers (and thousands of other people) as this quaint Virginia town on the Rappahannock River celebrates its 62nd Oyster Festival on **Friday and Saturday, Nov. 1 & 2, 2019**. Rally host Lew Brodsky has negotiated use of a level, privately-owned, grassy field in the town, **where up to 23 Airstream trailers will DRY CAMP**. It's only a 5-minute walk to shops and all festival events, including the hundreds of vendors lining the streets. There will be plenty to see, hear, and enjoy: street foods, crafts, bands, parades, contests, wine tasting, antique cars, and, of course, oyster shucking and eating (raw, fried, wrapped into huge dough balls, etc.). There will also be barbeque, sausages, and other tasty things, and lots of beer/soft drinks to guzzle. For those who like a sit-down meal, there are several restaurants in the town. Want to buy and cook your own food? No problem. You can walk to the town's well-stocked supermarket in about two minutes. For detailed information about the festival, visit the web site: www.urbannaoysterfestival.com.

The grassy field where Airstreams will park beginning Thursday, Oct. 31, is located along the 200 block of Waverly Road in Urbanna. GPS coordinates: 37.63307N; -76.57855W. **A flat rally fee of \$75 per rig** pays for

use of this private land, and it doesn't matter if you camp there for one night or four. Being with the Airstream group also means you won't have to pay the \$20 daily festival parking fee. The land owner says it is permissible to let gray water drain to the grass (that's WASH water, not sewage!). Generators are permitted, but please minimize the noise pollution and do not operate them after 10 p.m. The festival activities and events begin on Friday morning and end Saturday night.

An important note: it is highly recommended you arrive and set up camp on Thursday afternoon, Oct. 31; but, if you cannot come until Friday, come early in the day. The festival will be ongoing and the first parade is Friday afternoon, Nov. 1, so you must arrive at our camp area before 4:00 p.m. that Friday. If you arrive later, you may have to wait until after 9 p.m. to enter the town and park your rig because roads will be closed off.

At the camping area, we will have a pot-luck "Appetizerama" on Thursday evening, so bring an appetizer to share, along with your favorite beverage. Weather permitting, we will also have an evening campfire or two.

Reserve your space now by sending a \$75 check made out to Lew Brodsky. Club members throughout Virginia are showing great interest in attending this rally so, if you plan to attend, be sure to send your check as soon as possible. We have room for only 23 rigs (first paid; first reserved), after that, Lew will start a "wait list," and you will be called if someone cancels.

We are a caravan club. Our own NORVA caravan last June was great, thanks to leaders, Gerry and Patsy Nagel. It was the first time they'd led a caravan and it was coincidentally a milestone for our club: our 50th NORVA caravan. We've done a caravan every year! I encourage everyone to sign up for a caravan (national, regional, or next year's NORVA caravan) even if they are booked up and you are placed on a waiting list. Waiting lists can disappear quickly. Last fall Jane and I took a New York State Caravan at the last minute because the waiting list disappeared and there was an opening. So, sign up and be ready to go.

A word to all new members: "Please come to our rallies." Our winter rallies are easy to attend because there is no camping involved. In December we will have a Holiday Brunch at the Mount Vernon (Alexandria) home of members Ed & Beth Jones; for January we are planning a Sunday matinee at a Fredericksburg dinner theater; and in February is the traditional Super Bowl Rally. We will begin the 2020 camping season in March or April with a Maintenance Rally that will give you lots of helpful advice about keeping your trailer in great shape. By attending rallies, our club members get to know each other and have fun doing it.

But the 2020 events are down the road a bit and we have some great rallies remaining on the 2019 schedule (see the chart on the last page of this newsletter). • President Dick Arnold called the meeting to order after verification of a quorum being present by Secretary Patsy Nagel. The meeting began at 5:15 p.m. at the West Hall, Farm Bureau Center, The Meadow Event Park, Va. The 17 eligible voting NORVA members present were:

• At the query of the President, the Secretary reported that no correspondence had been received.

• Lew stated that the minutes from the July 21, 2018 Business Meeting were published and distributed to club members and therefore did not need to be read.

• Edgar Simmons, 1st Vice President, was not present but submitted to President Dick Arnold a verbal report that all the rallies had been good and that he will submit a written report.

• Gerry Nagel, 2nd Vice President, stated that members from six Airstreams on the caravan were present at the meeting. He further reported that some did not participate in the entire caravan due to other commitments and attendee names have been submitted to the Blue Beret to credit attendance. The Kitty Fee total was \$24,062.00 and earned \$0.28 interest. After expenses, \$2,241.55 was refunded to all participants. Janeene Rider wrote an excellent article on the caravan that was published in the NORVA News. The caravan was blessed to experience good weather.

• The next NORVA Holiday Party was discussed and Ed and Beth Jones have graciously offered to host the party at their home in Alexandria on Dec. 7, 2019.

• Gerry Nagel stated that he will ask Larry and Sun Riley to again organize the January Dinner theater. Larry and Sun organized the January 2019 event that was canceled due to snow.

• Gerry Nagel further discussed that a host and location are needed for the February Super Bowl Party Rally and a rally or activity for March. Because the Region 3 Rally is early in April, we're looking at the end of April for a Breakout Rally.

• President Dick Arnold presented an idea for a caravan to the International Rally: if you have six or seven people traveling to the International Rally, each person would be responsible for a campground and activity arrangements at one location. He stated this method had been used in the past.

• Kevin Quinn, Treasurer, was on a caravan and not present. The Treasurer's report was that the club currently has \$3,780.94.

- Tom Carmichael reported that the "I'm From Virginia, Ask Me!" buttons he had made for the International Rally cost \$60.00. He has received checks from the other Virginia clubs at \$15.00 each and will submit a bill for \$15.00 to Kevin Quinn for the NORVA expense.

- Jackson McBroom, Membership Director, was not present but had submitted a written report. It was reported that we have 59 member households. Jackson is also involved in linking new members with mentors in NORVA to get them started with Airstreaming.

- Newsletter Editor Lew Brodsky was present and President Dick Arnold talked about how much work he has done for the International Rally which included writing numerous articles on Virginia venues and historic locations to visit that were published in the *Blue Beret*. Additionally, Lew is handling publicity for the International Rally and did design, layout, and had printed 1,500 copies of the 64-page printed program. Lew was given a much deserved standing ovation by all present.

- Lew Brodsky discussed the success at making newsletter distribution electronic and only sending a hard copy to new members the first month. This has reduced the cost to mostly ink replacement, which has totaled \$83.00 so far this year. He said he is putting new member photos and welcome articles in the newsletter as a way of encouraging them to get involved in the club. Lew further reported that the newsletter is getting good reviews at International but he still needs member input. The need for someone to be web site manager for the NORVA portion of the website was raised by Lew and there was some discussion about this.

- Tom Carmichael addressed the November Urbanna Oyster Festival Rally and informed he is not sure if the same plot of land we have previously used for camping will still be available. It seems the son of the owner, who really likes our club and manages the land, reports his dad is elderly and ailing. He says the family could sell the land should the dad pass away before the next Oyster Festival. However, if the dad's health holds out, the land should be available for our use in November.

- Lew Brodsky brought up that someone needs to take over the management of the spreadsheet being used as the roster which lists all NORVA club members.



Old Business

There was no old business to address.

New Business

- Ed Jones, Past President, reported on the officer slate for the upcoming year. Jim Timberlake, Storekeeper and Kevin Quinn, Treasurer, have agreed to serve again in these positions. Beth Jones has agreed to serve as Legislative Director. Gerry Nagel has agreed to move up to 1st Vice President; the 2d Vice President position has not been filled. Lew Brodsky will continue as Newsletter Editor. Tom Carmichael will step up as President if no one else is available. Patsy Nagel was asked to stay as Secretary as the meeting was beginning. President Dick Arnold asked the floor if there were any other nominations and there were none.

- President Dick Arnold asked Chuck Gregory to stand and recognized that he has done so much for the club and has been a member for 35 years.

- President Dick Arnold reported that Bill and Sylvia Worrall will show off their Pendleton Airstream trailer to Dan Smith, Acting Director of the National Park Service, on Monday, July 22, 2019, after he speaks at the rally. In 2016 Airstream and Pendleton Woolen Mills® collaborated to pay tribute to 100 years of the National Park Service with this special edition trailer. There were only 100 of these Limited Edition Airstreams and the Worrall trailer is number 44 out of the 100 produced. Lew requested a crowd to be around the trailer on/or about 2:30 p.m. for the photo shoot.

- Lew Brodsky informed those present that there would be a talk on Tuesday, July 23, 2019, about the Airstream used by the astronauts upon their return from the moon landing in July 1969. The "Mobile Quarantine Facility" was a specially modified Airstream trailer that biologically isolated Armstrong, Aldrin & Collins as a precaution against them bringing back "moon germs." Additionally, he stated he would be sending news copy to 105 news outlets in his capacity as Publicity Chair for the International Rally.

- President Dick Arnold stated that the proposed slate of officers will be sent out to all members for voting in September.

- The meeting was closed by President Dick Arnold.

International Rally - consider it well done!

The Virginia summer of 2019 may be remembered best for two extraordinary things: several days of 100-degree heat, and the 62nd WBAC International Rally at Doswell, July 20-27. It was the first time ever that the International Rally was held in Virginia. The official attendance count at the venue (The Meadow Event Park) was 672 Airstreams and 1,337 people. About 70 of those attending were from the four Virginia units/clubs, including more than two dozen NORVA members. 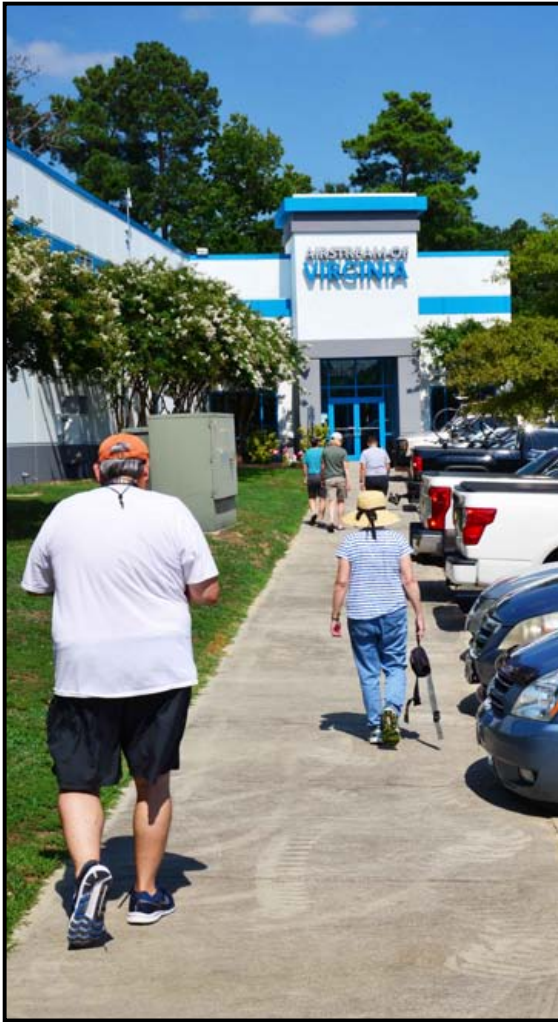

Fred's not in bed and obviously well-read

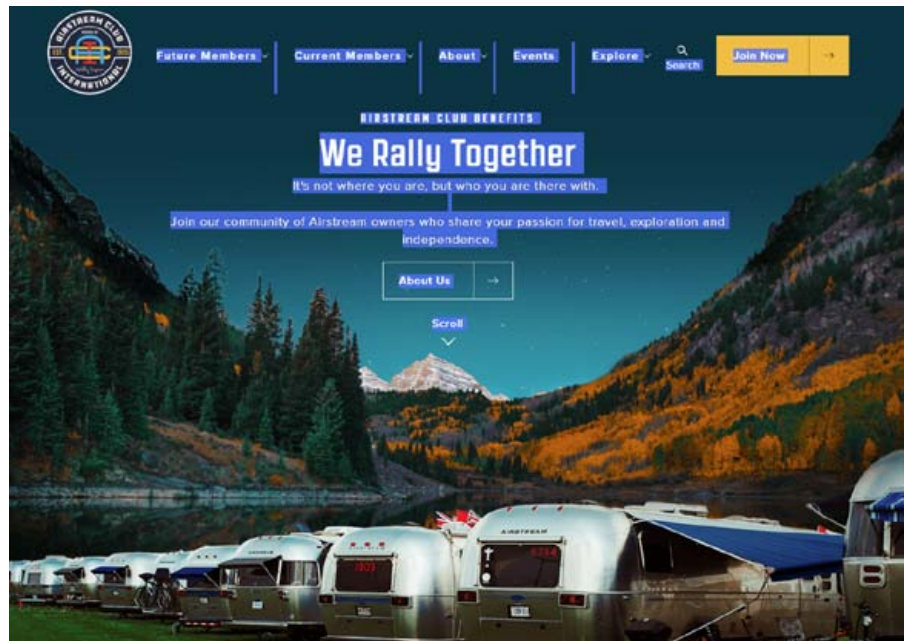
