Long before the Airstream B van there was the Airstream A van. Being manufactured in 1976-77 it may be one of the lesser known Airstream products. It was not a RV at all, but rather Airstream's venture into the lightweight truck market.

Let me set the stage. Beatrice Foods, a large corporate conglomerate, had purchased Airstream six years prior and had brought in a large amount of corporate cash to expand on the Airstream pedigree. Airstream was now producing the Argosy fleet of mid-priced travel trailers and was introducing the first motorhomes under the Argosy name badge. Affluent retirees were purchasing the longer high-end Airtreams in record numbers.

The oil embargo of 1973 Yom Kipper War had brought an awareness to the American public that the heavy steel and wood structures dominating the construction in the RV industry were undesirable with the higher oil (fuel) cost that OPEC was demanding. Aluminum was proving to be very desirable and when you think of aluminum you think of Airstream. Airstream trailers were light-weight in those days benefiting from the heavy use of aluminum and plastic throughout their interiors. This was accompanied by an under-engineered lighter steel frame (soon to be the downfall of nearly all longer 1970 Airstream trailers).

Needless to say aluminum was king and Airstream ventured into the lightweight truck industry in 1976. The step vans were constructed of an all aluminum welded body sitting on a choice of either a Ford or Chevy/GMC chassis. The largest contract was with the United States Postal Service but it was for less than 500 units. Overall sales were disappointing and little is remembered about the Airstream A vans today.

One might catch a glimpse of Airstream history if you have ever seen the 1993 movie "Poetic Justice" starring Janet Jackson. An Airstream A van, postal truck had a prominent role throughout this movie. ~



Reservation Policy and Additional nights at Liberty Harbor Marina

You can request additional nights at the campground through me. The base cost covers 6/8, 6/9 and 6/10 with checkout Sunday 6/11. I will attempt to accommodate that in my conversation(s) with the campground and I will keep you posted. The cost is \$101.65 per additional night including tax. If you pay for six nights at the campground, the 7th is free.

Sample Total costs in USD:

• 3 nights: 320.00 USD (base cost for base camp)

4 nights: 421.65 USD5 nights: 523.30 USD6 nights: 624.95 USD

• 7 nights: 624.95 USD (7th night is free)

The campground policy on reservations has always been: 50% down, no refund. If you cannot come, please try to find an alternate. So far we've done well on full refunds by shuffling around. But that is not a guarantee. Plan accordingly.

About the campground

The prime value of this campground is its excellent proximity to the city. Its basically gravel parking on somewhat narrow sites. During the 2011, 2013 and 2015 events, their WiFi was marginal. During the 2013 event we experienced an unexpected heat wave (mid 90s, 32C+) and the campground's power was inadequate to run all the A/Cs during the day. Otherwise, the campground is clean. Choices of over the air TV stations are plentiful. It has a shared dump station. It has a shower house too.

If you look up Liberty Harbor Marina with Google Maps you'll get a better feel for its fantastic location. A commuter ferry to Wall St leaves the dock by the campground (week days). A second ferry that also operates on weekends leaves by Warren St (short walk) for the World Financial Center. A 15 minute walk from the campground is the Grove Street subway station that can take you to the World Trade Center and beyond. The ferry to Ellis Island and The Statue of Liberty is right next door.
