# Quarantine On The Road – With Dave & Steph Porto

In January, with careful planning we had mapped out an epic trip that was going to include the International Rally in Colorado all the way to the Pacific Northwest into Canada and home. By May, we were ready to cancel all the reservations and isolate from home when we considered carefully that we could do this and yet maintain safe and healthy practices. So, revamping our plans with just 3 weeks to go, planning to stay in boondocking locations, state parks or being careful about social distancing, we packed as many items as we could to make sure our grocery stops would be few and far between - and left town on June 16<sup>th</sup>.

First stop was the Shiloh Winery and Vineyard, a Harvest Host location near WaKeeney Kansas. Some of the best wines I have ever had from a Kansas vineyard – albeit a limited sample. I would highly recommend their port – Aroma – 30% coffee for a celebratory breakfast.

Second stop was Scott Lake State Park which we now consider one of the best stops on our trip. There we unexpectantly met two couples, Cathy and Steve and Bev and Dennis. As it happens in life, 7 years previously when we first rented a Class A to explore Estes park – Cathy and Steve were our campground neighbors and they gave us the "list" that had been passed down three generations to stock our camper when we bought one. We had an exceptional time with them learning about meteorites and satellites and getting even more tips about camping. We also hiked the New Jerusalem State Park nearby.





The next stop was another Harvest Host, the Trolley Turner in Pueblo Colorado. Boris is an accomplished wood turner who teaches turning and a great storyteller. We found common ground on woodworking, Croatian heritage and the love of telling a good joke. We cannot recommend this stop highly enough as Boris and Jorgette were the most gracious of hosts and we now own a turquoise inlaid cherry bowl that I helped create with Boris.

Following those first campouts, we then visited Creede Colorado, Gunnison Colorado, Green Springs Utah, Idaho Falls Idaho, Sherman Oregon, Fort Stevens Oregon, Dosewallips State Park Washington, a ferry trip to Anacostas Washington for three nights each. We hiked Arches (and got lost in the desert), Gunnison National Parks and backroads of BLM land, walked on beaches where we were the only footprints, clammed and fished a little. When we arrived in Everett Washington area – we were ready for a longer break and spent about a week with our son talking, walking and playing dominos.

Those stops were mostly the same as the original plan but leaving Washington, everything was ad lib; Wilbur Washington, a Harvest Host alpaca ranch near Billings Montana, KOA campgrounds in Rapid City Montana and North Sioux Falls South Dakota, then home. We watched the wheat harvest in the northern central plains of miles and miles of wheat. Bison, elk, deer, eagles and quail were frequent sights. The only place we visited with more than a handful of people was at Mount Rushmore and Crazy Horse Monument. Really enjoyed Crazy Horse Monument and the museum. The workshop and restaurant were well worth the time we spent there.





Calypso and Zeus, our trailer and truck, performed admirably with only having to replace a converter in Anacortes Washington and a solar monitor that was steamed by our instant pot on the last day. Those moments, though frustrating, are part of the adventure and certainly part of the learning curve with owning a trailer. In no small part, due to the grace and courtesy of the people we met, small disasters were remedied and we continued on.

Glad to be home, but ready to think about the next trip. Safe travels and marvelous memories.
