Shore Power Upgrade

Checking our power cord after a return from a recent rally we noticed the result of a high resistance connection on the trailer shore power connection. Heat generated from the high resistance resulted in damage to both the male and female plugs.

I believe this was caused by the loose connection of the twist lock plug. No matter how tight the locking ring was screwed in, there was always play in the plug. This seems to be a common problem with this type of plug. If left unchecked, I'm sure this condition would have resulted in a more serious problem or possibly a fire.





I decided to replace the original twist lock connector with the SmartPlug design. This type of connector plugs in like a household plug. The SmartPlug has spring-loaded locking tabs on each side that securely hold the plug by clicking into place. Squeezing both tabs disengages the locking tabs for removal. Furthermore, the marine grade stainless steel cover just looks absolutely splendid on the Airstream.

All parts were ordered on-line from the AirStreamsupplycompany.com. These included: the SmartPlug 30 Amp inlet-BM30S and the 30-foot SmartPlug 30 Amp Cordset (power cord). 50 amp inlets and cord sets are available for those who need a 50 amp service.

Removal of TwistLock Plug:

WARNINGS:

- 1. Make sure all power is disconnected from the trailer!
- 2. Read and follow the included SmartPlug installation instructions.
- 3. If unsure seek a certified RV Tech or Licensed Electrcian to install the SmartPlug.

Remove the four mounting screws (save these for mounting the SmartPlug) and pull out the OEM twist lock plug. Take care not to damage the wiring against the sharp edges of the exposed aluminum.









Remove the two screws from the strain relief bracket. Slide the wiring cover back to access the wire retaining screws. Notice a towel was placed over the sharp edge to protect wiring from nicks and cuts. Loosen the wire retaining screws and remove twist lock plug. Remove the cover and old rubber gasket.

Installation of SmartPlug:

Use some Walbernize to clean the residue from the old gasket.

Install the new rubber gasket over the exposed trailer wires. Remove the screw from the SmartPlug strain relief cap to expose the wiring terminals.

The terminals are color coded: white wire to white, black wire to black and bare ground wire to green.



Insert the wires into the proper color terminal and tighten the wire terminals with the included allen wrench.

Install the strain relief cover and slip the the completed plug back into the opening. Secure the plug to the trailer with the four original screws. Tighten the four mounting screws, taking care not to over tighten and strip them.







Lastly, check the trailer wiring for the correct polarity. Two amber lights and no red light on the tester and we are good to go.


