Cheryl is now retired but was a self employed consultant to the insurance industry for many years. She is a veteran traveler (via RV and non-RV) to many domestic and foreign destinations.

Gordon has been involved in the scuba diving industry for many years. He is also a veteran RV and business traveler, including destinations across the US, Mexico, Hawaiian Islands, the Caribbean and elsewhere.

When not Airstreaming, Cheryl and Gordon enjoy non-RV traveling, exploring new restaurants and visiting their adult kids and grandkids. Cheryl paints as well as doing other art projects in her studio. Gordon walks the dog.

In 2006, Cheryl and Gordon bought a new 2007 T@B trailer after seeing a TV feature on them. During the ensuing 12+ years, they took many, many trips in the T@B around the Southwest, across the US to Key West, another trip to Native American and 19th century settlers' sites in Oklahoma and Texas.

Last spring, Cheryl and Gordon decided to purchase an Airstream and in the span of about 30 hours, they sold their T@B and bought a new 2019 16' Bambi at Bay Area Airstream in Fairfield. TALES OF YOUR AIRSTREAMS

We all have our personal stories of how we began Airstreaming. This is but one.

I always tell people we "Accidentally bought an Airstream". I have always been a camper – Backpacking or Tent camping primarily. Chris thought "Roughing it" meant 'room service closed at 10:00 PM'. We had discussed buying a small camper of some type – It needed to have a bathroom. I had been looking at A-liner style campers as well as a "Scamp" like thing – you know – small.

One March afternoon in 2016, I was cruising some local neighborhoods in search of colors to paint our house when I happened upon a 16' 2012 Airstream Bambi in a driveway with a for sale sign in the front window. I thought "I'll bring Chris to come see it" So I jotted down the phone number and Chris set up an appointment to see it. It turns out that the owners purchased it new, used it once for a caravan and decided that they really wanted a self contained unit. I must say, it was love at first sight. It had a bathroom, a kitchen and a bed. What else did one need. Chris said – "Let's buy it". She had looked at the for sale sign and thought it said \$3,500.00.

Neither of us had looked at Airstreams or really any trailers with actual intent to purchase so we had no idea of the cost. When I pointed out the true cost, she balked.



We agreed to do some research and ended up offering \$32,000.

Our offer was accepted and we found ourselves hooking it to our truck and towing it home that afternoon. The airstream had red numbers on it and the owners explained that this was part of an Airstream club. The next thing I know, we are club members and we are going to a rally in June. In preparation for our first rally, we went to a local campsite for 3 nights for practice.

The night before we are to leave for our first rally, Chris is talking to her girlfriend on the phone, who says "Hey, you have to have lights or some kind of decorations if you are going to a rally." Well, you do not need to tell me twice. That evening I installed my first set of LED strip lights to an Airstream. The next morning, we headed out across Highway 36 to Graeagle.

Fast forward about two years. Chris noted that the bed was too small, the bathroom was not convenient (All in one shower and toilet with no sink) and the refrigerator and closet were both too small. (I always felt that the single 21 gallon Black/grey tank was too small and the single axel was a reliability issue.) She then shows me a listing for a 1997 25 foot Airstream Safari that cost about the same as our 2012 16 foot Bambi. I told her "Lets go see it".

So, we flew to LAX, rented a car and drove to Big Bear Lake. The owner had a B&B and said we could stay there Saturday night and then go see it on Sunday.



The good news was the bed was a Queen size, the Bathroom had a separate shower and sink, and the closet and Refrigerator were both much larger. In addition, it had 32 gallon Fresh, Gray and Black water tanks, and a double axle. It had been really well taken care of internally. In fact, the previous owner had remodeled it and done a pretty good job. The bad news was: it looked like it had a really bad sunburn and had peeled.
