While that may not affect most of us, it is yet another reminder that we need to make lifestyle changes due to this pandemic. Please be safe during these holidays. We'd like to see you down the road at the next rally!

Looking on the positive side – we have a wonderful agenda of rallies planned for 2021, thanks to our 1st VP-elect Bruce Bodenstein. That 3rd Step is Very Important – because: A) the Hosts need to know how many to plan for meals / games / events / tours / shelter capacity / etc. B) We're attempting to refrain from handling cash at the rallies - so you conveniently pay the rally fee on the website, and **C**) We'll have a Rig Count to report for all the rallies most campgrounds will NOT provide this information so we don't know who is coming until you tell the host you're coming.

**151 Rigs in the Club!** You are an Active bunch of campers, and you are the reason this club is growing in leaps and bounds! It's *your* participation, *your* attendance, *your* involvement that has made this happen. **BUT – ONLY 2/3 HAVE RENEWED FOR 2021!** Did you forget?! So, if you haven't already


## **SEASON OF FIRSTS!**

## NEW PRODUCT REVIEW

## MicroAir Easy Touch RV Thermostat

I just had to communicate my review of a product I picked up during Black Friday specials. This product is made by the same company that brought us Easy Start soft start controllers for our air conditioner/heat pumps. But, it is a 21st century version of a thermostat for your RV.

The thermostat comes in several models to plug and play depending on your model A/C. Most of us have Dometic units with the CCC2 control. The installation instructions are clear and easy. Drill two holes for the mount, after removing the old thermostat and back plate. Screws and screw covers are even provided for the old holes. You just plug the cable into the new thermostat, clip it to the wall and it is ready to go.

What is so cool about this thermostat? First, it connects to your smart phone via Bluetooth and/or WiFi. MicroAir is improving the firmware and functions and updates are done using the connection. A big advantage for me is that I can control the thermostat from my phone in the rear of the trailer while my wife is asleep in the front of the trailer, where the thermostat is located. But you should also be able to remotely monitor and control temperature using WiFi. Great if you have a pet in the trailer or want to cool the trailer down before returning from a shopping trip.

Another advantage is this thermostat allows 4 schedule points, unlike the 2 with the existing thermostat. So, you can set the furnace to warm things up before you wake up, change when you are up and dressed, and cool down before going to bed. Finally, this is really intuitive to use with icons to push and easy operation. I always had to have my manual handy for the CCC2 to set schedules, not so for Easy Touch as you simply push Schedule and the display is clear and easy to use. No wondering how to change modes, etc.

I had some questions for their tech support and, via email, they are responsive and timely, just like they are with Easy Start. They tell me they are planning some updates such as weather display, but as a thermostat, this is a great modification to replace your existing unit.
