"Oh! The Places You'll Go" is back on the road! Region 1 Rally 2021 will be at the Three County Fairground in Northampton, MA. Save the date: June 17-20, 2021 (Note: This is a New Location and New Date) Location! Location!

The Fairground is conveniently located on the edge of the commercial and historic district of this college town. The city of Northampton is known as one of America's best small cities. A top ten town for craft lovers, walking and bike trails and a highly rated shopping district in the Connecticut River valley. History abounds in Northampton with early abolitionists, women's rights activists and Calvin Coolidge's residence in the early 1900's. Today the town is the home of the Coolidge Presidential Library and Museum, Smith College's Botanical Garden, Museum of Art and so much more, e.g. the Beer Can Museum.

Kayaking the Connecticut River and its tributaries along with hiking adventures to the top of Mount Tom and Mount Holyoke are just a short drive from the fairgrounds. Within 25 minutes of town are Springfield's National Basketball Hall of Fame, the Armory-National Historic Site and the Dr. Seuss Museum and Sculpture Garden. To the north of town is Deerfield with its historic Deerfield Village, the Butterfly Conservatory and the popular Yankee Candle flagship store.

Our Airstreams will have 30 amp electric, daisy-chained water, dump station and dedicated WIFI for our use. Our vehicles will be parked on grass and gravel field areas surrounding our center of operations, a commercial size open air pavilion with a stage.

Yes, in these uncertain pandemic times, we will maximize the air circulation by using this outdoor facility while being protected from the sun and possible inclement weather. In the event of extreme weather, we have the backup of the colossal arena building. Social distancing should be easy to maintain in these venues should the need still exist next June. As we reexamine our abilities to get together in responsible ways the Three County Fairground will offer some of the best facilities while providing an ideal location with considerable interest and places to explore. ~

On October 11, 1970 the first meeting of greater Connecticut Airstream owners was held in Bristol, CT. Most attendees were from the Berkshire Unit including Roger and Ruth Crockett. Several others came from the New England Unit including John and Marian Fuller. Guests of the meeting were Region 1 President John Engel and First Lady Elizabeth who helped guide the group through the organizational steps needed to establish a new WBCCI unit. A temporary charter was established by having 20 paying International members committing to the formation of this unit.

All four potential names were sent to International headquarters and they established our name as "Charter Oak Connecticut Unit".

## BOWLUS ROAD CHIEF

The Bowlus Road Chiefs are reincarnations of the original visionary William Hawley Bowlus's travel trailers of the mid 1930's which were the predecessor and inspiration of the Wally Byam Airstream Clipper. The present-day Road Chiefs came from the vision of John Long, a successful tech entrepreneur, who upon selling his Quadravison Corporation, took up his passion of vintage automobiles and trailers. After fully restoring a 1935 Road Chief and traveling across the country with his family, he was inspired to further develop this antique classic. John was able to acquire all the rights from the Bowlus family. In 2013 he set out using the original design to reimagine the best possible hand-crafted travel trailer for the American market.

Today with his daughter, Geneva, as CEO of Bowlus Road Chief, the trailers boast some of the lightest weights, highest tech systems and the most dramatic art deco styling in the industry.


Present day models are built in Ventura County, CA and are marketed out of their sales room in

Henderson, NV. The trailers come with a full monocoque frame, heated floors, stainless steel countertops, a sophisticated hygienic cassette system toilet, marine quality refrigerator along with teak and chrome appointments. The power management system is the best in the industry with awesome lithium iron phosphate batteries and a 3,000-watt inverter providing two weeks of off-grid power or two nights of air conditioning. Using Bluetooth technology, the system is controlled from your cell phone. At 26 feet they are only 3,200 pounds, a fraction of an equivalent Airstream.

The cost, if you must know. They are expen-



sive. Starting price is \$190,000 to \$230,000 depending on the model before adding on option packages. Makes the Airstream look like a bargain!




