# Regional leaders meet with all the International and other Regional officers three times a year. This year, Doug Hart (NEAC), Bard Fuller (COCAC) and RJ Dominic (CCAC) are your officers. At the end of January, a meeting was held in Sarasota, FL. Fortunately, this was very close to my winter home allowing for my onsite presence. This past year WBCCI experimented with hybrid ZOOM meetings, allowing for a smaller onsite presence yet with greater officer participation. The following is a summary of some of our mid-winter meeting efforts.

Much of the work of the International Board of Trustees (IBT) involved a revamping of the constitution, bylaws and policies. Using the principle that our constitution should state "who we are" and the bylaws stating "how we do

it" was applied to our governing rules. A sizable portion of our constitution, bylaws and policies had become clouded in their distinction. At the end of our meeting we now have a better-defined rule of governance.

Here are some highlights of new additions that were made to our governing rules:

- Voting for international officers will now be done by all individual members either electronically or by mail not by delegates to the international delegate meeting.
- Delegate meetings will only be held on years that there are constitutional amendments.
- Your governing leadership of the Executive Committee and IBT will now be able to meet electronically and vote either by mail or electronically.
- Regional officers will be able to hold local club offices up to the point that they become a Region President.
- Annual membership of WBCCI will be changing for all <u>NEW</u> members from a calendar year to their anniversary year (date that they joined WBCCI).
- Lifetime membership fee table will be revised to reflect recent dues increase.
- *Note*, this is a great opportunity to join lifetime status at the old rates up until August 1, 2021 when the new fee schedule becomes effective.
- Standardization of our new, more cost effective, badges were defined. New badges can be ordered by members through the WBCCI website/Current members/Club Store.
- Badges and some flags will have the option of using any of the approved logos.
- A new staff member will be added to the corporate office to help in marketing and communication.
- Commitments were made to two future International rally sites:
- 2022 Fryeburg, Maine July
- 2023 Yakima, Washington June 23- July 2
- 2021 Delegates meeting will be done electronically due to the uncertainty of COVID restrictions at the time of the meeting.
- Members-at-large will have representation on International voting through the Region presidents.
- Indie Streamers (those traveling solo in their RV's) became officially accepted as an intra-club.
- Caravans without volunteer leaders will have the opportunity to be run by professional contractors. *This will open the opportunities for more caravans through Mexico and other foreign lands.*
- The minimal official national or regional caravan will be shortening from 10 days to 9 days. *This will allow more working people to participate in a caravan*.
- Future caravan applications will have a nonrefundable \$25 administration fee as well as a temporary \$100 surcharge. *This will help replenish the Caravan Emergency Fund that was severely depleted this year from refunds issued after COVID cancellations.* ~

## State of Airstream Inc.

uring the Mid-winter WBCCI Meeting Justin Humphreys, VP of Sales of Airstream, spoke to the health of Airstream Inc. In 2018 Airstream Inc. invested \$40 million towards upgrading their facilities. Just prior to COVID they became fully integrated into the new travel trailer 750,000 sq. ft. facility. This building is nearly triple the square footage of the previous travel trailer building. The touring coach production then moved into the old travel trailer building which provided a facility six times larger than their previous facility.



During COVID the increased space has been well appreciated as it has allowed for better social distancing of employees. At the height of the COVID shut down they had only 600 employees. Today they are up to 1,092 employees and anticipate hiring another 200 employees by July. The new building has provided a new training center and an on-site medical clinic which provides a benefit to employees and a cost savings to the company. This week they will be opening a cafeteria on site for both breakfast and lunch. The Heritage Center Museum is expected to open in September of 2021.

Sales have been through the roof since mid-summer. Airstream Inc. and their dealers like to have 3,500 units in stock for available sale worldwide. With such great demand, today there are only 200 unsold Airstreams. Dealers are complaining they have no Airstreams to show potential customers and delivery times are backed up for months. This shortage is throughout the RV industry. The supply chain of components is not able to keep up with the demand which compounds the problem. Efforts are being focused to address this problem.  $\sim$
