Our August rally was a weekend at the races in Saratoga, New York. We camped at a resort outside of Saratoga Springs, and had a delightful day at the track, where

September, Kit Wheatley has let us know that we can join that weekend by contacting ReserveAmerica on December 9<sup>th</sup> or immediately thereafter (this is a particularly popular destination)to reserve a site between #234 and #242, or close to those. This gives members a chance to choose sites that fit their rigs, and takes the financial arrangements out of the hands of the planner. It's important then to get back to the planners (in this case, Kit!) to let them know you are joining the trip so they can figure out activities, pot lucks, and so on.

*Our unit's fall rally and meeting is a long* weekend at one of the most beautiful spots in the Adirondacks. Fish Creek Pond was the first of the many Adirondack Park campgrounds established by the NYS Department of Conservation. Created in 1920, with over 300 sites, almost all on the water. Because of its popularity, it is necessary to reserve sites early as this park does fill up. If we expect sites together we need to reserve on 12/9/15 or soon after. Please reserve a site between 234 and 242 or nearby. Cost is \$27 per day and it is dry camping. Make your reservation at reserveamerican.com ASAP after 12/9/15.
