



One Dish Recipes for the Road

Romantic Chicken with Artichokes and Mushrooms

Easy, moist, flavorful and aromatic -- the white wine, artichokes and mushrooms make this chicken dish the way to any man's heart! Delicious served with buttered noodles and fresh greens.

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves salt and pepper to taste

1 tablespoon olive oil

1 tablespoon butter

1 (14 ounce) can marinated quartered artichoke hearts, drained, liquid reserved

1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms

1 cup white wine

1 tablespoon capers

Directions

Step 1 Season chicken with salt and pepper. Heat oil and butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Brown chicken in oil and butter for 5 to 7 minutes per side; remove from skillet, and set aside.

Step 2 Place artichoke hearts and mushrooms in the skillet, and saute until mushrooms are brown and tender. Return chicken to skillet, and pour in reserved artichoke liquid and wine. Reduce heat to low, and simmer for about 10 to 15 minutes, until chicken is no longer pink and juices run clear.



Step 3 Stir in capers, and simmer for another 5 minutes. Remove from heat; serve immediately.

Tech Tips

Our Airstreams give us the ability to camp in many locations with a multitude of various surroundings. One of the best parts of camping is setting up in remote spots that are quiet, peaceful and surrounded by natural beauty. Many times in order to achieve finding such a tranquil and beautiful location requires leaving crowded RV parks behind and going off grid. Commonly this is termed as "boondocking" or "dry camping". Boondocking requires an alternative source of power such as solar replenishment of our batteries, conservation of our water supply and the ability to replenish the water storage tank and a watchful eye on our waste tank capacities.

I always found it frustrating to refill my water tank easily while in the middle of nowhere. Certainly many primitive type campgrounds may offer a water bib to fill storage bottle with but then the transfer from water jug into the Airstream's water tank can be tedious and a little difficult due to the angle of the refill port and the size of the tank opening.

I found this handy way to refill your rig's water tank and not spill one drop of hauled water.

These are the four things you will for your water transfer device:



Camco 10 ft Drinking Water Hose (6 ft. length would be better but isn't made in that length)
Camco Water Bandit
Camco Water Tank Filler
Some sort of water jug(s)

These 4 things can all be found on Amazon. I found mine at Motor Sports Land parts store.
