# SILVER IN THE STREETS -ABINGDON, VA -MAY 13-16, 2021

This long weekend should be a wonderful experience. There is a lot of planning to do, but there is still some planning to do. So, without promising things we cannot deliver on, here are some possible options

Most folks will want to ride the Creeper Trail from White Top to Damascus, VA. This is roughly a 17-mile trip with about 15.5 miles downhill. It is impractical to self-shuttle this route as the road is windy and shuttle driver cannot ride with the group. There are many services in the area for bikes and shuttles.

There is an option second option to ride the entire 34-mile route from White Top to Abingdon. The downhill route ends at Damascus and its level or climb from Damascus to Abingdon.

The Barter Theatre touts itself as being Virginia's theatre, which has been closed due to Virus, but has had a drive inn movie theater option. Maybe but May there will be some inside experience available.

The Martha Washington Inn has drawn folks to the area for years and is sure to be an experience for many.

Bristol Motor Speedway is a few miles away and if NASCAR is of interest, it might be possible to get a tour.

Let's not forget the Bristol is the Birthplace of Country music. The Birthplace of Country Music Museum offers interesting option for Ole Time Country Music and Bluegrass Lovers. There is Country Music Venue in Abingdon, so we will see if it is open an operating during our visit.

If trout fishing or fishing in general interest you, there are some option in the area including guided trips

down the South Holston, which is favorite stream to many.

We plan to have a historian available to give is some history as there is Revolutionary War muster site within walking distance and other related history to this historic town

Abingdon is a pleasant venue that offers shopping and dining on Main Street and in the area, right off I81. By looking and doing a Web search their options to for shopping and continuing your camping/traveling experience.
