There have been blessings and rewards to teaching all those years in this wonderful small community.

I've been able to try some new recipes such as Boston Cream Cupcakes and Polish filled cookies called Kolaczki, also pictured below.

Together, the International Board of Trustees (IBT) has continued working diligently, and creatively, on your behalf to ensure that necessary Club business can be conducted as required by our Constitution & By-Laws. We have a slate of International Officers, along with members of the Nominating Committee, to elect along with key Constitutional Amendments to be voted upon by the delegates from each of our Local Clubs / Units.

Yesterday, March 31, 2020, the IBT voted unanimously to adopt an Emergency Resolution declaring a proclamation of emergency due to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The 2020 Emergency Resolution, in addition to waiving the requirement for in-person attendance or participation at an International Rally or IBT meeting in lieu of conducting those meetings electronically, also provides for the establishment of an electronic means for the delegate voting process to take place.
