SILVER IN THE STREETS ABINGDON, VA

MAY 13-16, 2021

This long weekend should be a wonderful experience. There is still a lot of planning to do. So without promising things we cannot deliver, here are some possible options.

Most folks will want to bike ride the Virginia Creeper Trail from White Top to Damascus, VA. This is roughly a 17-mile trip with about 15.5 miles downhill. It is impractical to self-shuttle this route as the road is windy and the shuttle driver cannot bike with the group. There are many services in the area for bike rental and shuttles.

There is a second option to ride the entire 34-mile route from White Top to Abingdon. The downhill route ends at Damascus and it's level or a slight climb from Damascus to Abingdon.

The Barter Theatre touts itself as being Virginia's theatre, which has been closed due to Virus, but it has had a drive-in movie theater option. Maybe by May there will be some inside entertainment available.

The Martha Washington Inn has drawn folks to the area for years and is sure to be an experience for many.

Bristol Motor Speedway is a few miles away and, if NASCAR is your interest, it might be possible to get a tour.

Let's not forget that Bristol is the Birthplace of Country music. The Birthplace of Country Music Museum offers an interesting option for Ole Time Country Music and Bluegrass Lovers. There is a Country Music Venue in Abingdon, so we will see if it is open during our visit.

If trout fishing or fishing in general interests you, there are some options in the area including guided trips down the South Holston River, which is a favorite stream to many.

We plan to have a historian available to give us some history. There is a Revolutionary War muster site within walking distance and other related sites in this historic town.

Abingdon is a pleasant venue that offers shopping and dining on Main Street and in the area right off I81. By looking and doing a Web search, there are options to for shopping and continuing your camping/traveling experience.

As you can imagine, we will need some help with this event. If you are planning to attend, please consider helping.
