Greetings from Key West where we are spending the Winter months. 'Miss Dorothy', my 1964 Bambi II is tucked away in North Carolina and we are both dreaming of warmer camping days ahead with our Airstream friends, or the other group I enjoy camping with—Sisters on the Fly.

Although happily married for thirty years, my husband does not enjoy camping as much as I do. Especially in my 17-foot vintage beauty! So, besides the awesome group in the Piedmont Airstream Club, much of my camping is with Sisters on the Fly, a camping and outdoor adventure group for women. SOTF was founded by two Sisters who enjoyed camping and outdoor adventures with their mother. Friends started inviting friends and Sisters on the Fly was born. Members are of all ages, backgrounds, camping styles, and interests. Like the Airstream Club, we have Sister 'numbers' that are assigned when joining. I am Sister #1636—and the newest Sister number is almost up to #18,000. Looking for a springtime caravan for 2022? Check out the Old National Road Caravans beginning April 29, 2022, and departing from Ramblin Pines Campground in Woodbine, MD.

Come with us, Tom Ketchum and Vicki Ketchum (#5809), as we explore the historic National Road, on a journey through the lives and fortunes of the men and women who built America.

The National Road runs from Baltimore, MD to Vandalia, IL

There are three caravans covering this route, with each a nine-day format. This will allow younger club members with jobs and families to experience what the Airstream Club was founded to do. The former name, Wally Byam Caravan Club International says it all- the Caravan experience, traveling to enjoy the history, hospitality, and friendship of our host communities, and making new friendships as part of Airstream ownership.

Old National Road East starts in Baltimore and ends in Washington, PA. Start April 29, 2022 End May 7, 2022

Old National Road Central starts in Washington and ends in Richmond, IN. Start May 7, 2022 End May 15, 2022

Old National Road West starts in Richmond and ends near Vandalia, IL. Start May 15, 2022 End May 23, 2022

The segments are each a full nine-day caravan, and run consecutively, making it possible to enjoy just one segment, two segments, or all three.

Register online at https://airstreamclub.org/current-members/caravans! There are a total of only 22 units for each segment, and the online enrollment process time stamp decides the order of the wait list after the available spots are filled.

Once you register online, you will be contacted by email regarding kitty fee payment dates and amounts. Please note, the \$25 caravan administration fee the club charges will be charged once if you are booking two or all three segments as the administration fee and credited to the kitty fee for the other segment(s).
