Screen shots of “old” website for laptop and iPhone. This website will NOT be current!!!!



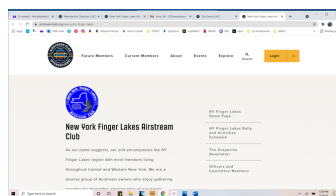

## A Heartbreaking Tale

I think this is the most heartbreaking article I have shared since becoming editor. Shortly after publishing the March Grapevine I heard from Don and Mary Farmer that their International Airstream, which they have owned since 1978, was totaled this winter. It had been tucked away for the season under covered storage in Old Forge. The winter snow collapsed the building on the Farmer's trailer along with another new Airstream, various boats, trailers and a new Ford pickup.

Don shared that he and Mary logged 113,000 miles over the course of 43 years. They purchased it when it was brand new! The trailer was a total loss and, at age 91, they're not going to purchase another RV. Don shared that he's really going to miss the rallies.

As a result, Don and Mary have the following items:

- ◆ Hitch equipment
- ◆ Set-up equipment
- ◆ A spare tire
- ◆ Awning tie-downs
- ◆ Assorted parts, books, and items the Classic Airstream Club might like to have.

 If you have a vintage trailer and might be in need of parts please contact Don directly and leave a message.

Otherwise, Don and Mary have offered to donate their equipment to our club to be used as needed. To do this we are in need of a club member who would be willing to travel to Thendara, NY to pick up these donations.

Maybe you'd like to combine a "parts rescue" along with doing a bit of camping and hiking!! Thendara is where Rt 28 crosses the Moose River, not far from hiking at Woodhull Lake and relatively close to the Bald Mountain hiking trail. For camping you could consider Old Forge KOA or Nicks Lake State camp ground.

## See You Down the Road.....

I started to think March was going out like a lamb this year till the snow came in today. We enjoyed that breath of spring we had last week here in Rochester but alas Mother Nature pulled a fast one again! We already started pulling out weeds and revisiting the plans we had for last camping season. Our trips are limited by the number of vacation days Suzanne has.... Someday that won't be a limitation!

So, MaryAnn and our truck come out of storage in 1 week. Right now, we are taking stock as to what we need to restock and check. I had my trailer's lead acid battery on and off a trickle charger in the basement through the winter. What I noticed was that the battery would not hold a charge. I would check the battery after a week and, after starting at 13.1 volts, it would be at 11.2. I finally replaced the battery with an AGM. Here is a checklist I will use once MaryAnn is back home:

- The trailer registration and NYS inspection--are they still valid? Ours come due in April.
- With the NYS Thruway closing the toll booths, did I get a Thruway pass and did I put monies in the account?
- De-winterize the water lines.
- Sanitize the fresh water tank. The rule of thumb is 1 oz of bleach for every 8 gallons of fresh water in your tank. I Googled the procedure to sanitize the fresh water tank.
- Now is a good time to clean the inside of the traile, before moving things in for the season. I'll be checking for any 8,6,4-legged friends that may have moved in during the winter. They need to find a new spring home!
- In the Finger Lakes, we can still get a cool night or two, so check your furnace operation. Or pack extra blankets!
- Seasonal supplies
- Inline water filter(s) for the season.
- Black water holding tank waste digester, drops or liquid.
- Septic tank safe toilet paper.
- Propane tanks --is the inspection date still valid? If not, pressure test or replace.
- Are the propane tanks full?
- Check your trailer lights and electrical system BEFORE you hit the road.
- Take a look at the tires. They might be good but if they are 4 years old, you may want to replace them.
- At the end of last season, were there any small repairs you wanted to do but said it can wait till next season (i.e., popped rivets, sticky windows/doors)? Now is the time to fix them before you move things into the trailer. Last year, I found a broken TV cable jack and a bad vent fan motor. So, I had time to repair/order replacement parts at my pace. Instead of Honey.... we are leaving tomorrow and the (you fill in the blank) is still broken!
- Open your Zip-Dee sun shade and clean/lubricate the canvas and support arms.
- Open your windows and give the inside of the trailer a breath of fresh air. Remember your trailer has been sitting closed up--for 6-7 months in our case!
- We pulled everything out of MaryAnn that we could before going into storage. This allowed Suzanne to wash and take stock of the linens/kitchen items that we use in the trailer and gives us time to replace them, if needed. For example, that broken grill item, or that leaky Fresh water hose.
- Tools for the road. As we've become more experienced trailering MaryAnn, the tool box has grown! I've started a MaryAnn tool box. My toolbox started out as a small cardboard box. Now it's a med/large box. Depending on what you want to bring along, consider:
  - Standard and Phillips screw drivers
  - Volt meter
  - Pop rivet gun and rivets
  - Portable drill and drill bits
  - Socket set
  - Breaker bar and socket for the lug nuts
  - Add to this list as you see fit.

It's hard to plan for every scenario but best to be as prepared as possible. That's not to say that something might not break along the road--because it will--that's a totally different article.

## Tire Safety/Recent Buying Experience

Whenever I attend rallies I make it a point to attend educational sessions on trailer maintenance and product offerings. These sessions provide a lot of practical information on new products and common issues. Tires and tire safety are common subjects. One of the “rule of thumb” is that tire life can not be measured by thread depth, but rather by tire age. Each tire (by law) must have a date of manufacture embossed on the sidewall. This date code consists of four digits, where the first two indicate the week of manufacture, and the second two reflect the year of manufacture. Thus, a code of 2519 indicates the tire was made in the 25<sup>th</sup> week of 2019. It is commonly recommended that trailer tires be replaced after 6 years of age—no matter what thread remains. This is because the sun damage is what deteriorates the structure of the tire.

Our current Airstream tires are 6 years old, Although we keep canvas sun shields over the tires, even at campsites, and though the tires look good without cracks visible, we are going to replace them. Tire blowouts are a major safety concern, let alone a potential costly repair.

My current experience to share touches on the generous Michelin Airstream discount offer. I am sure it applies to our tow vehicles and I would guess it would apply to Airstream motor homes. However, I could not find any tire listing applicable to trailers, such as our ST-225/75R15 tires. I wanted to insure a Load “E” tire rating for added safety. What a disappointment!

I had previously purchased Goodyear tires, so I contacted the local Goodyear store about their “Endurance” tires. Their inventory included some 2019 tires and only three 2020 tires. I then went to another local dealer who ordered four 2020 tires but without knowing what month they were manufactured, (without an obligation to purchase if the time of manufacture was not acceptable). What I did learn from him was that Goodyear builds their tires in batches, and 2021 tires will not be available till after mid-year 2021. Tires have large mark-ups! After negotiations, I will pay \$508 including mounting, balancing and tax, by calling ahead and asking for their “walk-away” price.

John makes EXCELLENT points.....

Blowouts are dangerous and expensive. We know from personal experience. We'd had our trailer just over one year and were driving home from Alumapalooza. It was a secondary highway in Ohio that wasn't in great shape with plenty of pot holes.

Well, we hit one of those potholes and delaminated our tire. We're wondering what the heck happened as we see tire debris (and Kirk debris) trailing behind us. When the tire delaminated it punched holes in our black tank and ripped off the handles.

Immediately after changing the tire we were on our phone ordering tire pressure monitors. Now we never travel without tire monitors!!

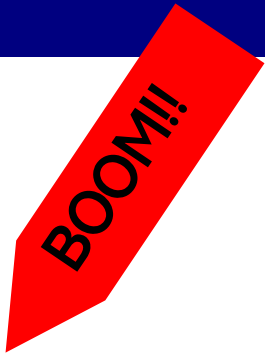
