Friday, we went to the Keepers of the Sacred Tradition of Pipemakers for our pipestone carving class. We could choose to carve any one of several shapes, including a turtle, bear, feather, butterfly, cross, or owl. The blanks, tools, and



instructions were all provided, as well as a history lesson in pipe carving. Each carver could add a leather strip to make their carving into a necklace. Beads were also available to embellish your necklace if you wanted. Overall, we had a wonderful time, and each of us brought home a carved item and a better understanding of the pipemaking carving process.



There was this really cool donkey sculpture at the carving class building. The owner said it was made from Coffin Lids welded together.

We met two carvers that were working inside the Monument building. Many of us talked with them both for quite a while, learning more about them and what they were making. The Recipe Corner (from the Spring Rally)

Sweet Sour Dill Chunks (submitted by Kathy Yanke)

Med size or dill size cukes	8 dill heads
Onion slices	2 celery stalks
¹ / ₂ cup salt	4 cups sugar
2 cups water	1 quart vinegar

Wash and cut cukes in 1 inch chunks. To each jar, add 3-4 slices onion, 2 pieces of celery, and 2 dill heads. Dissolve sugar and salt in vinigar and water. Bring to a boil. Pour on while hot. Seal at once. Ready in 30 days. Boil the lids. Makes 4 guarts.

Frito Corn Salad (submitted by Caroline & Paul Munro)

2 cans corn, drained	1 cup mayo
1/2 cup chopped celery	1 1/2 cups shredded cheese
1/2 cup chopped onion	10 oz bag Chili Cheese Fritos
1/2 chopped bell pepper	

Mix together all ingredients except the Fritos. Refrigerate until ready to serve. Stir in Fritos until well blended when serving.

Scotch-A-Roo Bars AKA Special k bars (submitted by Kirk Stevenson)

6 cups rice crispys	1 cup Karo syrup
1 cup sugar	1 cup peanut butter

Bring sugar and Karo syrup slowly to a very soft boil or bubble Take off burner and add peanut butter and stir together In a large mixing bowl pour together and mix Use a pan to pack everything together

Put in refrigerator for 1 hour

Melt 3/4 package of butterscotch chips and 3/4 package of milk chocolate chips together on a low hear stirring frequently. Pour over bars and put back into the refrigerator for 1 hour to cool.

Bowtie Cucumber Salad (submitted by Judy Parizek)

1 ½ cup Miracle Whip	3/4 cup sugar
3 T. Vinegar	1 T. Schilling Salad Supreme
1 pound bow tie pasta (cooked, rinsed	4 cucumbers, peeled and sliced thin
& drained)	

Mix well & refrig 2-3 hours. Overnight is good too.

Broccoli Grape Salad (submitted by Terry Pfleghaar)

1 pound bacon, cut into 1-inch pieces	1/2 cup finely chopped red onion
1 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing	1/4 cup sugar
1 cup red and/or green seedless	7 cups fresh broccoli florets (1
grapes, halved	large head)

In a large skillet, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp. Drain bacon on paper towels and set aside.

In a large bowl, stir together mayonnaise, grapes, red onion and sugar. Add broccoli and two-thirds of the bacon; stir to coat. (Reserve remaining bacon in the refrigerator.) Chill the salad, covered, for at least 1 hour or up to 24 hours.

Sprinkle reserved bacon over salad just before serving.

Peanut Butter Cookies (submitted by Kay Olsson) makes 3 doz (if you can keep Chris out of the dough...)

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup shortening	³ t baking soda
± cup Oleo	¹ / ₂ cup sugar
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup peanut butter	¹ / ₂ † baking powder
1 egg	½ cup brown sugar, packed
1 ¼ cup flour	1 † salt

Mix shortening, oleo, peanut butter, sugars and egg together. Blend in remaining ingredients and chill.

Shape dough into 1 inch balls and place on lightly greased baking sheet. Flatten in criss cross pattern with a fork dipped in flour.

Bake 375 degrees for 10-12 minutes.

Italian Pasta Salad (submitted by Diana McHenry)

5 cups rice noodles	2 cups black olives, sliced in half
$1\frac{1}{2}$ cups cherry tomatoes, sliced in	$\frac{1}{4}$ cup fresh basil, chopped
half	$\frac{1}{4}$ cup flat leaf parsley, chopped
2 cups Mozzarella Cheese, small bits	3 Tbsp extra virgin olive oil
sliced in half	1 lemon, juice only
½ cup red onion, <i>diced</i>	1 tsp red pepper flakes
2 cups artichoke hearts	1 tsp sea salt
3 cups salami, chopped	1 tsp black pepper

Bring a pot of water to boil, and boil the rice pasta according to the package instructions. Typically between 10-14 minutes.

While the pasta is cooking, prepare the rest of the ingredients.

Once the pasta has cooked, drain from the water and allow to cool to room temperature.

In a large mixing bowl, combine the rice pasta with the cherry tomatoes, mozzarella cheese, red onion, artichoke hearts, olives and salami. Gently fold to combine.

Add the fresh basil, parsley, olive oil, lemon juice, red pepper flakes, salt, and black pepper. Stir to combine.

Serve immediately.

Note: If you are making this a day in advance, prepare everything but leave the noodles and dressing for just prior to serving.
