#### Following the Natchez Trace 2019

When planning our trip back to Minnesota we decided to take the Natchez Trace. The Trace is a dedicated historical highway covering 441 miles from Natchez, Mississippi to Nashville, Tennessee. The speed limit is 50mph. It makes for a leisurely drive. All along the way there are historical turnouts. Most you can get into with a trailer. We took time to get out and do a little hiking at some of the stops. We were traveling in the middle of March as there were appointments at home. I would recommend waiting till at least early April. There would be more foliage in bloom.



The trip started in Natchez. We camped right across the river in Vidalia, LA. In fact part of the campground was underwater. A trip to the visitor center to learn about the history of the area and grab a hop on/off bus tour. We toured Stanton Hall. A beautifully restored mansion. It was used in the mini-series "North and South".





After two nights in Natchez we moved North and took a side trip to Vicksburg, MS. I have always wanted to see the Military Park. We were not disappointed. The park nearly surrounds the city. It took a full day with a lunch break to get through it. The display of the USS Cairo (KAYrow) was worth the trip. This was an ironclad gunboat that sunk after hitting a torpedo (mine). It was buried in river silt, discovered and dug up in the 1960's. It is displayed in a cut-away format. You can walk inside the ship. Visited a little museum where Coca-cola was first bottled. Stayed at the Ameristar casino campground for 3 nights. Dinner one evening was at the Waterview Casino for crawfish and steak on the buffet.









Next stop was Trace State Park near Tupelo, MS for 3 nights. On the way we stopped to walk through a cypress bog trail. This was a great state park. What do you do in Tupelo.... spend a couple of days with the King of Rock and Roll. Did a tour of the Elvis Presley birth place museum and a day trip into Memphis to see Graceland.













After leaving Tupelo we worked our way North. Made a number of stops on the way to Nashville. Visited the site where Meriwether Lewis died and was buried on his way to Washington to deliver his report on the Lewis and Clark expedition. He spent an evening at an inn on the Trace

and that was the end of his trail. Kathy and I also walked part of the original Trace.







Finally made it to Nashville, Tennessee. Once there we met up with Ray and Judy Nickel, past president and first lady of the MN unit. On Friday Ray provided a tour of Nashville. Boy has it changed since we were there some 30 years ago. Lunch was at a food court in a farmers market. The gyros were great. The day concluded with a trip to the "Grand Ole Opry". Saturday was a road trip day. South to Murfreesboro and a tour of the Stones River National Battlefield.





Then on to the oldest legal distillery in the country in Lynchburg, TN....Jack Daniels. Got to sample some of their wares. The evening concluded with a great dinner prepared by Judy.



All things considered, a good way to start home.
