Time to Renew your Membership

You should have received a post card from the International Airstream Club office asking you to renew online a few weeks ago. There is also a new Members-Only Web Site that you can log into to renew your Membership. The Link for that Website is:

The first time you access the web site, it will prompt you to click on the "Forgot Password" link. The web site will send you an email to reset your password. Once you go through that process, you can log into the new web site.



Twining Rugs

Looking for something to do during the winter months I started twining rugs. The rugs are made from bedsheets cut into strips 1 inch wide. Vertical strips are installed on dowels (or nails) on the top and bottom of the frame. Then strips of bedsheets are woven through the vertical strips from right to left. Colors of bedsheets and different patterns give an infinite amount of interesting rugs. Using u-tube, ("rug twining"), will give instructions on making or buying a frame, and instructions on making a rug. Below or some picture of the rug making process and finished rugs.

For example, what modifications have you made or had done to your Airstream? Something simple like installing an extra shelf, replacing furniture with something that works better for you, etc.



Years ago, we were given a recipe booklet by Kay's mom. Her parents were at the 1983 International Rally in Duluth, and one of the things they brought home was this recipe booklet.

Following are two more recipes from this booklet.

Duluth Arena Auditorium June 29th and 30th, 1983 Compliments of Minnesota Power

Oatmeal Wheat Bread

1 cup whole wheat flour 1/4 cup warm water

1/2 cup quick-cooking rolled 1-1/2 to 2 cups all-purpose

oats flour

1/3 cup dark molasses Corn meal

1/4 cup shortening Milk

3/4 cup water Rolled oats

1 packet dry yeast

Combine whole wheat flour, oats, molasses and shortening in mixing bowl. Microwave water (full power) until boiling. Stir into bowl; cool to warm temperature. Stir yeast into warm water. Blend into cooled mixture. Stir in flour very gradually to make a very stiff dough. Knead on well-floured surface until smooth, about 5 minutes. Return to greased bowl. Cover. Let rise in warm place until light and doubled in size, about 1 hour. Shape into ball; cover with bowl. Let rest 15 minutes.

Butter a 10-inch pie plate or microwave baking sheet. Sprinkle with corn meal. Shape dough into a 15-inch strip. Brush lightly with milk. Roll in oats to coat heavily. Shape into ring on prepared pan. Pinch edges together. Place greased glass in center. Let rise in warm place until light, 45 to 60 minutes. Sprinkle top lightly with corn meal.

Microwave at 1/2 power 6 minutes, rotating 1/2 turn after 3 minutes. Change power level to full power. Microwave 4 to 6 minutes, until top springs back when touched lightly. Let stand 10 minutes. Remove bread; cool on rack.

Makes 1 Loaf

Quick Pecan Breakfast Ring

1/2 cup butter 3 pkgs. refrigerated 1 cup dark brown sugar Buttermilk Biscuits

1 cup chopped pecans

Microwave butter and sugar to a boil on High for 2 minutes. Pour half of syrup and pecans in botton of angel food cake pan. Stand the biscuits on edge around tube pan. Cover top with the other half of syrup and nuts. Bake at 350° for 35 to 40 minutes or until done. Let rest in pan 5 minutes. Invert on platter. Serve warm.

Pumpkin Nut Bread

1 cup all-purpose flour 3/4 cup sugar (half packed brown sugar if desired)

l tsp. baking powder

l tsp. soda l tsp. salt 2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice or cinnamon

1/2 cup cooking oil

2 eggs

1/2 cup chopped nuts, optional
1 cup cooked or canned pumpkir

Blend ingredients in mixing bowl at low speed 15 seconds; beat at medium speed 1 minute. Spread batter in 8 to 10 cup ring pan. Center pan on inverted saucer in oven. Microwave at 1/2 power 6 to 9 minutes, rotating 1/4 turn every 3 minutes. Increase power to full power. Microwave 2 to 5 minutes. Let stand 5 to 10 minutes before removing from dish.

Variations:

Carrot Nut Bread: Substitute 1-1/2 cups shredded carrots for the pumpkin.

Zucchini Bread: Substitute 1-1/2 cups shredded, unpared zucchini for the pumpkin.

Applesauce Bread: Substitute I cup sweetened applesauce for the pumpkin.

Nut Bread: Mix 1 T. lemon juice and enough milk to make 1/2 cup; substitute for pumpkin. Increase nuts to 1 cup.

Newsletter Editor Ramblings

While heading out to the truck to go to a Doctor's appointment several weeks ago, we discovered one of the aluminum propane tanks on Little Girl was sitting on the ground, and the other one was missing (as in stolen). During the night, someone took both tanks off the trailer, discovered that one was empty, and that other one had propane in it. We figure it was about $\frac{3}{4}$ full. So, they took the full tank and left the empty one sitting on the ground. Someone interested in the propane and not the aluminum tanks apparently...

Completed a police report, and the officer told us that in general, the crime rate for stolen property was up over the last few months. He asked us if we had any security cameras, and of course we did not. So, ...

Over the next 2 weeks, we installed a dusk to dawn security light on the shelter where we park the Airstream. It's located on the front of the shelter, and lights up the side yard and front of the trailer quite nicely. We also installed a pair of security cameras. One covers the front of the trailer and the side yard between the driveway and the trailer, and the second one covers the starboard (curb side) side of the trailer, which is the side away from the house. They both work quite nicely, and trigger when we walk into range, but for the most part, do not trigger on Ricky (our puppy) or bunnies. If Ricky prowls around the tongue of the trailer long enough, the camera will trigger on him and start recording, but that only seems to happen if he is there moving around for 30 seconds or longer. And like most security camera systems, we get an alert on our phones when they detect motion. We chose the Blink system from Amazon as it has local storage without a need to subscribe to a cloud service to store video clips.

The bright spot here (if there is one), is we were given the aluminum propane tanks a few years ago. And, we were thinking about replacing them anyway to get

tanks with built-in gauges so we can keep a better eye on how much propane we have. To that end, we decided to buy two new 30 lb aluminum tanks with built-in gauges for our joint Christmas Present to each other. Rest assured; they will be locked onto the trailer once we install them in the spring. We already have the new padlock!
