Please Be Aware!



Fraudulent emails are happening all across the Club. A way to tell if the email is a fraud is to look at the actual email address used to send the message. Even though it states the officer's name, you can tell by the email address used to send the email if it is bogus. An example would be "Brad Briggs presidentt1@adminbod.co>." It is the part enclosed by the <> symbols that is important. When you are looking at the email on a phone, the address surrounded by the <> characters is not shown. Only when you select reply or forward is this information typically displayed. If you hit reply to see this information, do not hit send but delete it.

The Region 4 officers' and chairpersons' emails are listed on the front page of this Newsletter. These are the addresses from which actual emails will be sent, and the emails of your Local Club Officers are probably listed on their respective websites also.

The technical term for this criminal behavior is Spoofing. It is not a hacked email account. Hacked email accounts would show the actual email address of the sender. Spoofers are getting names and officer positions from the websites and send emails posing as the officer. As an example, a NOVA officer received a spoofed email that appeared to be from the president and was nearly hoodwinked. A quick phone call saved the day. Below is an example of a spoofed email from the NOVA Local Club:

Thank you Thank you Ineeded you to kindly purchase 5pcs x \$100 of either eBay, Walmart or Target or Steam wallet gift cards which totals \$500 for the donation pledged to Veterans at Hospice & Palliative Care. I will be liable for reimbursement.

You can purchase them at any Kohl's, CVS, Kwik, Macy's, Walmart, or Walgreen's Store. Due to the time frame of the pledge, I will be glad if you get them early enough today.

E-mail me immediately you buy them for instructions how to get them across. Let me know if a check will be fine for reimbursement. Thank you.

Airstream Improvements

TV Upgrade

I was disappointed with the original Samsung TV installed in my 2018 Airstream 27FB. I searched for airstream addicts and found a discussion about making the upgrade, but short on a satisfactory method. The critical aspect of this change is the mounting bracket. In my case (in a Globetrotter), the mounting bracket is recessed in a pocket in the lounge cabinet that houses the refrigerator. I did not want to change the TV bracket due to the unique cabinet mounting base. The new TV had a larger pitch on the mounting attachments than the



original TV (200mm vs. 100mm). I purchased an adapter bracket to both change the mounting attachment spacing and shifted the TV inboard.

The new LG TV has a tuner that is a cut above (better station reception) and is a smart TV if you have an Internet source such as a hot spot.

Finally, I kept the Samsung TV in the bedroom, which uses a different remote. Having unalike brands eliminated, turning both TVs on inadvertently. The picture quality is far superior to the original TV. Overall, this was a relatively low-cost and straightforward upgrade.


SPOTLIGHT: WHERE WE ARE GOING

Vintage Travel Trailer Rally at the Gilmore

Last year with so many events being canceled, we got together with some great friends and created our own little event. We were familiar with the Gilmore Car Museum and its beautiful 90-acre grounds, so we gave them a call. As it turns out, they are not only the country's largest automobile museum - they are also considered a park!

With the museum staff's help, we hosted 12 Airstreams for a weekend and enjoyed the museum's displays, grounds, and special events. Everyone wanted to do it again!

The museum is very proud of its campus, and partially due to our event's success, they will be hosting a vintage travel trailer rally Saturday, May 15th, 2021. Airstreams of all ages will be featured in this year's event. Additionally, the museum will host the "Corks and Crafts Season Opener" wine and craft beer tasting event on the same Saturday.

We will be helping the museum reach out to WBCCI Airstream club members, Tin Can Tourists, and other camping clubs for this event.

Check out the museum's website at <u>GilmoreCarMuseum.org</u> to get a feel for all the museum has to offer. Search for "Vintage Travel Trailer Rally" to check out the details. If you plan to attend Saturday and Saturday night, only you can register online via the museum's website. Otherwise, call the number list above.

What to expect – The Gilmore is one of Michigan's best examples of how to reopen under Covid-19 guidelines, so your safety is their top priority. The museum has ~3 miles of paved roads along with beautiful buildings and barns to house their car collections. A 1950's diner serves food during museum and special event hours.

Saturday's vintage (25 years +) event will be held on the main showgrounds, and longer-term camping and Airstreams will be parked near their oval track. This rally is a PRIMITIVE camping event with NO 110 V power or other hookups available (Quiet inverter type generators will be allowed during limited daytime hours). After preregistration (online or by phone), you will check-in at the museum entrance upon arrival. A daily museum entry fee is requested if you plan to take advantage of the museum or any special events beyond basic camping.


National Parks and Historic Sites in Region 4

Our Region 4 is blessed with many national parks and historic sites that make great home bases for using your Airstream. Because our region includes the states of Michigan, Ohio, and West Virginia, no park or site is too far away, and they make great escapes for three- or four-day weekend trips. The National Park's Senior Pass makes visiting these protected areas much more affordable, too. For more information on the Senior Pass, visit https://www.nps.gov/planyourvisit/senior-pass-changes.htm. When you think about places to go and things to do as travel starts up again this spring, consider the following as possible locations for your next get-away or rally.

<u>In Michigan</u> (Note that "Below the Bridge" is WBAC Region 4 and "Above the Bridge" is WBAC Region 7)

Michigan's National Park is the Isle Royale National Park which resides in the middle of Lake Superior. The isolated island is rugged and provides for solitude as well as adventures for backpackers, hikers, boaters, kayakers, canoeists, and scuba divers. Open from April 15 to November 1 annually, this trip is perfect for the Midwest's hot summers.



Figuring out how to travel to the park is half the fun. Whether you choose a ferry or seaplane, you have options from Michigan and Minnesota. At the website, nps.gov/isro/planyourvisit/directions.htm, you can see additional transportation directions. This picture details different departure and arrival points.

As you can see from the picture, leaving from the Upper Peninsula (which is actually in Region 7) can be accomplished from the Keweenaw (pronounced KEY-winawe) Peninsula. The Keweenaw itself has many things to see and do related to copper mining in the area. Ft. Wilkins, a Michigan State Park, is located on the Peninsula and might make a good base for the Airstream. In Ohio

Ohio is blessed with many historic parks, memorials, and monuments--many of which were erected because of the eight U.S. Presidents who called Ohio home. The one national park does reside in the northeastern part of the

state, Cuyahoga Valley National Park, a short distance from Cleveland and Akron. The park boasts many native plants and wildlife as the Cuyahoga River winds through the park. The historic route of the Ohio & Erie Canal's towpath can also be experienced while in the park by simply walking or riding a bike on the Towpath Trail along the canal. Periodically, there are also train trips that occur within the park as well. See Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad at https://www.cvsr.org/.

Established in 1974 as the Cuyahoga Valley National Recreation Area, it was later designated as a national park in 2000. Most visitors to the park want to explore the outdoors--hiking and biking-taking advantage of the miles and miles of trails that take you through scenery that varies from marshy wetlands to mossy limestone ledges. There are even a few waterfalls! There are many things to see and do around Peninsula, Ohio, including museums and shops. 


In West Virginia

Ah, the natural beauty of West Virginia! There is so much to see and do in this state, yet why is it we always seem to be driving through it versus actually making it a camping weekend? One of the most beautiful areas, the New River Gorge National Park and Preserve, is not far from our 2021 Region 4 Rally, May 19-23, 2021 - "Peace, Love, and Almost Heaven!" (See the registration in this Newsletter.)

Established in 1978, the New River Gorge National River was redesignated as the New River Gorge National Park and Preserve in 2021. The park encompasses over 70,000 acres of land along 53 miles of the New River from Bluestone Dam to Hawk's Nest Lake. A rugged, whitewater river flowing northward through deep and spectacular canyons, the New River is among the oldest rivers on Earth. The New River has carved and continues to cut the deepest and longest river gorge in the Appalachian Mountains. Visitors to this national park will find hiking trails, rafting excursions, biking on rail trails, and simply spectacular scenery. It is important to note that this national park has a diversity of plants; it contains the most diverse flora of any river gorge in the south and central Appalachian Mountains. The forests are some of the oldest and most varied in the world. All types of habitats can be found here, including endangered species. Historically, one can learn about the railroads and coal mining and how families in those



industries lived and worked by visiting area museums. The Thurmond Depot is one such place (https://www.nps.gov/neri/planyourvisit/thurmond.htm) And, if you like birding, this is a birder's dream (https://www.nps.gov/neri/learn/nature/birds.htm).

Cabbage, Potato, and Smoked Sausage Skillet Supper

TOTAL TIME: Prep/Total Time: 1 hr. YIELD: serves 4.

Ingredients

- $\frac{1}{2}$ large head of cabbage, roughly chopped (or an entire small one)
- 1 large mild onion, chopped
- 1 lb. smoked sausage, cut into 1/2-inch circles
- 3 -4 large potatoes, scrubbed and cut into 1/4-inch slices
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 dash seasoning salt
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- 1 dash pepper3 sweet pickles plus 1 teaspoon juice

Directions

Heat the pan and add onion, smoked sausage, and potatoes. Season with the seasoned salt lightly (because the smoked sausage is salty enough), and add the paprika. Cook and stir over medium heat until potatoes are cooked about halfway through.

Next, add the chopped cabbage and one cup of chicken broth. Cook, stirring occasionally until cabbage is crisptender and most of the liquid evaporates.

Frank's Kraut Reuben Pretzel Bites

TOTAL TIME: Prep/Total Time: 40 min. YIELD: 8-12 servings.

Ingredients

- ½-pound corned beef, thinly shaved
- ½-cup Swiss cheese
- ½-cup Frank's Kraut drained and chopped
- 1-pound pizza dough, at room temperature
- ½-cup baking soda
- 4 cups water
- Coarse salt, for topping
- Melted butter, for finishing
- Thousand island dressing, for serving 24 grape tomatoes (about 1 pint)

Directions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

In a small pot, heat water, and baking soda over low heat.

In a bowl, mix together corned beef, cheese, and kraut.

Divide dough into four pieces. Roll each piece into a 2-foot rope and cut it into 2-inch sections.

Flatten dough pieces and fill each with a teaspoon of kraut mixture. Pinch closed to ensure a tight seal.

Place filled dough balls into baking soda water for 10 seconds before transferring to a baking sheet. Top with coarse salt and bake for 20 minutes.

Brush pretzel bites with melted butter and serve with thousand island dressing.
