May 6th - 9th - Point of Rocks campground in Prescott, call (928) 445-9018, identify as Arizona Airstream Club for your site. There is no need to register with AAC.

June 3rd - 6th - Dolores River Campground, Call (970) 882-7761, get on the waitlist. You may also camp at The Views Campground or other area campgrounds and drive to our rally activities. Register with Arizona Airstream Club when you get your site.

July 2nd - 5th, Flagstaff 4th of July gathering. Call Woody Mountain Campground, (928) 774-7727, then register with Arizona Airstream Club.

August 12th - 15th, Williams Railside Ranch Rally. Call (928) 635-4077, get your site and optional AAC rail car pass, then register with Arizona Airstream Club.

September 16th - 19th - Bonita campground will likely be announced as a replacement for our Covid-cancelled group site at Sunset Crater. You will need to get your own site, federal discounts apply. Many of us intend to camp there.

In Memoriam

Celebrating a Life Well Lived, 1923 – 2021, Sam Engelman #10076, from Milford Township Pennsylvania.

Sam served in the US Navy, the Pacific Theatre during WWII. Following the war, he remained in China to help them rebuild from the ravages of brutal wars with Japan, where destruction of irrigation and transportation infrastructure left large populations displaced, undernourished and on the brink of civil war. After helping Nationalist China repatriate ports, railways, dams, and rivers, and rebuild stability, Sam returned to the States to join the Firestone Tire and Rubber Plant where he worked for many years. He was a founding member of The WBCCI Keystone Pennsylvania Unit.

He and his wife Ruth toured the country for five years as Airstream full-timers at the beginning of their retirement before settling down in Mesa Arizona and joining Arizona Airstream Club. Sam and Ruth loved attending International, attending AAC luncheons and traveling in their Airstream to visit their daughter in California, their son in Colorado, along with six grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. Ruth, his wife of 56 years, passed away in 2004. Sam collected John Deere memorabilia, was an accomplished square dancer, and loved to hike.
