
I must say with 18 rigs at our state rally it is looking good for our future rallies, stay tuned in because we have more planned!! Be safe and see you down the road.

#### Favorite Apps for Camping, Part Four Weather, Safety and Others —Steve and Becky Padgett (WBCCI #3160)

We discussed navigation, campground and restaurant apps for the smartphone in our first three articles. We will look at weather, safety and a few miscellaneous favorites in this, our fourth installment of apps for camping.

There are some mixed feelings when it comes to weather apps. The two leaders of the pack are WeatherBug and The Weather Channel. Both provide adequate weather information and weather maps. The big difference may be in the ads. The Weather Channel seems to have more "click-bait" type ads than WeatherBug.

We use the AccuWeather app when camping because it projects out 15 days instead of the normal 10. While meteorologists are quick to say forecasts out that far are not reliable, they can give you a feeling about weather trends.

DarkSky is an amazing hyperlocal weather app. DarkSky's future is fuzzy since it was recently purchased by Apple. Speculation is that DarkSky's proprietary code will be incorporated into the iPhone's operating system.

Since we live in Alabama, we also have the National Weather Service's Hurricane Tracker app. You never know when you need to pay attention to the tropics.

Another group of apps that Airstreamers should have on their smartphones is medical. Most of these apps are directly related to your physicians, insurance providers and pharmacies you use. In addition to these "must have" apps, there are some medical related apps that deserve a place on your phone.

First Aid is an app published by the American Red Cross. It is a great first resource for dealing with both life threatening and

non life threatening issues. This app will also help you find the nearest hospital and call 911 in emergencies.

Pet First Aid is another app from the American Red Cross. As its name states, this app focuses on the health of your pets. A feature that pet-owning Airstreamers will appreciate is that the app will help you find a veterinarian and nearby vet hospitals.

There are two more apps we want to highlight. They are 1Password and AnyList.

We all know we need to use complex and hard to guess passwords for our protection. The problem is that good passwords are hard to remember. This is where a trusted password program helps.

For security reasons, we don't know any of our passwords, but they are highly encrypted and stored in 1Password. All we have to remember is our one password needed to access this app. We also store medical files and important documents in this program. We pay for the premium version of this program so that we have a shared secured database between our phones. That means we always have the current passwords and important documents on both of our phones, our tablets and laptop computer.

AnyList is another program that is helpful to us while on the road and at home. As the name implies, it allows users to create shopping and other lists. We pay for their premium service because it allows us to share lists in real time. That means if one adds something to a list or crosses off something, the other person instantly sees that action on his or her phone. That is handy when you are trying to quickly shop by splitting up and going to opposite ends of the store. It is amazing how many lists you will create in this program.

We are positive that you have some apps that you want to share with the club. It is easy to do so and our members would appreciate learning about the apps that help make your Airstream adventures better.

#### Athens Old Time Fiddlers Rally

Rally in Athens, Alabama for the 54th Tennessee Valley Old Time Fiddlers Convention. Early parking for the volunteers available on September 27. The Airstream rally starts on September 28 with welcome dinner. Upon arrival, sign up for tours to area destinations. A free concert opens the convention on September 30. The \$55/person rally fee includes two-day convention entrance fee, and two evenings of featured performances by headliner entertainers. Competitions include playing instruments, singing and dancing. Craft and food concessions are found throughout campus. Exclusive WBAC parking includes 20 AMP power, water and one (1) pump out for \$25/night located within 3/10 mile of the main venue. Parking reservations requires four (4) night minimum. Rally attendees are also welcome to stay at nearby RV Parks with full hook ups. Rally reservations and deposits are required by August 15.
