



Participating in the Pfizer Covid Vaccine Trial

Nothing interrupted our Airstream camping adventures for the past year like the Covid pandemic and subsequent lockdown and school closures. Rallies were cancelled and people avoided social interactions for fear of catching the disease. Not one to sit about whining, I wanted to do my part in putting an end to the madness. My friends thought I was bonkers to participate in the Pfizer Covid vaccine trial, but given the news of the vaccine's 95% efficacy, I was quite chuffed I did my bit. I signed up with Anaheim Clinical Trials, slapped on an N95 mask and ventured down to volunteer in October. I returned three weeks later for the second shot. The visits took three hours each and involved a long health questionnaire, a nasal swab for Covid, and the blood test for antibodies. I was paid \$125 per visit for my time and travel and logged any symptoms in an online diary each week. At the time, I did not know if I got the vaccine or the placebo, since it was a double blind trial, whereby neither the researchers nor the volunteers know who is in which arm of the study.

In January, I was unblinded in the trial, since the vaccine was approved for emergency use in December and was now being offered to the public. I got a call and was told that I had received the placebo originally, so they offered me the vaccine. After the vaccine shot, I had a bit of a sore arm, like getting a flu shot, but no other side effects such as fever or body aches that about 40% of people have reported. I joined the "crossover study" to track long term effects for the next 18 months. It's been an interesting experience and I'm so glad the vaccines are finally getting into people's arms with more options coming up for approval this year. I share this story in the hopes of easing the fears of anyone who might be nervous about getting the vaccine or despondent that Covid will go on forever. I am hoping that 2021 brings us a bit more normality and we can get back out there for rallies and happy hours.





Recipe: Bourbon Pecan Pie

This month we celebrated Martin Luther King Day. Although he is famous for his civil rights contributions, he was also rumored to love a good bourbon pecan pie. This recipe from the NYT takes a classic and simple recipe and gives it a Southern kick with a little bourbon! You do need both light and dark corn syrup for this – using only one or the other will change the pie's flavor.

What you need:

3 eggs, lightly beaten	2 tablespoons bourbon
1 cup granulated sugar	1 teaspoon vanilla extract
(can be reduced to ½ cup and using light brown sugar works too) ½ cup light corn syrup	¼ teaspoon salt
	1 unbaked 9-inch pie shell
	1 ¼ cups coarsely chopped pecans
½ cup dark corn syrup	
1/3 cup unsalted butter, melted	

What you do:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Mix together eggs, sugar, corn syrups, butter, bourbon, vanilla and salt until well blended.

Prick the sides and bottom of the pie shell with a fork at 1/2-inch intervals. Spread the pecans on the bottom and pour the mixture over them. Bake for 35 to 45 minutes, until just set around the edges but still slightly loose in the center. (It will continue to set as it cools.)


Place on a rack to cool slightly.

Part 2: Organization Ideas

6. Create a reminder calendar for dated items

Some items that get stored away have servicing dates. For many of us, it's out-of-sight, out-of-mind so we fail to keep them in good shape. Things like fire extinguishers, First Aid medicine, and even food will go out of date. Whether you use a paper calendar or a reminder system on your phone, it's worth it to create some kind of alarm system letting you know that some items in storage need to be serviced.

7. Consider doing a yearly stock check to update your inventory records.

During emergencies or when others are on board items may get used and not logged. It's also good to make sure that your inventory is okay. If you can prevent something from molding or rusting it's a good thing!

8. Remove cardboard.

Cockroaches lay eggs in corrugated cardboard so remove all cardboard packaging before the contents come on your boat. Flat cardboard and books have book bugs. They're super tiny but none-the-less they are bugs. If you don't want bugs don't have any cardboard.

9. Don't keep your inventory list in the cloud!

If you're at sea and you can't get Internet access you're in trouble. Keep your inventory list on your computer hard drive and make a print copy to have on hand.

10. Be creative! Make extra space by installing storage options behind doors, etc.

Do a Google search for tiny homes, RV or boat storage ideas. There are loads of useful ways to create storage space from thin air. Examples include putting racks behind doors, using hanging shoe holders in creative ways, making bedside hanging holders and creating storage in areas above you rather than below.

11. Look for collapsible or nesting style items that can be reduced in size when not in use.

Examples include Magma Galley Pots and Pans and a collapsible bucket. The Magma set has five pots, pans, and lids that take up the small space of only 12" by 6" high!

12. Have regular culling sessions.

At least twice a year we go through all our cupboards and cabinets getting rid of anything that we haven't used in the last six months. We give anything that still works to a local charity and trash anything that's broken or ruined. If you're in an area with many cruisers there's usually a daily VHF net where cruisers offer 'Treasures Of The Bilge'. You can announce your treasures and often make a bit of money from them.
