The weather cooperated, for the most part, and the crowd was very enthusiastic. Attendance was very low at around 60 trailers. That's something we need to work on.

From the Second Vice President

Live and Learn

This past summer, I didn't listen to my wife, Jane, when she said, "I smell a funny odor," as we were backing into a boon-docking site at a national park. When I asked her what she smelled, she said "It smells like Clorox or something similar." The next morning, Jane went to the refrigerator to fix breakfast and noticed the refrigerator and all of its contents were hot. Needless to say, we lost all of our food for the week. We were NOT happy campers!



Fast forward into the next month....I remembered seeing an Amish replacement unit for refrigerators on the web. After doing some additional Internet investigation, I found the manufacturer outside of Shipshewana, Indiana. After emailing the Amish owner, he suggested two options that allow you to keep the original refrigerator cabinet while just replacing the cooling unit: 1) replace the unit with a like unit that runs off gas and electricity called an absorption unit, or 2) replace the unit with a compressor model like a home refrigerator. The compressor model came in 12 volt dc or 110 volt ac versions.

I then needed to make a decision after weighing the pros and cons. I decided to select the compressor model and here is why. The pros of the compressor model are it cools quicker, and the trailer does not need to be level, including when traveling on uneven roads. The cons of the compressor model are that it runs on electricity only, which can make boon-docking difficult. In addition, there is a hum to the refrigerator like your residential refrigerator, which is a little more noticeable. The costs for the absorption unit and the 110 volt ac models were nearly the same. The cost for the compressor 12 volt dc model was about one hundred dollars higher. I chose the 12 volt model hoping that boon-docking might be easier because it would be more efficient running off of trailer house batteries.

As with all things Airstream, only time will tell if this option was the best one for us. Stay tuned for the next article as we try out boon-docking with the new refrigerator and report back to you.
