

The Work Rally at Santa's Hide-A-Way Hollow May 13-16, 2021

In early May, eighteen Airstreamers from Region 4 met for three days at the North Pole to help get Wally's Christmas Tree Farm ready for the arrival of children. We worked hard, ate well, and camped comfortably.

Over the last two years, Region 4 has worked with Santa's Hide-A-Way Hollow in Middlefield, Ohio, to develop an area that can be used as a cooling retreat for attendees that need a place to rest. We have converted an Airstream into "The North Pole Cinema." The Airstream has seating for eight in a newly airconditioned space. The children will stay cool while watching "Christmas Vacation" on a 75-inch flat-screen!



While dedicated crews were installing the new A/C and electrical systems on the Airstream, others performed various other essential tasks. These jobs included moving a Pepsi trailer under a new shelter, mowing and trimming many overgrown areas, repairing and removing fencing, uprighting two bus stops, repairing a toy soldier guard shack, constructing a pad and placing a new restroom trailer, moving and decorating an old station wagon, making curtains and pillows for the Airstream, and finally painting a helipad! We were also greatly assisted by our crew, who provided and prepped breakfast, lunch, and dinner for everyone.



Santa was very impressed with all of the excellent work done and is waiting for clearance from the health care providers so the seriously ill kids can return.

RECIPES FOR THE ROAD

Using An Air Fryer

While making our Civil War Battle Sites tour the past few weeks, Brad and I recently met up with his cousin and wife, Robert and Paula Frazier, from Harrisonburg, Virginia. When we get together, it doesn't take long for the conversation to move toward cooking as they are both excellent in the kitchen. I asked Robert what his latest kitchen appliance was, and without hesitation, he said, "air fryer" and looked at me like I was nuts for not having one. Of course, my curiosity was peaked, and he took some time to share how much he is enjoying cooking with one and how his food tastes great and is prepared healthier, in his opinion.

According to the website "How Stuff Works" (https://recipes.howstuffworks.com/tools-and-techniques/air-fryers.htm), air fryers are the hottest small appliance and a "must-have" for home cooks. The author goes on to share that "An oven that promises crispy foods, less fat and quick heating times may sound like a far-fetched miracle, but it's not these days. We're talking about air fryers."

When cooking with an air fryer, it is best to "stick with dry-seasoned items — from baked potatoes and bacon to mozzarella sticks and cookies. According to *Food Network*, some of the most unexpected air-fry-friendly foods include hard-boiled eggs, croutons, quiche, and even ravioli."

So, for those of you who have an air fryer or who are willing to add another few pounds to your Airstream with another appliance, these healthy recipes are for you! Let me know if you have some additional Air Fryer recipes you would like to share in our next newsletter!

AIR FRYER CRISPY FISH FILLETS (HOMEMADE)

There are so many options for the breading that come out crispy and accommodate different dietary choices. We love them all, each giving a slightly different texture and flavor.

Lots of factors influence how the fish filets cook. They all vary in size and thickness, so you'll have to adjust timing. All air fryers are different, and some cook much hotter than others. Once you cook your first batch, you'll know more about what works for your model of air fryer and the size of the food.

Make sure to spray the filets to thoroughly coat all the dry spots of breading, or else it may cook up dry and crunchy instead of crispy. Want to know what oils and sprayers are best for an air fryer? This <u>article is a great write-up</u>.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound (454 g) white fish fillets (cod, halibut, tilapia, etc.)
- 1 teaspoon (5 ml) kosher salt, or to taste
- 1/2 teaspoon (2.5 ml) black pepper, or to taste
- 1 teaspoon (5 ml) garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon (5 ml) paprika
- 1-2 cups (60-120 g) breading of choice *breadcrumbs*, *panko*, *crushed pork rinds*, *or almond flour*
- 1 egg, or more if needed
- Cooking Spray

Air Fryer Parchment Paper (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat the Air Fryer at 380°F/193°C for 4 minutes.
- 2. If using frozen filets, make sure to thaw first. Cut fish filets in half if needed. Make sure they are evenly sized so they'll cook consistently. The thicker they are, the longer they will take to cook.

Pat the filets dry. Lightly oil the filets and then season with salt, black pepper, garlic powder, and paprika.

- 3. Put the breading in a shallow bowl. In another bowl, beat the eggs.
 - Dip the fillets in the egg, shaking off excess egg. Dredge the filets in your breading of choice. Press fillets into the bowl of breading so that they thoroughly coat the fillets. Repeat this process for all fish pieces.
- 4. Line air fryer basket or tray with <u>perforated parchment paper</u> (highly recommended if you don't have perforated parchment paper, make sure to spray with oil generously to coat the air fryer basket). Lightly spray parchment paper with oil spray.
 - Lay coated fish in a single layer on the parchment (cook in batches if needed). Generously spray all sides of the breaded filets with oil spray to cover any dry spots.
- 5. Air Fry at 380°F/193°C for 8-14 minutes, depending on the size and thickness of your filets. After 6 minutes, flip the filets. Lightly spray any dry spots than then continue cooking for the remaining time or until they are crispy brown and the fish is cooked through.

Serve with your favorite dip: tartar sauce, mustard, aioli, etc.



Air Fryer Chicken Parmesan

YIELDS: 4 SERVINGS PREP TIME: 0 HOURS 10 MINS TOTAL TIME: 0 HOURS 50 MINS

INGREDIENTS

- 2 large boneless chicken breasts
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/3 c. all-purpose flour
- 2 large eggs
- 1 c. panko bread crumbs
- 1/4 c. freshly grated Parmesan
- 1 tsp. dried oregano
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 c. marinara sauce
- 1 c. shredded mozzarella
- Freshly chopped parsley for garnish



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Carefully buttery chicken by cutting in half widthwise to create 4 thin pieces of chicken. Season on both sides with salt and pepper.
- 2. Prepare dredging station: Place flour in a shallow bowl and season with a large pinch of salt and pepper. Place eggs in a second bowl and beat. In a third bowl, combine breadcrumbs, Parmesan, oregano, garlic powder, and red pepper flakes.
- 3. Working with one piece of a chicken at a time, coat in flour, dip in eggs, and finally press into the panko mixture, making sure both sides are coated well.
- 4. Working in batches as necessary, place chicken in the basket of air fryer and cook at 400° for 5 minutes on each side. Top chicken with sauce and mozzarella and cook at 400° for 3minutes more or until cheese is melty and golden.
- 5. Garnish with parsley to serve
