From the Second Vice President

Update on our 12V Compressor Refrigerator Conversion

In the Fall 2018 issue of the WBAC *Region 4 Newsletter*, I wrote to you about converting our Airstream refrigerator to a 12V compressor unit. I would like to give you an update on our experience with this conversion.



Last March we spent a week in Florida. The trip was great and the Airstream and refrigerator worked well-until our last day of traveling home! Unfortunately, the refrigerator stopped cooling even though the compressor was still running. Thankfully, we were close enough to home so we did not lose any food this time around.

Once home I emailed the place where we had the refrigerator converted and explained what had happened. I got a quick response and was told that they would take care of the problem. In fact, they said that they would replace the whole unit just to make sure the issue was taken care of.

Coincidentally, we had already planned on attending the NOVA RV/MH Museum Rally at Eby Pines near Bristol, Indiana, during the first week in April. This rally was only 20 miles from and on the way to the place where the repairs were to be made. There are silver linings at times--this was one!

My appointment was for 6 a.m., and I arrived just in time. As soon as my old unit was removed, the owner's son took it to test it out to see what went wrong. Two and a half hours later, a new unit was installed and thoroughly tested, and I was on my way to the rally in plenty of time.

A few days later I heard back from them via email. They found that there was a bad weld on the compressor. It stopped cooling because the coolant had leaked out. They cheerfully and completely covered the repair under warranty and sincerely expressed their disappointment and regretted that we had a problem with the refrigerator.

We have yet to boon dock with the converted refrigerator, so I cannot report on how well it does in this situation. However, I can say that I have run the refrigerator while the Airstream was sitting in the driveway for three days on several occasions and the house batteries kept a charge of more than 12V. I do have a 45-watt solar panel on the Airstream roof to help with charging the batteries during the day. This latest time the weather was mostly sunny and the highs were in the low 70's. Realizing that in this situation we were not using any other 12V lights or the water pump as we would if we were boon docking--I do find this very promising!

SPOTLIGHT: WHERE WE HAVE BEEN

NOVA RALLY: The Blue, The Grey and the Silver

Rally Hosts: Ella and Tom Brown



Early in April, as the flowering trees bloomed in Pennsylvania, 7 Airstreams (and one SOB) gathered at Pine Grove Furnace State Park, for a rally at Gettysburg. With newly redone campsites and bath house, the State Park furnished us with beautiful headquarters for the rally: hiking trails, two lakes, and biking trails – all located at the northern tip of the Blue Ridge Mountains and just 18 miles from Gettysburg.

On the first night we gathered for a short talk from host (and Gettysburg enthusiast) Tom Brown who explained the events leading up to the battle and the placement of the armies on the battle's eve. In our own outdoor theater, we watched the beginning of the movie "Gettysburg" based on Jeff Sharrah's book "The Killer Angels."



On the first touring day we began delving into Gettysburg history at the Visitor's Center viewing the film "A New Birth of Freedom", narrated by Morgan Freeman, and visiting the famous Cyclorama of Pickett's Charge. This massive oil-on-canvas painting is a three-dimensional effect that places the viewer in the center of this great historic scene that was so key in the Gettysburg story.



In the afternoon we reported to SegTours of Gettysburg where we cashed in our 30% discount Groupons for a 2-hour drive around the battlefield. First, we all had to complete Segway training on an indoor obstacle course, and then we headed out in a single-file brigade. Armed with headphones linked to our guide we navigated the road up to Culp's Hill and back through the city streets of Gettysburg. Although most of us were new to Segway travel, we all thoroughly enjoyed this intimate view of the Battlefield.

That evening we continued watching our "Gettysburg" movie, and before we went to bed, made plans for touring the battlefield in the morning.





In a variety of vehicles, armed with audio tour guides, maps, and phone apps, we set out to drive the Battlefield road. By the end of the day we were well scattered, but managed to all meet up for a drive into the town of Carlisle and a Red Robin Restaurant for dinner.

Our last full day began with breakfast at the famous Lincoln's Diner in downtown Gettysburg. Again, we separated with some returning to the Visitor Center to tour the museum, and some heading back out to complete the Battlefield tour.

At 2:00 a group met up at the Virginia Memorial for a hike following Pickett's Charge across an open field to the High Water Mark. On the other side drivers picked up the hikers, and we all drove to The National Soldier's Cemetery where President Lincoln delivered his Gettysburg Address. Tom, our Gettysburg historian, recapped the message and the meaning of this historic address given by Lincoln three months after the battle.



Following thus, we all retired to the campground. No Airstream rally is complete without a pot-luck dinner and the food spread was incredible. Then, we settled in for the last installment of our 4-hour movie in our outdoor theater. After focusing our efforts on Pickett's charge earlier in the day, the end of the movie, featuring this devastating assault, was a very moving way to end this rally.



NOVA: Escape Room Rally Rally Host: Alan McDowell

Come and join our NOVA members on August 22-25, 2019, as we attempt to solve some escape room puzzles!



How this rally came about......It was late last Summer, friend and NOVA member Tom introduced me to a puzzle game for iPad called *The Room*. It was a video game where you solve puzzles to move on through the game and onto the next levels. Turns out there are three Room games in the series and we played them all!

Tom is a puzzle buff and we discussed the idea of the escape room craze that swept the nation. Neither of us had ever done one before and we both enjoyed doing puzzles so I thought, how about an escape room rally, where we would be physically immersed in an actual puzzle! What a fun thing to try!

After contacting some local escape rooms and trying to get a feel for how these things operate, I decided on a company called Escapology. This place is a national chain that has a number of locations across the country.

When this rally is taking place...I decided on the dates of Thursday, August 22, 2019, through Sunday, August 25, 2019, and the escape room "mission", as they call the adventure, will be on the morning of Friday, August 23. At the time I was planning this rally, I figured the escape room mission takes place indoors, so the hot August temperatures will not be a problem.

The escape room mission options...At this Cincinnati location, there are three missions to choose from. All take approximately an hour to complete and vary in difficulty from easy/intermediate to intermediate/expert. Here is a description of the options:



- An assassination mission that takes place in 1932 Minnesota aboard a train carrying the future President of the United States, Franklin D. Roosevelt. The object is to solve the puzzle in the time allotted and save the President-to-be from being assassinated.
- 2) A nuclear annihilation mission in which you have to solve the puzzle and save the world before a nuclear bomb goes off. It takes place in 1962 Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis.
- 3) The third option is called Extinction and you have to solve the puzzle before an airborne toxin is released in modern day Atlanta.

Camping Location....The campground I chose for this rally is the Lebanon KOA in Lebanon, Ohio. It is one of two campgrounds located fairly close to the Escapology facility, which is located in Loveland, Ohio.

Rainbow Fruit Skewers with Vanilla-Honey Yogurt Dip



INGREDIENTS:

10 long wooden skewers, cut in half Assorted fruit (Use whatever you like!)

2 cups plain or vanilla yogurt (if using plain, add 1 tsp. vanilla)

1/4 cup honey

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

DIRECTIONS:

In a medium bowl, stir together yogurt, honey and cinnamon. Thread fruit onto skewers and serve with yogurt dip.

No-Chop Skillet Chili – 4 Servings



INGREDIENTS:

1 teaspoon canola oil

12 ounces 95%-lean ground beef

1 (15 ounce) can no-salt-added red kidney beans, rinsed and drained

1 (14.5 ounce) can no-salt-added diced tomatoes, undrained

1 14.4-ounce package frozen sweet pepper and onion stir-fry vegetables

1 (1.25 ounce) package reduced-sodium taco or chili seasoning

2 to 3 teaspoons chili powder

2 tablespoons reduced-sugar ketchup

Shredded reduced-fat cheddar cheese, plain fat-free Greek yogurt, sliced black olives, thinly sliced green onions, and/or snipped fresh cilantro (optional)

DIRECTIONS:

Light firewood or charcoal and let campfire burn down to medium-hot embers or coals. Top with a grill rack.

In a 10-inch cast iron skillet heat oil over campfire. Add ground beef; cook until browned. Stir in the next five ingredients (through chili powder). Cook 20 minutes or until vegetables are tender, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat. Stir in ketchup.

Let stand 15 minutes to allow flavors to blend. If desired, top servings with cheese, yogurt, olives, green onions, and/or cilantro.

The trash cans in newer Airstreams are a unique size. Here is a picture of the 4-gallon trash bags that fit!




Cranky Stabilizer Jacks

Our Airstream will celebrate it's 31st birthday this year and if you are pulling a similarly aged or older rig, you know there is always something that needs attention. For some time now the stabilizer jacks at the corners have been getting more difficult to raise/lower and very noisy. Over the winter things came to a head and the decision was to replace them.


So when the weather broke in Ohio I reached out to BAL, the manufacturer, for help getting the right replacement. The bad news is they no longer make that model, the new version does not line up with the original holes in the frame, and you have to special order them with



an extended shaft. (The original was called a T Type, named for the shape of the unit and the new ones are C types) Considering the cost to replace and that they were going to have to be rigged to fit, maybe we better look at fixing up the old ones.

There is a happy ending. These are pretty sturdy units and it turned out that there was not any major damage, just 31 years of collected rust, dirt, and wear. The unit consists of a long lead screw that moves a captive nut to raise and lower. If you carefully disassemble them, all the hardware short of the lead screw can be replaced with off the shelf hardware. I recommend starting disassembly with the nut that holds the lead screw in and work your way back removing all hardware as you come to it. Lots of wire brushing, cleaning, and lubing to do. I used white lithium grease on all parts that rub except the lead screw – used motor oil on that. Only tricky part of disassembly is the captive nut that the lead screw passes through. Bal refers to this as a trunnion and there are two small trunnion pins that slip into the ends of the trunnion. They are just a loose fit and can fall out during disassembly. The original manual for these units, complete with parts break-down is online – just Google Bal T Type Stabilizer Jacks. You're going to smile the first time you crank them down after the refurb.
