There will be food trucks on site, but they have been crowded in the past. Exit and re-entry are possible, but not convenient, so best plan to bring enough food and drink for the rally

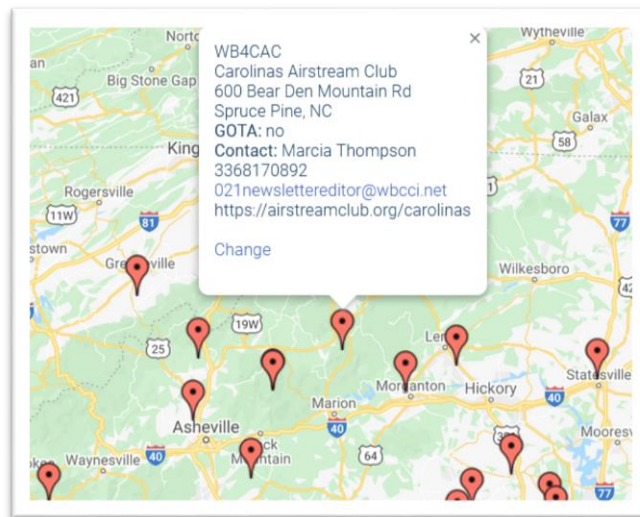
FIELD DAY 2021 WITH CAC!

Amateur Radio Operators in the Carolinas Airstream Club operated the Amateur Radio Relay League (ARRL) annual Field Day at Bear Den Family Campground, nestled in the Pisgah National Forest adjoining the Blue Ridge Parkway at near Spruce Pine, NC on June 24-25. Members commented we made Wally proud getting to this very remote mountain campground! We used our clubs call sign, **WB4CAC** and made 133 contacts comprised of voice (SSB) and digital modes (FT8). We had 3 dipole antennas in the trees, one Buddipole™ portable dipole antenna system, and one Tarheel screwdriver vertical on top of an Airstream. All ham radios are 12v and were operated on battery power for this event to simulate an emergency situation. The scenario we made up was that a tornado had leveled all the nearby cell towers, taken out shore power, and the only method of communication was our radios on battery. When all else fails, ham radio!

This was a great opportunity for our club hams (we have 24 in this club) to practice our emergency response capabilities.

ARRL Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, thousands of radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or with friends to operate from remote locations. Ham radio has been called into action again and again to provide communications in crises. Amateur Radio operators (also called “hams”) are well known for our communications support in real disaster and post-disaster situations.

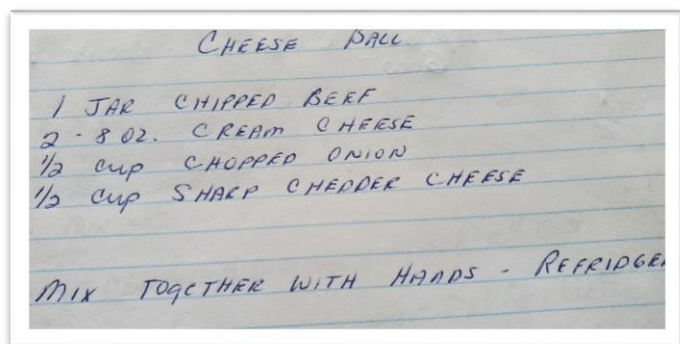

RECIPES FROM BEAR DEN

Cheese Ball - Joan Wilcox



Cheese Appetizer - Carol Combs

Ingredients

2 cups finely grated sharp cheddar cheese
 1 cup butter, softened
 2 tablespoons heavy cream
 1 large egg
 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard, ground pepper, or hot sauce to taste
 (I did not use any - wimpy husband)
 16 oz package firm white bread like Pepperidge Farm Sandwich Bread

Directions

Beat cheese and butter until fluffy
 Beat in cream and everything else
 Cut crusts from bread and cut into fourths
 Spread mixture on one piece of bread, top with another
 Spread mixture on top and sides of each "sandwich"
 You can freeze the sandwiches at this point
 Bake on lightly greased cookie sheet at 375 for 15 minutes if not frozen, a little longer if frozen
