Jerry was a submariner in the Navy over 20 years.



Food, Wine and Camping on the Oregon Coast

We traveled in May and June along the Oregon coast, a coastline much different than the Atlantic on our eastern coast. The ocean is fierce, so is the wind, and the temperatures are cool all year-round. This area is studded with campgrounds, state parks and beaches. So many beaches! There is a state park, recreation area or private campground every few miles. The sand dunes in the middle to southern part of the state are numerous, as are the dune buggy (4-wheeler) enthusiasts. We stayed at state parks near Newport, and then further south near Florence. The state parks, though numerous, are completely booked on the weekends, even in May. The whale watching and sea lions are quite an attraction, so it is a busy place. Oregon State Parks use Recreation.gov to book their campgrounds.

We next headed to Crater Lake National Park. which was a 4-hour drive inland and south from Florence. This is a stunning park you can see in one day. The loop road was closed due to snow, but Crater Lake (formed 7,700 years ago from Mount Mazama, a 12,000 foot volcano) is prettiest from the south side. At a depth of 1,943 feet, Crater Lake is the 9th deepest in the world. Wizard Island is a cinder cone in the lake that rises 763 feet above the water, and Crater Lake was named after the small crater at the top of Wizard Island. The closest campground with services is Joseph H. Stewart County Park, located in Prospect, OR and roughly a 45-minute drive away (also booked on recreation.gov). There are rustic campgrounds

closer, but most have rough roads and small sites. Joseph Stewart was the nicest campsite we'd stayed in, with generously sized sites and beautiful landscaping. It was also much quieter than the state parks along the coast.

But the seafood and wineries are what really drew us here. If you enjoy crisp whites, or Pinot Noir, this is your place. Every good restaurant features clam or crab chowder. The Dungeness crab is revered here, along with rockfish, bay scallops and trout. Clams and bay oysters are fresh and numerous. Many people drop crab traps over the side of a jetty, or from their own small boat near the shoreline. It is a way of life to catch your own crabs for dinner. A place that is so abundant in food, wine and breweries, as well as the natural beauty of nature (ahh...those majestic centenarian trees!) is sure to please. Our favorite restaurant in this area was the Waterfront Depot in Florence. Excellent seafood, great service and waterfront views. In Newport, a favorite was the Rogue Brewery. It sits at the entrance to a jetty where you can watch people fish or set out crab traps. Rogue Brewery has a very large variety of beers, and the ones Mark tasted, he proclaimed as excellent. We ate lunch in their small restaurant and were both impressed with their food.

The highest density of wineries are in the northwest part of the state, near Dundee and McMinnville, but you can find one almost anywhere in Oregon. For many years, my favorite Pinot Noirs have come from Sokol

Blosser, but I had a lovely Pinot from Brandborg Winery at the Ona restaurant in Yachats, OR. Brandborg is located in Elkton, 45 minutes east of our campground near Florence, on the coast. The owners are Sue and Terry Brandborg, and they make a bottle of Pinot Noir named "The Tripper" that features artwork of an Airstream from artist Jane Kiskaddon. The Brandborgs attended the 2018 International rally, so some of you may remember them. We enjoyed all their wines very much, but their company was most enjoyable.

We next visited Hood River. OR where we stayed for a week while solar was installed on Something Shiny's roof. This is a lovely town on the banks of the Columbia Gorge, about 60 miles east of Portland. The drive along the gorge is studded with waterfalls and hiking trails and is best viewed from the Washington side of the gorge. A busy expressway runs along the gorge on the Oregon side. Caution! The Hood River bridge is only 9 ft. wide, and our Garmin RV GPS did not warn us that it was too risky to squeeze

our trailer across with only inches to spare. Take the Bridge of the Gods on the west side of Hood River, or The Dalles bridge on the east side if you wish to cross over to Washington.

In Hood River, there are many wineries, breweries, and the Hood River Distillery, which makes several excellent whiskeys and other spirits. There are many tasting rooms in downtown Hood River, and Cascade Cliffs was my favorite for wine. I've known of their award-winning Washington wines for many years, and their interesting reds (Syrah, Barbera and Malbec). A scenic winery to visit in the Hood

River region was Stave & Stone in Odell. You can sit outside at a firepit facing the snow-capped Mt. Adams. Stave & Stone has some small food options available with the wine tastings and all were delicious. We also got to know Lillie, owner and one of the chefs at Romuls Italian restaurant. She makes all desserts from scratch, and the tiramisu cake was to die for. For microbrewery beer and excellent wood-fired pizza, I recommend Double Mountain Brewery.

Mt. Hood south of Hood River is the only yearround ski area in the US, and the Timberline Lodge here is famous for its role in the making of *The Shining* movie. It was built by the Works Progress Administration and many local artisans from 1936 - 1938; the history and the architecture are well worth the visit. It's also a great place to have lunch, which we thoroughly enjoyed.

As always, the most rewarding part of travel for us has been the people we've met along the way - in campgrounds, while hiking, at restaurants. We've made friends for now, and friends for a lifetime. Airstreaming has taken us places we could have never experienced in such depth. It's a wonderful ride.

My column on recommendations for the "perfect club" generated some interesting and dare I say, diverse comments. I have included four of these emails, some of which have been edited for typos. I have also removed any content that would identify the authors personally, as most have requested.

From Bill: "Terri, your position is the most demanding in the club, but you are able to share and listen. You leave your ego somewhere else when you do club events. You clearly do so when you write your editorials. The perfect club? This is not easy to accomplish. Feel free to share what you see here that has value.

Share all your knowledge and experience and share the "reins". The puppet system works, yes, but then true club growth is stunted. Club potential is lost. You will have pictures for the website, but they are usually all the same people in the pictures. Sharing what you know and what you've experienced generates Trust among members.

Don't isolate yourself. Possibly pair new couples/families with experienced couples and families. See who the new people bond with and use it to further connections. This pairing will Reassure new members they have value and the group cares about them.

Listen. This item is tied with sharing and communication. In fact, all these subject matter items are interwoven, as you are aware. When we listen, we promote growth, and we all Evolve.

Don't dominate. Instead of dominating, Assist and be a Mentor to others. People won't go (or remain) in a club where their worth is either diminished or where they don't have a voice (or the solicitation for ideas is actually fake and what they have to say is never turned into action). Avoid the "birds of a feather, flocking together". All larger groups will have informal smaller "like minded" groups eventually as people bond with each other. But avoid the large group mentality of "our way or the highway". We share the observation that this club is not grasping diversity and it hasn't truly opened its arms. The same few dominate.

Communicate. Again, this is tied to listening.

Communicate with all members of the WBCCI in the immediate geographical area, not just with the current local club members. And when communicating, all must be free to Express themselves in a respectful way.

Incorporate flexibility. The agenda for a semiannual event or annual event must be flexible, especially after COVID. Rigidity must go away. Don't interrogate, don't judge, and don't qualify. No one wants to rock the boat but allow new members the time to evolve and have input. Diversity is paramount and all must feel worth and be welcomed. This may not be Easy, but all must see the club as a win/win place to be.

Keep it clean and not just the physical. Off color remarks and skits may draw a laugh or two but they can deeply penetrate or offend. They are not easily forgotten. Always Reflect on what works and on what doesn't. Focus always on kindness.

Be a Streamer: Share, Trust, Reassure, Evolve, Assist, Mentor, Express, Reflect"

From Sue: "The 23 suggestions were interesting and good with the exception of # 7 and half of # 23.

7. The US was founded on religious principles and there is still a large percentage of people who believe in God and attend church; however, there are those whose aim it is to destroy our faith and gradually eroded it. I do not agree that meal prayers should be sectarian at club activities & WBCCI events; to do is just another way to erode God and Christianity.

#23. I do agree that politics should stay out of club activities. For the rest, refer back to #7."

From Dave: "I like the new picture! And thanks for your efforts in the monthly articles.

My first reaction to the articles is that it would be good to have data. For example, how many people responded in total and how many in each of the 23 categories? I think that would have been helpful context. Without the context, the comments are more like casual conversation, which may be what you intended anyway.

Most of the comments, I thought were governance and administrative in nature. A few bordered on social and political issues. As you know from our prior correspondence, I believe the subject of diversity is often political and highly charged. The word itself has become code for "think this and support this" and "do not dare think or say otherwise."

All should be welcome, including varying points of view on assorted subjects. For example, practicing Catholics believe in the sanctity of marriage and the unique complementarity of marriage between a man and woman, ordered as they are for the essential purpose of sex, the gift of life. But that does not mean that I expect to be campaigning about it at Club gatherings.

I am, however, a bit concerned about item #7: "If grace is said before meals, it is sectarian, not religious." I'm not sure what that means. Is there a movement to exclude or silence religious Club members? My view is that anyone who wishes to offer a brief prayer of thanksgiving or invocation ought to be able to do so and that that ought to be the norm, rather than exception. Clubs could rotate the persons who offer the invocation or have more than one person for each gathering, so no one feels left out.

Those are my thoughts. I hope you and yours have come through the pandemic in good health. Perhaps we'll run into each other at the International Rally next month."

From Carol: "Thank you so much Terri for the 23 suggestions for a better club. It's "23 and me"! This gives me lots of food for thought about how to improve our club as I move further along into the leadership positions. We really need to get a club credit card and change our rally registration process to being online. Can you tell me who to talk to to get this going? We aren't that computer smart around here.

About six months ago, our club began using a little period of silence before meals so each person who wanted to say grace, could do so but silently. One of our officers had heard at a meeting somewhere this was suggested now. It doesn't matter to me if the words come out of my mouth, or they are in my head – I just want to say thank you to my Father for my meal. He can hear inside my head, that's not a problem. This silence seems to really put members at ease more - those who don't have a religion or have a different religion than the majority Christians, like me. We realized this isn't "majority rules" on this topic. It's all about making everyone feel welcome and comfortable, riaht?

I also like the idea of having both weekday and weekend rallies, we will give that a try next year."

From Rev. Eric Albert Zimmer: (and I don't think he would mind being identified)

"Thank you for your column, dated June 2021. I was puzzled by point #7. Not sure what you were getting at, but if a prayer is sectarian, it is, by definition, religious. Perhaps what you meant was religious, but nonsectarian. You would find such prayers given at military events (speaking as a former military chaplain and a Catholic priest). So, nothing specific to one religion (sect) but nonetheless acknowledging non-specific faith underpinnings.

As a new member, I am enjoying the *Blue Beret.*"

The 23 suggestions were not a formal survey of any kind - they were simply suggestions sent in by readers who had something to say about what they thought would make a great club. It's clear, as one might expect, that #7 about prayer at meals, was the hot topic. The ACI formed a committee under the guidance of then President Mona Heath in 2020 that worked hard on this topic, after concerns were raised on a caravan. A document called "Guiding Principles" was developed, after extensive discussion, to try to deal with this thorny issue. If anyone would like a copy, I would be happy to send it to you. And thank you, Reverend Zimmer, appreciate you clarifying the suggestion that included the word sectarian, I should have caught that, glad you did.

I especially liked Bill's email. He made such wonderful comments about the style of club leadership and membership and his comments, I felt, truly came from his heart. It made me smile a lot. Thank you to everyone who wrote. I'm sorry if space prohibited me from including every email in this column, but I believe the essence of the comments have been captured here.

In 1955, a small intimate group of Wally Byam's friends and owners of travel trailers built by Byam gathered in Nova Scotia celebrating yet another caravan of like-minded folks. From this small gathering would the nation's largest single brand RV club evolve. The very first WBCCI International Rally was held in 1958; Bull Shoals, Arkansas in the Ozarks with almost 300 Airstreams attending. For the 65th anniversary International Rally next year, we celebrate with our incoming 2021-2022 President, Tyrone (Tye) Mott.

Camping for the Mott family was a way of life; having many siblings. Tye and his brothers and sisters enjoyed the family time together. It did not take Tye long to see his first Airstream while on a camp out. Wanting to know why they did not have one of those, Tye's Dad simply said, "Couldn't afford to fix such a thing if it broke". Tye had to settle for the canvas walls of surplus

army tents and soggy weekends with the family. Needless to say, the camping bug bit and was not letting go.

Tye, as a young man, came to the crossroads of adulthood. With no plan at the time. he joined the US Army. It seemed that Tye was destined to continue his camping in Army tents. We Rally Together: We Post Together

This past year, I took on the duties of teaching my first grader from home while his school went to a hybrid of in-person/at-home school days to allow for smaller class sizes to help with social distancing. During one of our afternoon lessons, I asked him to write down "#1" - as in - "number sign, one". He looked at me quizzically, and asked, "what's the number sign?" Ever the patient and guiding teacher, I offered, "it's the hashtag sign," and with quick understanding, he put pencil to paper. If you aren't quite as familiar with hashtags as my seven-year-old who is, much to my dismay, growing up in such a digital world, you may be asking yourself why, where, and how to go about using a hashtag.

Why you might want to try using hashtags: For starters, hashtags can save you time in searching for information you are seeking. Instead of aimlessly scrolling, hashtags are useful because they draw together information on topics or themes you are interested in rather than just surfing through your social feeds at random. If you are bored with what you currently see on social media, you can instead do a search using a hashtag to come up with posts about something you like to do or that is of particular interest to you.

Where to use hashtags: Use hashtags when you are on social media websites like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, and TikTok. If you can do so while reading this article, it may help to log onto the internet and try out using some hashtags while we continue...

Once you've logged onto any of the above-mentioned social media websites, look at the top of the page for the search bar; it's got a magnifying glass in it. On Twitter, you have to click "# Explore" to get the search bar to pop up. Now, in the search bar, try typing in **#camping** and hit enter. You will see results of all kinds of posts by people who have included the hashtag **#camping**.

Let's try a couple more examples: try typing in **#fishing** or **#sunset** and hit enter. You wouldn't otherwise see these posts, but because the authors used hashtags on the subject, a new world is opened up for you to see.

How to use hashtags: The most important thing to remember is to eliminate the spaces between any words (or use just one word) and type your hash symbol (#) immediately ahead of the word(s) you are tagging, again with no spaces. Now, let's try searching for some examples of hashtags that combine two words: **#flyingcloud** or **#liverivited**. Again, thanks to the hashtag, you arrive at quick and easy results of posts on a similar topic that you would otherwise never come across.

Let's imagine you were really excited about your Airstream renovation. Along with posting your pictures on Facebook, you could tag your post



along with 1200 other folks posting about their Airstream renovations using **#airstreamrenovation**. You can add as many hashtags to your posts as you'd like, so you might try adding **#vintageairstream** too. This will result in your pictures showing up whenever anyone does a search for these hashtags.

Even if you aren't one to post much on social media, you can still be a "silent stalker" of other people's hashtags. Maybe you aren't travelling at the moment, but you are in the mood for some inspiration: try searching **#beachcamping** or **#wanderlust** from your social media app of choice. As you begin to interact more with hashtags, you'll find some posts use a whole lot of them! More hashtags equate to a greater reach for the message topic.

So as you're out on the road this season, remember to have fun using hashtags: try **#airstreamrally** or **#airstreamcaravan** and keeping rolling from there: you'll soon find **#Airstreamers** all over the web enjoying similar **#wbcci #airstreamliving!**

Finding a Reservation when Campgrounds are Full

As the pandemic has closed borders and affected how people vacation, more are traveling in RVs than at any other time. This winter, even with the Canadian borders closed, campgrounds are full across the south. Getting reservations this year is going to be more challenging than ever.

We traveled on a five-month trip in the southwest with only two months of preplanned reservations made before we left home. We enjoy a nomadic travel style, moving between campgrounds every week. Our preference is to stay at National and State Parks. In the past month, we have stayed at five different campgrounds. We plan our stays about a month or less in advance, allowing us the opportunity to stay at the great campgrounds that we have heard about from other travelers.

We were in Arizona - during February/March when most campgrounds are full. So how do we find reservations when campgrounds are full? - Flexibly, Perseverance, and Having a Plan "B".

Flexibly - If you are looking to stay at that popular state park that everyone is talking about, you need to be flexible. Sites are available if you can adjust the days you can stay to fit what's available. We wanted to stay at Dead Horse State Park in Cottonwood, AZ - we were able to find a couple nights mid-week that we were able to fit into our plans.

Many campground websites have the option to look for available dates over the next

couple weeks. Using this option, you may be able to find an open site that you can fit into your travel plans.

Perseverance - If you don't find an available site, don't know give up - keep checking the website every day. People are creating reservations months in advance, and some cancel them as the date approaches. We found availability at a popular campground the next day, when previously nothing was available.

Have a Plan "B" - Weekends can be very difficult (but not impossible) to find a site. Having an alternate plan can relieve some stress of not having a place to stay. Your plan "B" can consist of a less popular campground, or boondocking on BML land. We were concerned with not having a place to stay over a holiday weekend - that week we were able to find a site at a remote state park that was 80 miles from the nearest city.

Bonus tip - Wandering Labs. Wandering Labs (wanderinglabs.com) is a website that will repeatedly search for availability on any Reserve America website. Reserve America is used by 100's of campgrounds including many state parks like New York. Many private campgrounds are also using Reserve America too. Wandering Labs will continue to search for an availability and notify you if an opening becomes available. Wandering Labs is free to use but does offer a paid version that has additional features.

Hopefully, these tips will help you plan that last minute get-away this summer.

Airstream in the 1930s - Part 3: Focus on the Airlite (1937-38)

For the ongoing celebration of Airstream's 90th Anniversary, we continue our review of Airstream in the 1930s following two years of expansion in 1935 and 1936.

As 1937 began, the trailer industry was softening a bit, but sales were still good. Airstream was continuing to get story and photo coverage and running ads in national magazines, including:

- Jan 1937 Popular Mechanics
- Feb 1937 Sunset
- Mar 1937 Sunset
- May 1937 Trailer Travel
- Jun 1937 Trailer Travel
- Sep 1937 Trailer Travel
- Nov 1937 Trailer Travel

Airstream was still opening new markets with local dealers sought or reported in these newspapers: San Francisco, CA Examiner starting on March 27, 1937, Fresno, CA Fresno Bee starting June 23, 1937, Salinas, CA Morning Post starting on July 17, 1937. It even picked up an east coast Clipper sales rep, Johnny Durant, Jr., as noted in the Miami, FL Miami Herald, starting on November 28, 1937.

We will continue to track Airstream as 1937 progresses via their frequent Los Angeles (L.A.) Times ads. A February 21, 1937 ad was the first to mention a new Airstream model called the **Mobile Home** that even included a bathtub. This ad also noted **Clipper** prices ranged from \$1250 to \$2000 suggesting that it had evolved from a more or less standard model with a





fixed price of \$1445 to \$1485, that was often available for purchase at Airstream's Display Grounds in 1936, into a model that was only available for custom order in 1937.

A new model named the Airlite was first mentioned in a story in the February 1937

Sunset magazine as "the lightest trailer of its size, with a tubular steel frame" replacing the Silver Bullet/Pup as the smallest model in the Airstream lineup. As the Airlite quickly became Airstream's main focus, a large June 6, 1937

L.A. Times ad was dedicated to this lightweight 12 ft. model, reading, in part: "Daring!

Dashing! Debonair! Airstream Airlite...advanced construction features such as double walls, cross-top ventilation, monocoque body, etc. ..."

Curiously, this same ad was the last to mention Airstream's Wilshire Display Grounds that it had used since August 1936, clearly a sign that Airstream was having to tighten its belt in a contracting trailer market. After this date, Airstream ads only mentioned the 304 W. 22nd factory location.

The last known 1930s Airstream brochure is estimated to have been printed between June and August 1937. Reflecting the shrinking trailer market and tighter financial situation at Airstream, it was reduced in size to only four pages and mentions just the Airlite, Silver Cloud, Torpedo Jr., Mobile Home, and Clipper.

Airstream ads in the L.A. Times from July 1937 onward often emphasized used trailers, tradeins, and demonstrators. An October 24, 1937 ad mentioned "Brakes installed, repairs given full service" indicating Airstream was doing everything it could to keep the doors open. A November 10, 1937 ad titled "Talk About Bargains!" listed new Airstreams at reduced prices.


All of this was the lead up to a December 13, 1937 auction, at the 304 W. 22nd St. factory location, of "Assets as purchased from the Assignee of Airstream Trailer Co."


Two L.A. Times ads on January 9, 1938 showed Airstream operating at a new factory location at 2023 W. Pico in Los Angeles. One ad advertised an **Airlite** that was "built in 1938" and the other noted Airstream could perform "trailer rebuilding, alterations, and repairs" as well as add brakes, stoves, heaters, and toilets to existing trailers.

All 1938 Airstream ads in the L.A. Times through the end of March only mentioned the Airlite, often noting this small, light model was built to take to the mountains. An April 15, 1938 L.A. Times ad finally mentioned a Silver Cloud. An April 17 ad indicated you could see the famous Clipper being built at the factory.

A June 6, 1938 L.A. Times ad was the last to mention the 2023 W. Pico factory address, while a June 26, 1938 ad was the first to indicate that the Airstream factory had moved again to 1400 W. Washington (at Magnolia). Other ads would list this new address as 1908 S. Magnolia (at Washington). The building at 1908 S. Magnolia would remain Airstream's factory location until 1941. After this move, Wally Byam had new business cards printed that had artistic images of Airstream's two most important models, an Airlite on the upper left and a Clipper on the lower right.

No L.A. Times ad after July 10, 1938 mentioned the Clipper by name until February 1941, though a September 1938 Airstream Yellow Pages ad still mentioned the Clipper along with the Airlite. All Clippers built from 1938 onward were strictly by custom order, and with prices that could reach \$5000 or more depending upon size and amenities, there was no need to advertise them in the L.A. Times.





That July 10, 1938 L.A. Times ad resorted to a bit of "name dropping" when it read, in part: "AIRSTREAM...California's oldest active trailer manufacturer. State License No. 7...Builders of the famous streamlined, all-metal, duralumin Clipper, an airplane without wings. Sold to the President of Mexico, Fredric March, Loretta Young, and many other national notables..."

This ad also confirmed what was already apparent when it continued: "...Now concentrating our production on our Airlite model, THE SUPER-FINE SMALL TRAILER, The fastest selling single model in California." A second ad that same day was accompanied by a photo of an Airstream Airlite.

This aligns with comments Wally Byam made in his 1960 book **Trailer Travel Here and Abroad**, when he said "...in 1937-38 certain disturbing trends were apparent to those in the industry. We seemed to be approaching a fork in the road. On the one hand was a dedicated group of small manufacturers who had, from the beginning, believed the trailer was essentially a vehicle for travel, a convenient instrument for

comfortable vacationing. Little by little, others appeared...who regarded the trailer primarily as a device to escape tax collectors and landlords and approached it as a way to provide submarginal housing...that did not have to be built so solidly." So, while Airstream had offered some "house trailer" type models in 1936 and 1937 and would continue to do so, namely the Pullman and Mobile Home, these models were never the main focus for Airstream. By focusing on the Airlite, Airstream was solidly embracing the "travel trailer" side of the industry, a passion Wally Byam would retain when Airstream reformed after WWII.

From August through the end of 1938,
Airstream ads in the L.A. Times became less
frequent and mostly emphasized the Airlite,
though the Silver Cloud, Junior Cloud, and
Torpedo were occasionally also mentioned. By
this time, the Torpedo was no longer teardrop
shaped. It, the Silver Cloud, and Junior Cloud,
all shared similar "English" exterior shapes only
differentiated by length, window locations, and
interior layout. Given this similarity, sometimes



the trailers larger than the **Airlite** were mentioned only by length without a model name, a trend that would continue in following years.

Next time in Part 4, we will see Wally Byam's determination to keep Airstream afloat as America inched toward WWII.








Campfire Safety Tips





From the Vice President of Sales

Greetings from your extended family here in Jackson Center, OH! I hope everyone is enjoying your Airstreams this summer!

I feel like a broken record when I say demand continues to grow! Each month I write this article, I shake my head in that the orders we are receiving are more and more each month. It is a good problem to have, but it has pushed lead times well into next year. In some cases, it is so good it is creating bad situations for customers and dealers alike. So, if you were thinking of getting a new Airstream in time for the camping season in 2022, you may want to start the process sooner rather than later!

Airstream has delayed a couple of production rate increases because we were not ready. The reasons largely stem from a lack of supply for key components, but also making sure the new manufacturing associates we hired are trained and ready for the higher rates. These are decisions we do not take lightly as any delay to a production rate is longer for the customer to wait and the dealer to realize the sale. But if we are not ready, we will not increase the production rate, this is a core value to us here at Airstream.

As we look out into the next 10-12 months, we do not see the supply chain challenges easing. This will cause continued disruptions to production lead times and the ability to supply replacement parts. The team at Airstream is working hard to balance both problems, but we do not see meaningful improvement across all Airstream models for at least 10-12 months. In addition, Mercedes Benz is having significant supply issues themselves, most notably, a historic shortage of microchips. If we were short a TV or microwave, it is likely we could find a replacement, but when you cannot get the needed chassis, the ramifications could significantly impact our ability to produce. Our collective fingers are crossed so that Mercedes Benz can get the parts they need so we can get the chassis supply we need for many new anxious owners who have one on order!

Recently, Airstream launched the Airstream Support resources on our website — support.
airstream.com. This is a great resource for our owners and includes product manuals, user guides and FAQ's. The team recently uploaded just under 400 videos on how to use your Airstream and the videos are separated by model! In addition, we also added the Airstream Academy - www.airstream.com/academy. Here you will find helpful tips on how to use your Airstream and even includes "Ask an Airstreamer" where we had live Q and A sessions with actual customers. These sessions were recorded and can be replayed, so make sure you check them out!
