WBCCI INTERNATIONAL RALLY - - IT'S CLOSE TO HOME

The Meadow Event Park in Caroline County, Virginia, is rich in history and an adaptable event space. Located just minutes from Richmond and Fredericksburg, an easy drive from Hampton Roads/Virginia Beach and a straight shot from the D.C. area,

Thoroughbred racing legend Secretariat was born here in 1970. Three years later he blazed his way into Triple Crown history. Today his birthplace is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and the Virginia Landmarks Register.

Since then, The Meadow has transformed from a family farm to a multi-purpose venue that is home to the State Fair of Virginia and other notable events. The 331-acre property features a mixture of original structures and newly constructed facilities.

As I have said numerous times, the editors of the newsletters in Region 2 share copies of our newsletters frequently. They are all quite remarkable. Once in awhile though, something pops up that I feel others could benefit from reading. This message from Jonathon Jacobs, President of MAU is quite profound and worth the read. Happy 2019 MAU'ers!

While I am short on answers to many of life's questions, cumulative conversations in 2018 did offer some interesting perspectives of things around us. In listening to current news about the Federal Government shutdown, recent articles about activists swaying Congressional Representative / Senator actions, and news about other governments facing civil challenges, it leaves me wondering whether it ties to MAU's membership. Stick with me here . . . Technology advancement is a great thing. Our communication and information delivery evolved from verbal (grunts), to written (rock drawings/glyphs), to electronic (airway/copper/light).

Currently, we are able to instantly receive information in the palm of our hands from anywhere on the planet for free (minus the device's cost). This free instant access lets us bypass the media outlets (whom previously controlled the content) and go directly to information that we want to see/hear. This is good, right? Maybe. Granted, there were some down sides to when major media outlets controlled information and when organizations had control over their brand messaging (example: agenda based reporting/content), but this now seems like a small price compared to the freedom of open content via social media. Media outlets had incentive to weed-out divisive content, as they needed mass appeal; without the mass purchase of content, the organization would die. With social media now delivering information to people's palms, it is possible to bypass the filters, access only information that we want, and completely bypass the injection of more robust/diverse content. Put another way, delivery of 'news' via social media is actually enabling divisiveness, emboldening small groups to push focused / narrow agendas, and making it hard to separate science fact from science embellishment. Not helping in the divisive arena is that social media is using highly specific individual detail to target us with ads/'news' feeds in order to drive their revenue to pay for our 'free' information. The more the tailored information, the more we start seeing others around us as 'them' where agenda based reporting / content is more rampant than when we paid for the information; it is just more difficult to see it in that light.

Ok, lets thread the needles and bring this back to MAU. Fortunately, divisiveness is not the aspect of social media that is affecting MAU's membership, as the stronger force is the open nature of information. Technology is to the point where we do not need to rely on a club infrastructure for details on how to do things, as there is an app, video, or forum which directly replaces the value that people get from membership in the organization. As the information streams that embolden people to disrupt the way things were done, social media is lowering the value people are seeing from club membership.

I remain convinced that we face an uphill battle in terms of attracting members simply due to our affiliation with WBCCI. People are not seeing the value of joining a club as they can do it on their own for free. It is just a matter of staying alert and capturing people when they put down their devices long enough to notice that the device cannot offer the warmth of a real person. For attracting new members, I propose that we continue to do what we have always done while out and about: say 'Hi' to others around us. One thing that we may do to up our game is to increase our presence on the Internet through participation in the forums with simple personal contributions, sprinkle in the Unit's existence, and suggest that people watch our calendar for activities. Even with all the benefits of virtual living that social media offers, people still need a reason to venture.
