




Mom's Blueberry Muffins

There are hundreds of blueberry muffin recipes on the internet and in cookbooks. I've tried a lot of them for comparison purposes. Some are too sweet, some are too complicated, some are too dry or heavy, and some have too many ingredients. Or they just don't taste very good. Blueberry muffins are a staple in my home and while camping in the Airstream. These are fast, easy, one bowl, not very sweet, and you can use fresh or frozen blueberries. These are also the best I've ever tasted. This recipe was my mother's and has been in my family longer than I can remember. You may have your own favorite recipe but give this one a try. I made them at the International Rally in Lebanon, TN and received favorable ratings from tasters. The recipe makes 10-12 muffins, depending on how large you make them. I usually get 10 because I fill up the muffin cups more than 3/4 of the way. You don't need muffin tin liners; in fact, I don't like them. Just use either a non-stick muffin tin or grease them first. They pop out easily and you won't have paper stuck to the sides of your muffins. The most perfect muffin tin in my opinion is made by Williams Sonoma and is their non-stick Goldtouch Pro. A 6-cup muffin tin runs about \$28 at full price. To make the muffins healthier, you can substitute wheat flour for part or all the AP flour. I usually use 1/2 cup wheat flour. You can also add wheat germ, flax seeds, nuts, or seeds. Make them your own special family recipe to pass on through the generations. It's a keeper.

Blueberry Muffins

- 1 3/4 cup all-purpose or wheat flour (or a combo)
- ¼ cup sugar
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 stick (4 oz, 8 T) cold butter
- 1 egg
- 34 cup milk
- 1 cup blueberries (fresh or frozen). If frozen, don't let them thaw or they will turn the batter blue.
- A mixture of cinnamon and sugar, about a tablespoon of sugar and tsp of cinnamon. Eyeballing it is ok.
- Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- Add dry ingredients (flour, sugar, baking powder and salt) into a medium bowl. Combine with a fork or whisk.
- Cut butter into smaller pieces and add to dry ingredients. Cut in with a pastry cutter, biscuit cutter, or a fork. You can also break up the butter with your fingers but do it quickly, so the butter doesn't melt. You want small chunks of butter (pea size) in your flour.
- Break the egg into a 1 cup measuring cup. Whisk egg. Add milk to 1 cup line and mix.
- Add egg and milk to flour/butter mixture and fold in gently. You don't want to develop gluten, so to get light muffins, you need to go easy.
- Add your blueberries and fold in gently until just combined.
- Using a spoon, drop several dollops of batter into each muffin tin. Fill about 7. 34 way.
- Sprinkle cinnamon/sugar mixture on top of each muffin.
- Bake in 400-degree oven for 20 minutes. 9.

I wrote to Carolyn Beardshear and asked her about our newest Intra Club, the Indie Streamers: what is it all about, how many members do you have now, who is an appropriate member? This is what she graciously sent to me. It certainly raised my consciousness about people traveling solo — how about you?

An increasing number of Airstreamers, whether single or a couple, man or woman, are traveling solo all the time or some of the time and the solo dynamic often presents challenges that those traveling with a partner may not realize or appreciate. How do you back up safely, hitch up easily, navigate when the GPS lets you down, cook for one, find a campsite in transit, make emergency repairs, care for pets while shopping or touring, stay safe on the road and in campgrounds, and socialize as a single person at rallies and on caravans?

Much of what traveling partners can take for granted becomes a challenge when it's "just me." Most Airstreamers aren't aware that solo travelers are often not invited to non-rally social events like dinners out, carpooling, happy hours, campfires. There is certainly no slight intended, but our solo traveling friends who may be a bit shy, unsure of the club's culture, or just new to the club are often left on the fringes of largely couples-centered events. Next time you ask a couple to join you, consider inviting a solo traveler as well. You will probably get a resounding "yes!"

To address these challenges and provide a means for widely dispersed solo travelers to connect, the Indie Streamers Intra Club was launched in September 2020 and now has 180+ members, with new members joining each week from across the country. The goal is to connect Indie Streamers via social media, a private forum, and informal gatherings across the country so to share challenges and their solutions, while making traveling friends in the process. The road to an International Rally might look overwhelming for a single traveler, but what if there are two, or even three traveling together? Suddenly there is safety in numbers and what could be daunting becomes a shared adventure.

Since its launch, Indie Streamers has had two gatherings: A rally with clinics, discussions and camaraderie at Ridgway, CO, which drew Indie Streamers from as far away as Massachusetts and Washington State, and social hours and round table discussions at the Lebanon International Rally. There are plans for an Indie Streamers Rendezvous before the 2022 International Rally in Fryeburg and hopefully members will organize more gatherings around the country before then.

If you travel solo at all, or even if you don't, you are welcome to join the Indie Streamers journey. More information at <u>airstreamclub.org/indiestreamers</u>

Speaking of Intra Clubs, do you have a special interest you think others might share? Would you like to start an Intra Club yourself? What

does it take? What kinds of groups might form an Intra Club? I put that question to Tom Smithson, head of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee. And here is what he said about the formation of an Intra Club, straight from the WBCCI constitution.

Intra-clubs that serve a useful purpose to members within the International Club may be authorized by the International Board of Trustees. Membership in an authorized Intraclub shall be restricted to members in good standing in the International Club.

To establish an Intra-Club in WBCCI, members should prepare a proposed Constitution, Bylaws and any amendments with a letter of intent and send it electronically to Headquarters. These documents will be reviewed by the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for conflict or inconsistencies with the Constitution, Bylaws or Policies of the International Club. Such documents shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Name
- 2. Object
- 3. Membership requirements
- 4. Officers and their election
- Meetings
- 6. Dissolution clause in accordance with State, Provincial, and Federal laws
- Amendment procedures
- 8. Parliamentary authority

Following approval by the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, the Committee will submit a motion to the International Board of Trustees for Charter approval.

Intra-clubs shall provide an annual written "State of the Intra-club" report to the International Board of Trustees at the scheduled IBT meeting at the International Rally. The annual report shall be submitted to Headquarters by the published deadline date and include: a summary of Intra-club activities, membership strength, financial report and a general statement as to the "health" of the Intra-club.

Intra-clubs shall provide Headquarters, on or before November 15, a written list of the Intra-club's elected or appointed officers for publication in the Annual Membership Directory of the International Club. Intra-club articles or notices of interest to the membership of the International Club may be published in the Blue Beret.

Some examples of Intra Clubs that already exist are obviously the Indie Streamers, Classic Airstream Club, Vintage Airstream Club, and Amateur Radio Club. But the possibilities are endless.

Escapees, another camping club, provides a good example of people with special interests gathering together. They call these Birds-of-a-Feather (BOF), our equivalent of Intra-Clubs. Some examples include Alternative Medicine BOF, Bikes, Boots, 'N Paddles, Boondockers BOF, Christian Fellowship BOF, Computers BOF, Freethinkers BOF, Friends of Bill W, Genealogy BOF, Disaster Operations Volunteer Escapees. (DOVEs), Escapees RV Club Elk BOF, Geo Cache BOF, Line Dancers Unite, NOMADS, Pet Lovers BOF, Square Dancing BOF, Stonewall BOF, Twist Your Throttle, Woodcarvers BOF, and Worldwide Travelers BOF.

I'm not saying we should duplicate these clubs, but they do inspire creative thoughts about what is possible for our group as well. Are you spurred on to form an Intra Club? Let me know and I'll connect you to the right people to get it going!

Natchez Trace

Along with everyone else, we spent 15 months of staying close to home until the nation figured out how to handle the coronavirus. What it did is present an extended opportunity to do a lot of planning and trip preparation.

The word Trace is French for road or path. Native Americans have been using the trace for more than 2,000 years. It is a historic forest trail that extends in a general north/south direction and crosses three states. The three states that the Trace crosses are Mississippi, Alabama, and Tennessee, but the majority is in Mississippi. The trail was created and used by Native Americans for centuries, and was later used by early European and American explorers, traders, soldiers and emigrants in the late 17th and early 18th centuries. European Americans founded inns, also known as "stands", along the Trace to serve food and lodging to travelers.

The Trace follows in close proximity to just east of the Mississippi River. When Europeans first colonized the area, the primary use was by Kaintucks (the name given people from Kentucky and Tennessee). These early pioneers floated large rafts down the Mississippi River, with cattle, horses, and lumber to be sold in New Orleans. For over a hundred years, they walked back to their home states on the Natchez Trace. All this activity came to a screeching halt in the 1820's when Robert Fulton invented the steamboat and people could travel against the current on the river to return to their home state. As travel shifted to steamboats on the Mississippi and other rivers, most of these stands closed.

In May of 1938, the United States established the Natchez Trace National Park. Most of the work was completed by the Civilian Conservation Corps.

It remains the only road that is a National Park. It is also the only road with just a name and no road number.

Ronnie and I (and our 16-pound Parson Russell Terrier named Gloria) set off from Jupiter, FL on May 3, 2021, trailering our 25-foot Airstream Flying Cloud on the first leg of our trip. On May 6, we arrived in Natchez and our first stop of the trip was the Natchez Visitors Center in Natchez, MS. The center is a good starting point for understanding the history of Natchez and the Trace.


We took a two-hour tour of Natchez with a town native. The Reverend Tracey Collins is the Pastor of the East Mount Baptist Church of Natchez and just goes by the name Rev. The Rev is a virtual walking or rather van-driving encyclopedia of the Trace, the Civil War, slavery, and all things

On May 7, we started our tour of the Trace, which identifies points of interest by mile markers, beginning at mile marker #1 in Natchez, MS and ending at mile marker #444 in Nashville, TN. At mile marker 10.3, we encountered the Emerald Mound, which is one of many ancient Indian Mounds. These burial and ceremonial structures were typically flat-topped pyramids, some dating back to 3500 BCE and are revered in Indian cultures as holy places.

The Mount Locust Inn & Plantation is the only inn left standing of the many that once lined the Old Trace. At one time there were Stands (way stations) along the Trace where visitors could spend the night or get something to eat.

In some portions of the Old Trace, the path is deeply eroded or sunken, because of the thousands of years of human and animal traffic. Hardships of journeying on the Old Trace included heat, mosquitoes, poor food, hard beds (if any), disease, swollen rivers, and swamps. Travelers of this sunken trail carried all their belongings on their backs for 444 miles. Besides the discomfort of a broken leg or arm, this could spell death for the lone traveler.

We spent a blissful five days traversing the Natchez Trace. There are truly little signs of modern life along the 444 miles. The things you do not see are quite significant, namely billboards, gas stations, litter, traffic lights and noise. Recreational vehicles are a popular way to see the parkway. The length restriction for RVs is 55 feet, including a tow vehicle, and the height restriction is 14 feet. There are a few dry camping pullouts along the Trace, which are all free on a first come/first serve basis.

Although we have spent many years roughing it, with age we have taken the liberty of becoming a little spoiled. Consequently, we used one of the numerous nearby "off-Trace" State, National and private campgrounds within a few miles of the Trace. This was the first part of a two-month odyssey that extended 10,248 miles and took us through 19 states. More to come...

Six million people drive, cycle or hike along this undulating parkway each year, making it the National Park Service's seventh most-visited site. They come partly for its picturesque and diverse landscape, which features bayous and swamps in the south, and forestland, rocky outcrops, and remnant prairies in the north, but they also come to learn its colorful history.

From here, there's options to join your region, local club or intra club Facebook groups (ask your local club if you're not sure where to find them online or if you're interested in helping as an administrator). These smaller groups allow more privacy for sharing travel plans and/

or private contact information that is visible to local club members only. Be sure to confirm the groups you belong to have been set to private before posting any personal or travelspecific information.

Amidst the plethora of Airstream-related content to be found on Facebook, I look forward to interacting with you all through our official ACI pages! If Facebook's not your thing: stay tuned as I'll be publishing future features of other social media platforms as well as regularly-scheduled emails to keep you informed!

Have you thought about Boondocking?

Now that we are thinking about camping adventures, have you ever thought about Boondocking? Boondocking is living the RV dream. Go where you want, do activities that you can't in a State or National park area. It's picking a spot in nature with NO hookups, setting up camp and enjoying the great outdoors. That also means you are using the power, water, and shelter that you bring with you. We tent camped for over 10 years before buying "MaryAnn" so the lessons we learned then work for boondocking.

How do you find boondocking locations? Technology has opened the door to find sites:

- Campendium has a website and an app for Apple phone users
- Bureau of Land Management website
- Try the Airstream forum site and ask people what their favorite Boondocking sites are in certain parts of the country.

Bureau of Land Management areas have no charge for camping. It's FREE - just find a place that you like, park, set up camp and enjoy. In these areas you are actually free to enjoy a lot more of the country than in a State or National park. You can bring your pet out onto a trail, fly a drone, or take your dirt bike out to enjoy the countryside. This brings up a big concern of mine. What does the road look like? As in the road quality. Can I get in and out of this place? Airstreams have a low ground clearance! Last year we had a lift kit added to MaryAnn. Even



in State parks the ground is not flat. I think it was year 1 or 2 we had a swale in front of our campsite. We had to borrow 2x6's to straddle the swale and even with that, we scraped dirt.

Boondocking is open country, so you need to be concerned with the road quality - they are not paved, the ground is not level, and they are remote sites. Word of advice - before going into an unknown area to set up camp, unhitch your trailer and explore the area first. You may go around that corner and find large rocks, ruts in the road making it impossible with a low clearance trailer or you can't get out with a trailer attached. These sites may not be level so bring extra leveling blocks. Remember, most of these sites are NOT designated campsites; they are areas where you just park!

Now remember you will need to bring water. Always make sure your fresh water tank is full, and your gray and black tanks are empty. Fresh water may NOT be available all the time. So, every drop of fresh water may count, so bring extra water. Fill jerry jugs that you can pour into your fresh water tank for the sink/toilet/ shower and collapsible (foldable) water bags that can be used for drinking water.

If you are on Bureau of Land Management land, you can extend the life of your gray water tank. You are able to dump your wash water on the ground, which is not allowed in State and National parks. So, a collapsible tub for washing dishes is very useful. You will want to dispose of the water 100+ ft from your RV or, if you have a neighbor, from them. You don't want

to attract unwanted neighbors! I recommend a biodegradable or earth-friendly soap. Some States do allow you to dump your gray water tank. But I would check State Bureau of Land Management rules before doing so. Another way to reduce dishwater consumption is to use paper plates and then burn them in your campfire. The use of a grill will also cutdown water to clean pots and pans. So, your meal menu/plan will impact water usage, i.e., sandwiches, cereal.

So now your black water tank is full. You need to find a dump station. Depending upon the time of year, the local campgrounds could be closed. We have a 22 ft Sport and I find we can go 4-5 days before we need to find a dump station. But if you take lots of showers, that number will be less. We reduce our water consumption by using wash cloths, baby wipes, Navy showers and dry shampoo between showers.

Enough on water. The other concern is power. You need power for your water pump, furnace

fan, lights and all the other gadgets you brought along. Lead acid batteries do not last very long. So, we invested in a generator to provide a source of supplemental power and to recharge the batteries. But you need fuel for them - gas/ propane and some even run on diesel. They all make noise. Some generators are definitely quieter than others. We are looking for peace and quiet when boondocking. That is why we are off the grid. You can't run a generator 24/7, so pick certain hours of the day when you run the generator to charge your batteries. Most campgrounds allow generators to run 9-10 am or 5-6 pm. So, we follow that rule when on the road. Another option is solar panels. We have a 200W portable solar panel. For us on a sunny day, it easily recharges our batteries, but for the cloudy days or a shady campsite, having a generator does the trick for us.

Another thing to think about is the weather. Is it going to be cold, sunny, rainy, cloudy, windy? Make sure you have the proper clothing for these weather conditions. You could be in a higher elevation than when you started. So clothing is key to being comfortable. A fleece jacket, wind breaker and warm socks can make it comfortable when outside. We found fleece blankets and wool socks for the bed will reduce your need for the furnace to come on. We try to use the furnace only when it's going to be at or near freezing temps.

One thing to remember - these areas are not very friendly for internet or cell service. You could be 3 or more miles off the main road and who knows how far from a town. So, if you working remotely, you may have to give up being really remote vs getting cell service. Also, if you

have an issue out there, i.e., mechanical/health, it could play a role in getting help.

Finally, let's talk about trash. I'm seeing more and more campsites where trash is being left behind. No one wants to camp in a trash pit. I can understand a small amount of trash that can get away from you and it blows around. Try to leave a camp area in better shape than when you first got there. We're out there to enjoy nature. Leave only footprints!

Pop up Power Socket - Product Review

After reaching down under the dinette table to plug laptops, chargers, and lamps into the one duplex outlet underneath, I began to wonder if there wasn't a better way. Searching Amazon, I found a product that brings 3 outlets and 2 USB ports above the table in a neat and subtle way. It's the "Automatic Raising Pop up Power Socket", available in silver or black finish. All

that's required to install it, is a 4" hole saw and the courage to put a big hole in your tabletop. Before I located the hole, I folded the leg up, to make sure that it would not hit the socket housing. I drilled the hole centered in the width of the table and cleaned up the sawdust with a hand vacuum. The threaded area is generous for a variety of thicknesses, and the retaining

ring unscrews easily. I dropped the unit in, and tightened the ring, and I was done! The sockets slowly rise with a push on the top and retract the same way. It doesn't extend down far enough to prevent the table from being lowered to bed position. The Amazon product code is: B01N5249UY

Field Day 2021 with Club 21!

Amateur Radio Operators in the Carolinas Airstream Club operated the Amateur Radio Relay League (ARRL) annual Field Day at Bear Den Family Campground, nestled in the Pisgah National Forest adjoining the Blue Ridge Parkway near Spruce Pine, NC on June 24-25. Members commented that made Wally proud getting to this very remote mountain campground! We used our club's call sign, WB4CAC and made 133 contacts comprised of voice (SSB) and digital modes (FT8). We had 3 dipole antennas in the trees, one Buddipole™ portable dipole antenna system, and one Tarheel screwdriver vertical on top of an Airstream. All ham radios are 12v and were operated on battery power for this event to simulate an emergency situation. The scenario we made up was that a tornado had leveled all the nearby cell towers, taken out shore power, and the only method of communication was our radios. When all else fails, ham radio!

This was a great opportunity for our club hams (we have 24 in this club) to practice our emergency response capabilities.

ARRL Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, thousands of radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or with

Airstream in the 1930s - Part 4: Hanging On (1939-41)

For the ongoing celebration of **Airstream's 90th Anniversary**, we continue our review of
Airstream in the 1930s following the turmoil of
1937 and 1938

Beginning in January 1939, the Airlite was revised to offer a front dinette. A January 22, 1939 L.A. Times ad introduced the first new model in well over a year, the 13 ft. Air Bubble, claimed to be made of "Weldwood waterproof plywood". The Air Bubble was short lived, last being mentioned in an April 23, 1941 ad. No photos of this model are currently known, but it is assumed to have been a slightly larger version of the "canned ham" shaped Airlite. Overall, Airstream ads continued to emphasize the Airlite as "California's most popular single model".

By mid-1939, the travel trailer market was again weakening and while Airstream ads still promoted the **Airlite**, they started to mention "house trailers" more frequently. One such occurrence was the July 30, 1939 L.A. Times ad which read, in part: "AIRSTREAM ANNOUNCES A NEW APARTMENT MODEL TRAILER Built to Live in for those in trailer camps and on construction jobs." An October 1, 1939 L.A. Times ad announced another larger new model when it read, in part: "AN ENTIRELY NEW KIND OF TRAILER... A new, beautiful, practical exterior shape, an entirely new interior arrangement, a

new low cost method of building uses strong, long life materials, but cuts labor costs in half.

16 ft. long, 7 ft. wide...\$595". This may have been when the roofline of Airstream's wood and Masonite models was revised to overhang the front and rear ends slightly.

Airstream ads in the L.A. Times became more and more infrequent in 1940. A March 24, 1940 L.A. Times ad shows that Airstream would try about anything to keep the plant running when it read, in part: "EASTER COLORS at no extra cost. Our new daring, dashing, debonair globe trotter sleeps four...14 ft. ...\$525... AIRSTREAM". Although this 14 ft. model was initially unnamed, by mid-1940 Airstream was calling it an **Airlite**, as evidenced by a June 30, 1940 ad that mentioned a 13½ ft. Airlite and a September 8, 1940 ad that mentioned a 14 ft. Airlite. This larger Airlite adopted the "English" shape then used on all other wood and Masonite Airstreams, though the 12 ft. "canned ham" Airlite remained in production alongside the 14 ft. "English" Airlite for some time.

Airstream's last currently known pre-WWII magazine ads ran in **Desert** magazine from November 1940 thru April 1941. The November and December 1940 ads show the 12 ft. "canned ham" **Airlite**, but the 1941 ads show the 14 ft. "English" **Airlite**.

Some of Wally Byam's personal record books, recently donated to Airstream by the Estate of Helen Byam Schwamborn, shed new light on Airstream operations during its final months before WWII and show the struggle it was for Wally Byam to keep Airstream afloat as WWII approached.

These record books logged the financing of Airstream trailers from about July 1940 thru March 1941, reflecting the majority of serial numbered Airstreams built during this time period, but likely missing a few "cash sales". The sale and financing of repossessed trailers as well as several "trade ins", including both used Airstreams and other brands, were also recorded.

During these nine months, Airstream appears to have produced approximately 60 trailers, with about half being 12 ft. and 14 ft. Airlites, a quarter 16 ft. Silver Clouds and Wonder Clouds, and the final quarter all the larger models ranging from 18 ft. to 27 ft. The highest recorded serial number 3311, an Airlite, was Airstream's last recorded retail sale on March 22, 1941. While we cannot be sure this Airlite was the last "retail" Airstream built and sold before WWII, it was likely pretty close to the end.

During this time, at least a dozen Airstreams were repossessed and resold, representing a surprisingly high 20% default rate. Many of these repossessions occurred within a couple of months of initial sale, possibly because Wally Byam was effectively a co-signer on all Airstream trailer loans and was responsible to make the scheduled payments if the customers did not. In September 1940, a couple of these repossessed Airstreams were sold at discounted prices to MACY MOTORS, a seller of "NEW & USED Repossessed Trailers".

Another interesting detail found in the record books is that during these months, Airstream paid sales commissions to at least three different salesmen. Arnold E. Rockrohr and Fred Sword handled Airstream sales in San Diego, CA, while Ted Smith and Wally Byam handled sales in Los Angeles, CA. Credit applications were processed by a "Miss Lye" whose first name may have been Lucille.

As 1940 wore on, things were getting desperate. On October 12 and 13, 1940, Wally Byam ran this ad in the L.A. Times seeking a loan to keep his business afloat and listing his home phone number: "MANUF. Estab. 8 years. Can pay 20% on \$1000 to \$10,000 (payable monthly) to finance orders. Money quickly returnable if desired. GL-7459."

Though they still reflected a small part of production, Airstream continued to occasionally mention "house trailers" in its ads as evidenced by the November 10, 1940 L.A. Times ad which read, in part: "BIG BIG Trailers to live in. 23 FT. 2 RMS 7'4" WIDE \$995".

Clipper when it continued: "...27 ft. 3 rms. Super de luxe \$2250 AND WORTH IT...".

Though the model was unnamed, it is unlikely that a wood and Masonite Airstream could have cost this much in 1940. Comparing this ad to Wally Byam's record books, it appears this ad was for a repossessed rather than new trailer.

This ad also seemed to reference a large

Airstream's last real hurrah before WWII came in early 1941. A February 2, 1941 L.A. Times ad, read in part: "CLIPPER SHIP... built exactly like an all-metal plane, streamlined of duraluminum, 27 ft. long, Birdseye maple interior, Frigidaire, central heating system, ship's flushing toilet, fireproof safe... Unquestionably the last word in practical luxury \$3250" As a



price comparison, this ad also mentioned the 14 ft. Airlite for \$495 and 21 ft. Mobile Home for \$995. A March 9, 1941 L.A. Times ad again mentioned the Clipper for \$3250, a 14 ft. Airlite for \$495 and a 16 ft. Silver Cloud for \$685.

It seems likely that the 1941 **Clipper** was a custom order that fell thru forcing Airstream to advertise it in the L.A. Times to look for a backup buyer because material bills for this Clipper were still being paid in February and March 1941 according to Wally's record books. The L.A. Times ads appeared too early to have

reflected a repossessed trailer. This 1941 **Clipper** is likely the last one built and is believed to still exist!

Airstream's last tiny L.A Times ad ran on March 11, 1941, closely aligning with the last sale recorded in Wally's record books just 11 days later on March 22, 1941.

But this was not quite the end for Airstream before WWII. An April 24, 1941 story in the L.A. Times mentioned that Airstream and three other Los Angeles based trailer manufacturers were contracted to build 547 housing trailers.

Los Angeles Concerns Construct 547 'Homes' for Defense Workers

Paradoxical as it may seem, an addition to the city of San Diego is being built in the city of Los Angeles, it was disclosed yesterday by the Farm Security Administration.

Five hundred and forty-seven houses, 8 by 20 feet, containing bedroom, kitchen and dinette, are being built by four Los Angeles concerns for a five-acre tract in San Diego.

The homes will be rolled down on wheels—they are trailers, built for families of men who are working on the huge defense projects there.

FIRST LOT READY

Twenty-five of the trailers are just about ready to be sent down and others are to follow in rapid succession. It is intended to have accommodations in trailers for 150 families by May 15 and for 350 more within 90 days.

They will be located on a tract for which a \$10,000 utility building is to be provided so that central facilities may be had for laundry, showers and so on. Dormitories are to be provided on the same tract for single men.

PICKED FAMILIES

Families for the trailer homes will be selected by F.S.A. officials, Regional Director L. L. Howes Jr. said.

He said the deal is part of a F.S.A. move to provide 2035 trailers for defense worker families in nine emergency housing areas in the United States.

Nearly \$530,000 is being spent among four Los Angeles trailer manufacturers for the San Diego project. They are Western Trailer Co., Airfloat Coach Manufacturing Co., Airstream Trailers and Masterbilt Coach Trailer Co.

each 20 ft. x 8 ft., for the FSA (Farm Security Administration) trailer camp near San Diego, CA, to house defense industry workers. It is unknown how many of the 547 trailers Airstream built, but photos taken in May 1941 confirm it had provided several such trailers.

Beginning on April 29, 1941, new L.A. Times ads from MACY MOTORS, listed a 14 ft. Airlite and 16 ft. Silver Cloud at reduced prices,

suggesting that either Airstream was then out of business, or had at least sold off some trailers at wholesale to buy materials to fulfill its part of the FSA order.

We don't know the exact date, but there is no doubt that sometime between April and July 1941 the Airstream factory at 1908 S. Magnolia permanently closed. Airstream assets were sold off in an August 7, 1941 auction for "WOODWORKING AND SHEET METAL MACHINERY formerly assets of W. M. Byam, bankrupt d.b.a. AIRSTREAM TRAILER CO."

Wally Byam had fought to the bitter end to keep Airstream afloat as a "travel trailer" brand. The FSA order may have confirmed to him that he did not want to build only "house trailers" to stay in business. After Airstream closed, Wally Byam found employment in the aviation industry during WWII.




See Ya Down the Road

DIY Coffee Filter Flowers



Supplies Needed: Coffee Filters (approximately 6 per flower) Food Colorina Bamboo Skewers Scissors Hot Glue



Instructions:

First, you will dye your coffee filters. Add a few drops of food coloring to a cup of water. Submerge coffee filter and soak for about 5 minutes. Remove filter and let dry.



Next, split the dried filters into 2 piles of 3 filters each.



Fold each of the 2 piles in half, then in half again creating 2 quarters. Then, cut a scalloped edge. Put both stacks together. Insert bamboo skewer into the middle of your flower.



Finally, add a few drops of hot glue at the tip of the flower and scrunch to make the petals. Do this for each layer, scrunching and fluffing the coffee filters as you go.



Right now, our biggest challenge is still within our supply chain, as many suppliers are missing deliveries of key components. I anticipate we will be dealing with these supply shortages in a meaningful way for at least another year. So, if you have an Airstream on order, please know we are working hard to build your order, but these delays are likely to be a problem for all of our models for the next year.

At the rally, I was reminded, as I am every time I attend, of the incredible service so many of the members provide others. The countless hours of planning and helping other rally-goers is nothing short of spectacular. I would like to personally thank Andy Selking for the great planning he did for the rally and the many volunteers, whom without, the rally would never happen. Airstream benefits from this incredible work and I just want to thank everyone who was involved. Your contributions make a great impact on the Airstream community!


