As part of our Airstream community, I am interested in hearing your stories. I bet that we have a lot of similar experiences. How did you get started camping or RV'ing? What are



some of your most memorable adventures? Where would you like to go if time was not an issue? What inspires you, in camping, traveling, and otherwise. Please share with us.

I'll start: My first memory of camping was an overnight with a church group. We went tent camping next to a small stream near Springfield MO. Being a bunch of boys, we had to jump into the stream and get everyone around us soaked, whether they wanted to be or not. Of course, we did the obligatory campfire. For me, the best part of the trip was laying in the tent that night and looking out of the door opening at all of the stars. I was in awe. (Side note, every time I hear the song *Some Other Time* by the Alan Parsons Project, I think of that night. I remember laying there, wondering if there was someone near one of those stars looking at their night sky and wondering if there was someone looking up and wondering if someone was thinking the same thing.)
