As my time as President of NORVA comes to a close, I am reflecting on the past year. But the best thing about the past year is the comradery fostered amongst the officers of NORVA and the membership. The willingness to step up and be an officer in NORVA and to provide the expertise and guidance in the positions held has made my job as president rewarding and a pleasure. Along with thanks to NORVA members, I would like to take this time to thank each and every officer for a great year.



As 1st Vice President, Laural Veloz developed a fun and active rally calendar for the year. In addition to the region and international events, she recruited several members to host rallies for the months there was not a planned event by a higher organization. As 2nd Vice President, Jackson and Mary Ann McBroom led the wonderful and informative "Ohio Presidents and Icons" caravan. Jackson was dogged in his determination to lead this caravan as it was originally scheduled for



June 2020, then September 2020, but due to the WUHAN virus restrictions it was put off until 2021. Even though some of the original plans had to be scratched he found other venues of interest and led the caravan in June 2021. As a side note NORVA gained two affiliate member households from participants on the caravan.

As Treasurer, Kevin Quinn has managed the financial records of the club and insured that we followed guidance from WBCCI and the IRS. His thorough, accurate monthly financial reports provided the club leadership with the knowledge and the confidence to handle any unbudgeted expenditures. As an example, after a new logo was approved by WBCCI, new flags with the new logo for all officer positions were purchased. Janeene Rider did a fantastic job as Secretary. Her attention to detail was apparent in the minutes of the Executive Board Meeting held in March. This meeting was to review and update the NORVA Constitution, Bylaws and Executive Board Policies. A copy of the minutes are a special edition to this newsletter.

Membership is the life blood of any organization. As Membership Director, Lew Brodsky was instrumental in welcoming new members to NORVA. As soon as NORVA was notified of a new member or affiliate member by WBCCI, Lew reached out to them by email and phone to welcome them to NORVA. He also provided information on NORVA and the Airstream Club to Airstream of Virginia. NORVA started out 2021 with 73 member households and now we are up to 85. Of the 12 new members, 8 are regular and 4 are affiliates. In addition to keeping up with the membership, Lew publishes the NORVA Directory each February and has photos, contact and demographic information on each member in addition to a history of NORVA and WBCCI.

Sue and Gary Shepard, our modern-day historians, have done an incredible job as Newsletter Editors for NORVA NEWS, our monthly newsletter. Besides my articles and rally reports, they reached out to spotlight members describing who they are, why they joined NORVA and any other anecdotal information they wished to share with NORVA members. This was an excellent way to get to know members that might not currently be able to attend rallies and events. Also, they had a section where members could list items they could not do without while camping. From this section you sometimes found an item that you didn't know you really needed.

Beth Jones, our Legislative Director, was instrumental in pulling together all the changes to NORVA's Constitution and By-laws voted on by the Executive Committee, along with new directives from WBCCI into our governance documents. Beth worked with WBCCI to make any corrections after their review. Our Constitution and By-laws have been approved and the next required review is 2026. Her guidance and expertise was helpful in insuring this requirement was handled expeditiously.

Ed Jones, our Parliamentarian, kept the NORVA officers in line during our executive board meeting insuring that we conformed to WBCCI guidelines and Roberts Rules of Order for meetings. This provided the proper structure so that club business could be handled properly.

Tom Carmichael, our Past President, was a wealth of information and a sounding board for me on ideas and direction that I had for the club. Working closely with him, he has become one of my best friends and he is always someone I can count on in any situation.

Patsy Nagel served as Webmaster and First Lady. As Webmaster she worked with rally leaders to post event information to our website in a timely manner so they would meet the deadline to appear in the Blue Beret. Using WBCCI guidelines, she researched procedures for handling signup and payment for rallies and provided detailed pros and cons of the different methodologies to the Executive Committee. Her attention to detail provided the facts needed to make the decision that we would continue to use the coupon and check methodology for rally signup until WBCCI has a more workable solution. As First Lady her analytical skills were



an asset to me and she was a tremendous help in editing my monthly columns. She was able to take my military trip reports and turn them into readable stories. I am forever grateful for her.

We have a new slate of officers for the club starting in October for 2021-2022. It was a unanimous vote by the membership. Some are new and some are continuing in their current roles. The new officers are:

Minutes of Executive Board Meeting Conducted March 27, 2021 At Cozy Acres Campground Clubhouse, Powhattan, Virginia

Opening Ceremonies

Gerry Nagel, President, called the Executive Board Meeting of the NORVA Airstream Club #3-110 to order at 1:38 P.M. on March 27, 2021 at Cozy Acres Campground Clubhouse, Powhattan, Virginia.

The Invocation was given by Gerry Nagel.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Gerry Nagel.

Roll Call

Janeene Rider, Secretary, conducted an Executive Board roll call. The Executive Board members are shown below with an asterisk (*) next to the names of those Board members present at the meeting.

Based on the response to the roll call, Janeene Rider advised Gerry Nagel that a quorum of the Executive Board was present to enable conduct of the board meeting.

Other NORVA club member(s) in attendance included Dick & Jane Arnold, Scott Arnold, Jim Rider and Eric & Norma Colby.

Reading and Approval of Minutes

Gerry Nagel indicated no prior Minutes were applicable for review/approval because an Executive Board Meeting was not conducted in 2020 due to the presence of the COVID-19 virus.

Reports of Officers and Committees

1. Budget: Kevin Quinn, Treasurer, reported a current bank balance of \$4,266; \$1,335 received this fiscal year; expenses of \$836; and a working budget of \$1,356. Kevin further reported that the only dues received directly were from Affiliate Members; all other dues were paid through the Wally Byam



Caravan Club International (WBCCI) with only a slight time lag from WBCCI to the NORVA Airstream Club.

- 2. Caravan: Scott Arnold, co-leader of the Tennestreamin'21 Caravan reported this caravan is being cancelled to COVID-19 restrictions at some of the planned venues. Gerry Nagel indicated that a go/no-go decision will be made in April 2021 for the Ohio Presidents & Icons Caravan led by Jackson McBroom, 2nd Vice President, because of various venues being affected by the pandemic. Jackson McBroom's report to Gerry Nagel is included as an attachment.
- 3. Constitution, Bylaws and Legislature: Gerry Nagel noted that these areas will be covered later in the meeting under New Business.
- 4. Historical: Sue Shepard, Newsletter Co-Editor, reported that newsletters published from 1964 through last year were being scanned to CD-ROM; electronic newsletters issued this term would be transferred to CD-ROM at year end.
- 5. Membership: Lew Brodsky, Membership Director, distributed three (3) handouts (copies attached) to inform the Board of i) the composition of the unit's membership as of March 20, 2021, ii) an accounting of the 2021 member renewals as of January 22, 2021 and iii) new members joining after January 1, 2021. A discussion ensued about whether to continue hard-copy publication of the NORVA membership directory since this is the costliest item in the budget; it was agreed to defer a decision in this regard. Lew asked the Board to consider whether it wanted to continue making separate badges for NORVA members since Member badges are currently being issued directly by WBCCI. After discussing the pros and cons of having both international and local club badges, it was agreed further discussion and review of alternatives was needed before a decision could be reached.
- 6. Rally: Gerry Nagel reported that Laural Veloz, 1st Vice President, forwarded an updated rally calendar to him for inclusion with the Board Meeting Minutes (copy attached) which was the same as the rally calendar published in the latest newsletter except for the deleted caravan to Tennessee.
- 7. Webmaster Report: Patsy Nagel, Webmaster, reported all club newsletters between 2018 to present have been uploaded to the NORVA website; older newsletters are stored on Patsy's computer. Patsy discussed the new Webmaster position and how it is evolving with the aid of advice and "best practices" coming from the WBCCI Information Technology Committee (ITC). The new WBCCI website is a work in progress. There has been delays in migration of legacy sites to the new site. Canceled rallies due to COVID-19 has prevented meeting with ITC representatives for face-to-face interactions and discussions. These discussions are needed for a good understanding of the status and the way forward.

New Business

Gerry Nagel directed the Board's attention to "Rationale for changes to NORVA's Constitution, Bylaws and Executive Board Policies" emailed to the Board earlier in the week (copy attached).



 Changes to NORVA's Constitution: Gerry Nagel summarized the proposed changes to the Constitution distributed to the Board earlier in the week via email (copy attached). He explained that these changes were designed to align the Constitution with the club's current operating practices, specifically, remove three (3) Directors as elected officers and replace them with the Webmaster, Legislative Director, Membership Director and Parliamentarian.

A motion was made by Lew Brodsky and seconded by Ed Jones followed by a unanimous vote of the Executive Board to approve the proposed changes to the Constitution as presented.

2. Changes to NORVA's Bylaws: Gerry Nagel summarized the proposed Bylaws changes distributed to the Board earlier in the week via email (copy attached). He explained that like the proposed changes to the Constitution, these changes were designed to align the Bylaws with the club's current operating practices including i) deletion of Storekeeper and Supplies Committee, ii) addition of Webmaster as a standing Committee and iii) replacement of three (3) appointed Directors with delineation of duties for the Legislative Director, Membership Director, Webmaster and Parliamentarian.

A motion was made by Lew Brodsky and seconded by Ed Jones followed by a unanimous vote of the Executive Board to approve the proposed changes to the Bylaws as presented.

It was noted that the above satisfies the requirement for review of the Bylaws and the Constitution at least once every five (5) years; once approved by NORVA, the changes need to go to WBCCI for approval.

3. Changes to NORVA's Executive Board Policies: Gerry Nagel summarized the proposed changes to the Executive Board Policies distributed to the Board earlier in the week via email (copy attached). Changes include i) distribution of the Constitution, Bylaws and Executive Board Policies via link to the Club's website instead of providing copies; ii) clarification of standard rates for advertising in NORVA Newsletter and inclusion of a provision for negotiation of other rates, iii) increase in the maximum reimbursement for preliminary caravan scouting costs from \$25 to \$50 and iv) extension of the date from November 15 to December 31 for members' annual dues payment to be eligible for inclusion in the WBCCI Directory.

A motion was made by Tom Carmichael and seconded by Kevin Quinn followed by a unanimous vote of the Executive Board to approve the proposed changes to the Executive Board Policies as presented. It was noted that WBCCI approval of these policy changes is not required.

- 4. Rally, Caravan and Event Registration: Patsy Nagel, Webmaster, distributed a handout (copy attached) to provide background and present options to facilitate registration at NORVA's rallies, caravans and other events. The three (3) options presented include use of i) the current coupon system, ii) JotForm integration excluding payment processing and iii) JotForm integration including payment processing electronically. The particulars of the second and third options were presented after which the Board discussed the pros and cons of each. The Board concluded that it was best to continue use of the current coupon system until further guidance and "best practices" are clear from WBCCI.
- 5. Club Flag: Sue Shepard presented a single-sided, 3 foot by 5 foot color mock-up of the proposed NORVA flag to display the Club's new logo and noted the next larger size is 4 foot by 6 foot. The Club's new flag will be the same size as NORVA's current Club flag. The cost is \$100 for a two-sided flag and \$60 for a single-sided flag.
- 6. Airstream International Rally Delegation: Gerry Nagel announced he would serve as NORVA's delegate to the 2021 International Rally at Lebanon, TN, and he is seeking someone to serve as NORVA's alternate delegate.

Announcements

Commonwealth Rally: Gerry Nagel announced that NORVA has agreed to be responsible for the Saturday breakfast at the Virginia Commonwealth Rally in September. Sue Shepard volunteered to spearhead the breakfast provision.

Adjournment

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 3:19 P.M. by Tom Carmichael, as seconded by Lew Brodsky. Without exception, the meeting was adjourned by Gerry Nagel.

RALLY REPORTS

2021 NORVA Caravan

(Editor's note: This is Part Two of a series of three articles on the 2021 NORVA Caravan conducted in June 2021.)

NORVA's Ohio Caravan moves north- Part Two – Touring Central Ohio.

The history-themed "Ohio Presidents and Historic Icons" caravan" began in southwest Ohio on July 3rd with an amazing five days devoted to seeing the sights in and around Cincinnati and Dayton. By June 9th it was time to continue the adventure by shifting the caravan's focus northward.



the next caravan stop: Cross Creek Camping Resort in Delaware, Ohio, a town about 20 miles north of the state capital of Columbus. Customarily, a "travel day" is used only to move to a new campground and does not include any organized touring.

Leaders Jackson & Mary Ann McBroom had booked ten sites at

Happy Hour on a hot day.

But because the drive from Cincinnati to Columbus was short, the Airstreamers were instructed to head for the new campground, set up for the five-night stay, and be ready to see something unique that same afternoon!

Upon arrival at Cross Creek what everyone saw first were ugly bugs. Every campsite came equipped with full hookups and hundreds of large, loud, buzzing, crawling, bugs; a heavy infestation of 17-year cicadas. They were everywhere; landing on heads, crawling up legs, and a few even making their way down shirts! The insects remained annoying camping companions for the next five days, but they did not dampen anyone's enthusiasm.

The cicada swarm was certainly not the "unique" thing Jackson had planned. Soon, he led the group on a short drive from the campground to an industrial area. Located in one large room of a nondescript building is "The American Whistle Corporation."

This little business is iconic because it is the only company in the United States still making metal whistles...yes, the kind you put between

your lips and BLOW! For the next hour and a half, the Airstreamers saw how the company produces tens of thousands of these loud, trilling, noisemakers for use by police, sports referees, and others with a need to be heard. Also, each caravanner got to make and keep a plastic whistle and choose a metal one to take home.

Show with Johnny Carson," "The Late Show," "Late Late Show," "Larry King Live," "The Ellen DeGeneres Show," and "Maury." He also hosted his own weekly TV programs, including "Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures," "Into the Wild," and "Wild Countdown." He admirably earned the distinction of being one of the most notable animal experts and wildlife conservationists in the U.S.

A not-to-be-missed Ohio icon is the Columbus Zoo, and the group spent the following day enjoying it. This zoo became world famous, chiefly because of its amiable director and celebrity zookeeper, Jack Hanna. From 1978 until his retirement due to illness in 2020, Hanna transformed the zoo from okay to great. He shared his animal expertise with millions on television by appearing with exotic Zoo creatures on "Good Morning America," "The Tonight





Every Columbus Zoo habitat was wonderful, but Airstreamers found one exhibit of special interest. Close to the entry gate is a tropical habitat with a large flock of flamingos. The tall, majestic, bright orange birds are often associated with Airstreams, probably for kitschy-retro-nostalgic-1950s reasons. Perhaps that's why plastic replicas of flamingos are often seen next to trailers at WBAC rallies. At the zoo, it was refreshing to see the real thing!

The gorillas and bonobos also attracted lots of attention. Bonobos are apes that resemble chimpanzees, but bonobos have longer legs, narrower shoulders, and smaller heads. The Columbus Zoo is one of only eight facilities in North America to house bonobos.

term: 1921-1923). Harding died of a heart attack less than two years into his presidency. He was succeeded by his vice president, Calvin Coolidge.





The house was built in 1911 for Sidna Allen, brother of Floyd Allen; however, he was arrested soon thereafter for complicity in the courthouse shooting of which his brother was accused, and never again lived there.



1901, when Sidna Allen was 35 years old he married Bettie Mitchell. After Sidna and Bettie married, they decided to build a house. According to the book The Courthouse Tragedy, the whole house was Touring the "under construction" Allen House. made of the best wood around, and there were eight rooms in the house. In the

book it says, "The floors were of oak, except the floor of our living room, which was white maple." The walls in the house were all plastered. It also says, "In the dining room we used quarter-sawed oak, finished in natural color wainscoting." The roof of the house was made of slate, which back then, all this wood and other materials were very expensive. They had a windmill at the house, and an acetylene generator which is what provided them the lights. The house back in 1911 was worth \$13,000.00. But a year later the Hillsville courthouse massacre occurred. Sidna and his wife had only lived there a year. Wikipedia.

Camping Breakfast Burritos (To be served on Saturday morning at the Commonwealth Rally)

Ingredients

- 1/2 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 cup frozen hash browns
- 8 oz cooked ham, diced
- 12 eggs
- 1 tablespoon Old El Paso Seasoning Mix
- 1 (4.5 oz) can Old El Paso Green Chilis
- 2 cups (8 oz) shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped cilantro
- 8 (12-inch) Old El Paso flour tortillas



Instructions

- Heat the olive oil in a large skillet. Add the hash browns and cook for 1 minute, stirring continuously. Add in the ham. Continue to cook, stirring occasionally, until the hash browns and ham have both browned, about 8-10 minutes.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, lightly whisk the eggs. Whisk in the taco seasoning. When the hash browns and ham have browned, pour the eggs into the skillet. Cook, stirring frequently, until the eggs have set. Stir in the green chiles, cheese and cilantro.
- 3. Warm the tortillas. Put 1/8 of the egg mixture down the center of each tortilla. Roll up like a burrito and wrap tightly in foil. Store in a zip top bag and FREEZE.
- 4. We will cook them on an open fire at the rally. When ready to cook, place wrapped burritos in hot coals next to fire. Let the burritos sit in the coals, turning once, until heated through, about 10-15 minutes. (The time will depend on how hot your fire is.)


